Chanukah Exhortation Resisting the Antiochus "spirit" in our Times

Equipping Ourselves with God's "Spiritual" Armor

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His might.

Put on the **full <u>armor of God</u>**, so that you will be able to **stand firm** against the **schemes** of the **devil**.

For our struggle is <u>not</u> against **flesh and blood**, but against the **rulers**, against the **powers**, against the **world forces** of this **darkness**, against the **spiritual forces** of **wickedness** in the **heavenly places**.

Therefore, take up the **full armor of God**, so that you will be able to **resist** in the **evil day**, and having done everything, **to stand firm**.

Stand firm therefore,
HAVING GIRDED YOUR LOINS WITH TRUTH,

and HAVING PUT ON THE BREASTPLATE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS,

and having **shod YOUR FEET** WITH THE **PREPARATION**OF THE **GOSPEL OF PEACE**;

in addition to all, taking up the **shield** of <u>faith</u> with which you will be **able** to **extinguish** all the **flaming arrows** of the **evil one**.

And take THE **HELMET OF SALVATION**,

and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

With all **prayer and petition** <u>pray</u> at all times in the **Spirit**, and with this in view, be on the **alert** with all **perseverance** and **petition** for all the **saints**, (Ephesians 6:10-18)

Personal Application
Spiritual Armor "Checklist"

1. Have I "girded my loins with <u>truth</u>"? Is my life characterized by <u>truthfulness</u> and <u>sincerity</u> so as not to "hinder" my walk and witness to the world. Do I reflect the <u>truth</u> of God in my life and teaching, and make every effort to "protect myself" from accusations of dishonesty or deceit?

Do **not** let **kindness** and **truth** leave you; **Bind them** around your **neck**, **Write them** on the **tablet** of your **heart**.

So you will find **favor** and **good repute**In the sight of **God** and **man**. (Proverbs 3:3-4)

He stores up sound **wisdom** for the **upright**: He is a **shield** to those who walk in **integrity** (Proverbs 2:7)

2. Have I *put on* the "breastplate of <u>righteousness</u>"? Do I have a life and walk that is **characterized** by *integrity*, and doing what is <u>upright</u> and <u>just</u>? Do I walk according to the *truths* and *principles* of the word of God?

The <u>righteousness</u> of the <u>upright</u> will <u>deliver them</u>,
But the <u>treacherous</u> will be <u>caught</u> by *their own* <u>greed</u>. (Proverbs 13:6)

Every <u>word of God</u> is **tested**; **He** is a <u>shield</u> to those who **take** *refuge* in Him. (Proverbs 30:5)

The integrity of the upright will guide them,
But the crookedness of the treacherous will destroy them. (Proverbs 11:3)

3. Do I have my <u>feet</u> "shod" and prepared with the promises of the gospel? Do I stand sure-footed and <u>ready</u> for battle, confident and at "peace," <u>standing</u> upon the <u>promises</u> of the <u>gospel message</u>?

"The *steadfast* of mind You will keep in perfect <u>peace</u>, Because he <u>trusts</u> (stands) in You. (Isaiah 26:3)

... but sanctify Messiah as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a <u>defense</u> to everyone who asks you to give an account for the <u>hope</u> (gospel) that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence; (I Peter 3:15)

4. Am I *taking up* the "shield of <u>faith</u>"? When the flaming arrows of the adversary; the "arrows" of *doubt*, *distress*, *discouragement*, and *disappointment* are fired at me, do I confront them with <u>faith in God</u> to help me overcome them?

I will say to **the LORD**, "**My refuge** and my **fortress**, **My God**, in whom <u>I will trust!</u>"...

His faithfulness is a shield and bulwark. (Psalm 91:2, 4c)

Be of **sober** *spirit*, be on the **alert**. **Your** *adversary*, the **devil**, prowls around like a **roaring lion**, seeking someone to **devour**.

But *resist* him, <u>firm</u> in *your* <u>faith</u>, knowing that the **same experiences** of **suffering** are being accomplished by your **brethren** who are in the world. (I Peter 5:8-9)

5. Am I wearing the "helmet of salvation"? It is vital for a soldier to have his head protected from potential harm, and so it was needful to wear a helmet. As we engage in spiritual warfare, it is important for us to continually protect our hearts and minds with the hope of our salvation and victory. Also, important is to be assured of our blessed position as saved believers, and that nothing will ever "separate us" from the love of God in Messiah" (Romans 8:35).

Then **Hannah** (Samuel's mother) **prayed** and said, "My heart **exults** in **the LORD**; my horn is **exalted** in **the LORD**, my mouth speaks **boldly** against **my enemies**, **because I** <u>rejoice</u> in <u>Your salvation</u>.

(I Samuel 2:1)

But since we are of *the* day, let us be **sober**, having put on the **breastplate** of **faith** and **love**, and as a **helmet**, the **hope** of **salvation**. (I Thessalonians 5:8)

6. The only **offensive weapon** in **God's spiritual armor** is the "sword of the **Spirit**." The sword of the **Spirit** is the word of God, and it is vital that we learn to skillfully declare God's will, and **His word of truth** as we face the adversary of our souls. With this spiritual weapon, and the grace and power of God, we are able to engage and destroy "speculations," and "every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God,..(II Corinthians 10:5).

For the <u>word of God</u> is *living* and *active* and *sharper* than any two-edged <u>sword</u>,...(Hebrews 2:12a)

7. Am I actively and consistently engaged in "<u>prayer and petition</u> in the Spirit" for all **believers**? Do I fully **believe** and **understand** that <u>prayer</u> is the "warrior's resource," and how essential it is to *persevere* in prayer for all the saints?

"...and <u>pray</u> on my behalf, that utterance may be <u>given</u> to me in the opening of my mouth, to make known with boldness the <u>mystery</u> of the <u>gospel</u>,...

that in *proclaiming* it I may **speak boldly**, as I ought to speak." (Ephesians 6:19, 20b)
