As we looked at our **Model** for **ministry**,

the **Jerusalem Congregation** (Acts 2:41-47), we noted that they began to be **committed** to a number of **ministry** *functions*:

 <u>Evangelism</u> (Peter's proclamation of the Gospel) (Acts 2:14-36),
Devoting themselves to the study of <u>God's word</u> (the apostles' teaching)
<u>Fellowship</u>, the <u>Breaking of bread</u>, <u>Prayer</u>, (Acts 2:42)
<u>Sharing</u> and meeting the needs of one another, (Acts 2:44-45)
<u>Praising God</u> (worship) together, (Acts 2:47a)
Growing <u>numerically</u> according to the will of God (Acts 2:47b)

These *functions* took "forms" and "structures" within the congregation, as spiritually "gifted" men and women began to <u>minister</u> and "equip" believers for the work of service. As the new believers participated in these ministries, and "experienced" spiritual growth, they were to aim for these key ministry goals:

→ To mature as individuals, and as a "body" of believers into <u>Messiah-likeness</u> (Ephesians 4:11-13, 15-16) → To grow in their <u>faith</u>, their <u>hope</u>, and their <u>love</u> the *measure* of <u>maturity</u> (Colossians 1:3-5) (I Thessalonians 1:2-3)

According to the **scriptures**, what **produces** *faith*, *hope*, and *love* among **believers**, are "**structures**" that provide <u>three</u> **vital** *experiences* \rightarrow

→ Vital Learning *experiences* with the <u>Word of God</u>

→ Vital **Relational** *experiences* with **One another** and **with God**

→ Vital Witnessing *experiences* with <u>non-believers</u>

Before we do an **expanded study** on these **three vital experiences**, we want to **strongly affirm** that the <u>source</u> of **all spiritual growth** and **maturity** among **believers** is <u>God</u>, who *sovereignly* **works** within us through <u>His Spirit</u>, and through these *experiences*.

> ...for it is **God** who is <u>at work</u> *in you*, both to **will** and to **work** for *His* good pleasure. (Philippians 2:13)

For we are <u>His workmanship</u>, created in Messiah Jesus for good works, which God prepared *beforehand* so that we would walk in them. (Ephesians 2:10)

I planted, Apollos watered, but God was <u>causing the growth</u>. So then **neither** the one who **plants** nor the one who **waters** is anything, but God who <u>causes the growth</u>. (I Corinthians 3:6-7)

As **Believers**, we need **Three Vital** *Experiences* for **Spiritual** <u>**Growth**</u> and <u>**Maturity**</u>

1) Vital Learning experiences with the word of God

"They (the **disciples**) were continually **devoting** themselves to the <u>apostles' teaching</u>..." (Acts 2:42a)

All <u>Scripture</u> is *inspired by God* and profitable for *teaching*, for *reproof*, for *correction*, for <u>training</u> in *righteousness*; so that the **man of God** may be **adequate**, <u>equipped</u> for every good work. (II Timothy 3:16-17)

For this reason we also constantly **thank God** that when you received the <u>word of God</u> which you heard from us, you **accepted it** <u>not</u> as the word of men, but *for* what it really is, the <u>word of God</u>, which also <u>performs its work</u> in you who believe. (I Thessalonians 2:13)

So then <u>faith</u> comes by **hearing**, and hearing by the <u>word</u> of Messiah. (Romans 10:17)

For whatsoever was **written** in earlier times was **written** for **our instruction**, so that through **perseverance** and the **encouragement** of the **scriptures** we might have **hope**. (Romans 15:14)

Now as to the <u>love</u> of the **brethren**, you have no need for *anyone* to write you, for you yourselves are <u>taught by God</u> to <u>love</u> one another; (I Thessalonians 4:9)

2) Vital **Relational** *experiences* with <u>One another</u> and with <u>God</u>

"They (the **believers**) were continually <u>devoting</u> themselves to...<u>fellowship</u>, to the *breaking of bread* and to *prayer*... And all those who **believed** were <u>together</u>... breaking bread from **house** to **house**, they were taking their meals <u>together</u>..." (Acts 2:42, 44, 46)

For I (**Paul**) long to **see you** (**Roman** believers) so that I may impart some **spiritual gift** to **you**, that you may be **established**; that is, that I may be **encouraged** <u>together</u> <u>with you</u> while **among you**, each of us by the **other's** <u>faith</u>, both **yours** and **mine.** (Romans 1:1:9-10a, 11-12)

For what **thanks** can we render to **God** for you... as we night and day keep **praying** most earnestly that we may <u>see your face</u>, and may **complete** what is **lacking** in your <u>faith</u>? (I Thessalonians 3:9a, 10)

Be devoted to <u>one another</u> in brotherly <u>love</u>; give preference to <u>one another</u> in honor;.. rejoicing in <u>hope</u>, persevering in tribulation, devoted to prayer, contributing to the needs of the saints, practicing hospitality. (Romans 12:10-13a)

Let us **hold fast** the **confession** of our <u>hope</u> without wavering,... and let us consider how to **stimulate** <u>one another</u> to <u>love</u> and **good deeds**, <u>not</u> forsaking our own <u>assembling together</u>,...but encouraging <u>one another</u>, and all the **more** as you see **the day** drawing near. (Hebrews 10:23-25)

3) Vital Witnessing experiences with non-believers

"...and you shall be My <u>witnesses</u> both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the *remotest part* of the earth."

> "And all those who had **believed** were <u>together</u>... And **the Lord** was **adding** to their **number** day by day those who were <u>being saved</u>..." (Acts 1:8, 2:44a, 47b,)

Now all *these* things are from **God**, who **reconciled us**... and gave **us** the <u>ministry or reconciliation</u>,... Therefore we are **ambassadors for Christ**, as though **God** were making an appeal **through us**; we beg you on behalf of **Messiah**, <u>be reconciled to God</u>. (II Corinthians 5:18, 20)

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...for "WHOEVER WILL CALL ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED." How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a <u>preacher</u>?

How will they <u>preach</u> unless they are <u>sent</u>...? So <u>faith</u> comes by <u>hearing</u> and <u>hearing</u> by the <u>word of Messiah</u>. (Romans 10:14, 17)

...but sanctify Messiah as Lord in your hearts, always *being* ready to make a <u>defense</u> to everyone who asks you to give an account for the <u>hope</u> that is in you,.. (I Peter 3:15)
