Are we *Making* <u>Disciples</u>? (Mathew 28:18-20)? Are we *Maturing* in **Messiah-likeness?** (Eph. 4:11-13) Are we *Manifesting* **Faith**, **Hope**, and **Love**?

A. The *Measure* of a Maturing Congregation

But to each was given according to the measure of Messiah's gift ...

And **He (Messiah)** gave some *as* **apostles**, and some *as* **prophets**, and some *as* **evangelists**, and some *as* **pastors** and **teachers**, for the **equipping** of the **saints** for the **work of service**, to the **building up** of the **body of Messiah**;

until we all attain to the **unity** of the **faith**, and of the **knowledge** of the **Son of God**, to a **mature man**, to the **measure** of the **stature** which belongs to the **fullness of Messiah**. (Ephesians 4:7, 11-13)

"And now these **three** remain: **faith**, **hope** and **love**.

But the **greatest** of these is **love**."

(I Corinthians 13:13)

B. The *Meaning* of "Faith, Hope, and Love"

<u>Faith</u> → Greek — "pistis" → firm persuasion or trust, a conviction based on hearing, used in the NT always of "faith in God or Messiah, or things spiritual"

Hebrew (O.T.)—"aman" → to be certain, to <u>trust</u> or believe . "emunah" → faithfulness, stability

<u>Hope</u> \rightarrow *Greek* (N. T.)—"elpis" \rightarrow favorable and confident expectation," the happy anticipation of good

Hebrew (O.T.)— "tikvah" → hope, <u>expectation</u>, "mibtach" → <u>confidence</u>

<u>Love</u> → *Greek* (N.T.)—"agape" → <u>active care</u>, <u>affection</u>, and <u>concern</u> for others, <u>unselfish concern</u> that freely accepts another in <u>loyalty</u> and <u>seeks his good</u>

Hebrew (O.T.)—"ahav" → to have a srong emotional attachment to — "chesed" → <u>lovingkindness</u>—a steadfast, loyal love, characterized by grace, mercy, faithfulness, goodness

C. The *Manifestation* (and **commending**) of <u>Faith</u>, <u>Hope</u>, and <u>Love</u> among the <u>Congregations</u>

→ To the Congregation at Ephesus

For this reason I too, having **heard** of the **faith** in the **Lord Jesus** which *exists* among you and your **love** for all the **saints**, do not cease **giving thanks** for you, while making mention *of you* in **my prayers**;...

I pray that the eyes of your **heart** may be **enlightened**, so that you will know what is the **hope** of **His calling**... (Ephesians 1:15-16, 18a)

→ To the **Congregation** at **Colossae**

We give thanks to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus the Messiah, praying always for you, since we heard of your <u>faith</u> in Messiah Jesus and the <u>love</u> which you for all the saints; because of the <u>hope</u> laid up for you in heaven, of which you previously heard in the word of *truth*, the gospel... (Colossians 1:3-5)

→ To the **Congregation** at **Thessalonica**

We give **thanks to God** always for all of you, making mention *of you* in our **prayers**; constantly bearing in mind your **work of faith** and **labor of love** and **steadfastness of hope** in our **Lord Jesus the Messiah** in the presence of **God the Father**,... (I Thessalonians 1:2-3)

We ought always to give **thanks to God** for you, brethren, as it is *only* fitting, because **your** <u>faith</u> is greatly enlarged, and **the** <u>love</u> of each one of you toward **one another** grows ever **greater**; therefore, we ourselves speak **proudly of you** among the **churches of God** for your *perseverance* and <u>faith</u> in the midst of all your **persecutions** and **afflictions** which you endure.

(II Thessalonians 1:3-4)

→ Peter's Letter to Believers

For **He (Messiah)** was **foreknown** before the **foundation** of the **world**, but has **appeared** in these *last times* for the sake of **you** who **through Him** are **believers in God**, who **raised Him** from the **dead** and **gave Him glory**, so that your **faith** and **hope** are **in God**.

Since you have in <u>obedience</u> to the **truth purified** your **souls** for a sincere <u>love</u> of the brethren, fervently <u>love one another</u> from the heart,

(I Peter 1:20-22)

→ The **Letter** to the **Hebrews**

...and since we have a great priest (Jesus) over the house of God, let us draw near with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith,...

Let us **hold fast** the **confession** of our <u>hope</u> without **wavering**, for **He** who *promised* is **faithful**; and let us consider how to **stimulate one another** to <u>love</u> and **good deeds**, (Hebrews 10:21-22a, 32-24)

Summary Observations

1. When the **Messiah ascended** and the ministry of the **church** (ekklesia) began, the **scriptures** declared that **He gave "gifts,"** and **spiritually gifted men** among the **believers**. These **gifts** were **given** to help *establish*, *equip*, and *grow* the **body of believers** towards **maturity** as **disciples** (Eph. 4: 7-16).

While we acknowledge the importance of **spiritual "gifts"** and **talents** given for the **establishment** and *initial* **growth** of the **church**, we believe that the *true* **measure** of **growth** and **maturity** comes from the **producing** of <u>faith</u>, <u>hope</u>, and <u>love</u> among its **members**. The congregation at **Corinth** was **rich** with **gifted people**, but were considered **immature**, **carnal**, and **worldly** in their **spiritual walk** (I Corinthians 3:1-3, 13:1-13).

2. As we look at, and study the **growth** and **development** of the *early* churches,

they were <u>commended</u> for their testimony of <u>faith</u>, <u>hope</u>, and <u>love</u> among them, as well as *exhorted* to **continue** to **grow** in these areas.(see above scripture texts)

3. Even though they are *spiritual* characteristics, <u>faith</u>, <u>hope</u> and <u>love</u> can be *visibly* <u>seen</u>, and are <u>measurable</u>. Rabbi Paul wrote the following praise, for what he both saw and heard regarding the Thessalonian believers:

"We give **thanks to God** always for all of **you**,...
constantly bearing in mind your
work of faith and <u>labor</u> of love and
steadfastness of hope

in our **Lord Jesus the Messiah** in the presence of **God the Father**,..." (I Thessalonians 1:2-3)

From this text we see that:

Faith is *measurable* through <u>works</u>
Love can be *measurable* through <u>labors</u>
Hope can be *demonstrated* through steadfastness
