### E. The Vision of the 4th Beast Interpreted

(7:15-28)

<sup>15</sup> "As for me, **Daniel**, my spirit was *distressed* within me, and the **visions** in my mind kept *alarming me*.

<sup>16</sup> I approached *one* of those who were standing by and began asking him the <u>exact meaning</u> of all this.
So he told me and made known to me the <u>interpretation</u> of these things:

<sup>17</sup> 'These **great beasts**, which are **four** *in number*, are **four kings** *who* will **arise** from the **earth**.

<sup>18</sup> But the **saints** of the **Highest One** will **receive the kingdom** and **possess the kingdom** forever, for all ages to come.'

"Then I desired to know the <u>exact meaning</u> of the <u>fourth beast</u>, which was *different* from all the <u>others</u>, exceedingly <u>dreadful</u>, with its <u>teeth of iron</u> and its <u>claws of bronze</u>, <u>and which devoured</u>, <u>crushed</u> and <u>trampled</u> down the <u>remainder</u> with its feet,

and the **meaning** of the **ten horns** that were on **its head** and the **other horn** which **came up**, and before which **three of them fell**, namely, that **horn** which had **eyes** and a **mouth** uttering **great boasts** and which was **larger** in appearance than its **associates**.

<sup>21</sup> I kept looking, and **that horn** was **waging war** with the **saints** and **overpowering them** <sup>22</sup> until the **Ancient of Days came** and **iudgment** was passed **in favor** of the **saints** of the **Highest One**, and the **time arrived** when the **saints** took **possession** of the **kingdom**.

<sup>23</sup> "Thus **he** said: 'The **fourth beast** will be a **fourth kingdom** on the **earth**, which will be **different** from all the **other kingdoms** and will **devour** the **whole earth** and **tread it down** and **crush it**.

<sup>24</sup> As for the <u>ten horns</u>, out of this <u>kingdom ten kings</u> will arise; and <u>another</u> will <u>arise</u> after them, and <u>he</u> will be <u>different</u> from the previous ones and will <u>subdue three kings</u>.

<sup>25</sup> He will speak out against the Most High and wear down the saints of the Highest One, and he will intend to make alterations in times and in law; and they will be given into his hand for a time, times, and half a time.

<sup>26</sup> But the **court** will sit **for judgment**, and his **dominion** will be **taken away**, **annihilated** and **destroyed forever**.

<sup>27</sup> Then the **sovereignty**, the **dominion** and the **greatness** of **all** the **kingdoms** under the **whole heaven** will be given to the **people** of the **saints** of the **Highest One**; **His kingdom** will be an **everlasting kingdom**, and **all** the **dominions** will **serve** and **obey Him**.'

<sup>28</sup> "At this point the **revelation ended**.

As for **me**, **Daniel**, my thoughts were **greatly alarming me** and my face grew **pale**, but I kept the matter to **myself**."

### Message Summary The *Vision* of the <u>4th Beast</u> (7:7-8, 19-26)

"...I (Daniel) kept looking ...and behold, a <u>fourth beast</u>, dreadful and terrifying and extremely strong; and it had large *iron teeth*. It *devoured* and *crushed* and *trampled* down the remainder with its feet;.." (7:7-8)

"Then I desired to know the **exact meaning** of the **fourth beast**, which was **different** from all the others, exceedingly **dreadful**, with its **teeth of iron** and its **claws of bronze**," (7:19)

<u>Interpretation</u> → <u>Historically</u>, this <u>beast</u> clearly represents the <u>Roman empire</u>, which ruthlessly *crushed*, *devoured*, and *trampled* peoples and civilizations with its powerful armies. <u>Rome</u> could never get enough of <u>conquest</u>, and all her designs were <u>imperial</u>, *crushing* all those who resisted.

"...and it (the fourth beast)...had ten horns." (7:7b)

"As for the **ten horns**, out of this kingdom **ten kings** will **arise**...(7:24a)

<u>Interpretation</u> → The <u>ten horns</u> represent <u>ten kings</u> (kingdoms) that will arise from the **fourth kingdom** (**Rome**) (7:24).

The **Roman empire** would eventually be **characterized** by progressive **weakness**, **deterioration**, and **division**. When the **hordes** from the **north** *conquered* the **Roman empire** in the **fifth century** A. D., they <u>did not</u> <u>unite</u> to form **another** empire. Instead <u>individual nations</u> emerged out of the **old Roman empire**, some of them **continuing** to this very day.

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"While I was contemplating the **horns**, behold, **another horn**, **a little one**, came up among them, and **three** of the first horns were **pulled out** by the **roots** before it;

and behold, this <u>horn</u> possessed **eyes** like the **eyes of a man**, and a **mouth** uttering **great boasts**" (7:8, 20, 24a-25)

<u>Interpretation</u> → This "little horn" represents <u>another king</u> who will rise to **power** from among the **ten kings**, and in the process of its emergence, will **subdue three kings** (7:24).

The little horn having "the eyes of a man" represents <u>intelligence</u>. This king will "utter great boasts," and will "speak out <u>against</u> the Most High..." (7:25a) boldly opposing God's authority (Rev. 13:6).

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"I kept looking, and that <u>horn</u> was <u>waging war</u> with the <u>saints</u> and <u>overpowering</u> them... <u>He</u> will...<u>wear down</u> the <u>saints</u> of the <u>Highest One,..</u>" (7:21, 25a) (also Rev. 13:7)

<u>Interpretation</u> → He (the little horn) will <u>persecute</u> the saints of the Most High God. Some believe that this has reference to <u>all believers</u>, while others believe the saints to be the *believing* remnant of the nation of <u>Israel</u>, who will be <u>persecuted</u> along with <u>unbelieving <u>Israel</u></u> during the <u>tribulation</u> of the <u>latter days</u>. (7:25) (Rev. 13:5-7, 12:6, 14)

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"...and he ("the **little horn**") will intend to make **alterations** in **times** and the **law**; and **they** (the **saints**) will be **given** into **his hand** for a **time**, **times**, and half a time." (7:25)

Interpretation → This king (the little horn) will try to *change* times and laws in order to oppress and "wear down" the saints, and promote his blasphemous and godless agenda. He will be given "time, times, and a half of time" (3 ½ years) to rule with complete authority over the saints, and all the nations. (7:25, 12:7) (Rev. 13:5-7, 12:14)

"But the <u>court</u> will sit for judgment, and <u>his</u> (the little horn) dominion will be taken away, annihilated and destroyed forever."(7:26)

"Then I (Daniel) kept looking because of the sound of the boastful words which the horn was speaking;...until the beast was slain, and its body destroyed and given to the burning fire."(7:11)

<u>Interpretation</u> → This depicts <u>God's final judgment</u> on the **ten king confederacy**, the **final** *form* of the **fourth beast**, and on its **blasphemous ruler** (the **little horn**) (the **anti-christ**) of the **last days**. (7:11, 26) (Daniel 2:34, 44) (Rev. 19:20; 20:10)

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"I kept looking,...until the Ancient of Days came and <u>judgment</u>
was passed in <u>favor</u> of the saints of the Highest One,
and the time arrived when the saints took <u>possession</u> of the kingdom...

Then the **sovereignty**, the **dominion** and the **greatness** of <u>all</u> the **kingdoms** under the whole heaven will be **given** to the **people** of the **saints** of the **Highest One**; <u>His kingdom</u> will be an <u>everlasting kingdom</u>,.."

(7:21-22, 27)

Interpretation → After God judges this final kingdom (the 4<sup>th</sup> beast), He will establish His kingdom, a kingdom ruled by the "Son of Man" (7:13-14), and possessed by the saints (believing Israel) of the Highest One (7:22). This kingdom will be an everlasting kingdom, and "all dominions will serve and obey Him." (7:27)

### According to **Daniel's Prophetic** *Vision*, **What** <u>events</u> should we *expect* to happen?

- 1. We can *expect* the formulation of a <u>ten nation confederacy</u>, comprised from the **old Roman empire**, consisting of both *strong* and *weak* <u>nations</u>. (2:41-42, 7:24)
- 2. We can *expect* a <u>king/kingdom</u> to *arise* from **among** the **ten nations**, that will <u>subdue</u> three kings, and be "larger" in appearance. (7:8, 20a, 24)
- 3. We can *expect* this <u>king</u> to be **intelligent**, **boastful** (7:8, 11, 20), and **blasphemous** (7:25, Rev. 13:6). *He* will **wage war** against, and "**wear down**" the **saints** (7:21, 25, Rev. 13:7). *He* will seek to **change times** and **laws**, and **all authority** will be **granted him** for 3 ½ years (7:25, Rev. 13:5).
- 4. After this 3 ½ year period, God will come and <u>judge</u> this king (the little horn), and his kingdom (the fourth beast in its final form→the ten nation confederacy). He will <u>annihilate</u> and <u>destroy him</u> *forever*. (7:11, 26) (Daniel 2:34, 44) (Rev. 19:20; 20:10)

5. God, through His King, the Son of Man, will then establish His kingdom. His kingdom will be an everlasting kingdom, and all peoples and nations will obey Him (7:13-14, 27b, 2:44, Psalm 2:6-12, Rev. 11:15). At this time the saints of the "Highest One," the believing remnant of Israel, will receive and possess the kingdom forever. (7:18, 22, 27a)

# Personal Application So the *future* looks a little "scary." How do we then live?

#### 1. Live Confidently...

- a. *Knowing* that regardless of the actions of **nations** and **empires**, **God is in <u>control</u>** of *all* **things** (Daniel 2:20-21)
- b. *Knowing* that **God** is **causing** "all things to **work together** <u>for good.</u>" and is accomplishing *His* **purposes** in **your life.** (Romans 8:28) (Phil. 1:6)
- c. *Knowing* that regardless of *present* events in the world, God has secured your future life and blessings forever (I Peter 1:3-4)

#### 2. Live Righteously...

When the *whirlwind* passes, the <u>wicked</u> is *no more*, but the <u>righteous</u> *has* an *everlasting foundation*. (Prov. 10:25)

Therefore, **prepare your minds** for action, keep **sober** *in spirit*, **fix your** *hope* completely on the **grace** to be brought to you at the **revelation of Jesus the Messiah**.

As obedient **children**, do not be **conformed** to the former lusts which were yours in your ignorance, but like the **Holy One** who called you, **be holy yourselves** also in your **behavior**; because it is written, "YOU SHALL BE **HOLY**, FOR I AM HOLY." (I Peter 2:13-16)

#### 3. *Live* <u>Wisely</u>...

The <u>wise man</u> is cautious and turns away from evil, but a fool is arrogant and careless... The <u>prudent</u> sees the evil and hides himself, but the naïve go on, and are punished for it. (Proverbs 10:16, 23) Therefore **be careful** how you **walk**, not as **unwise men** but as **wise**, making the most of **your time** because the days **are evil**. So then do **not** be **foolish**, but **understand** what **the will of the Lord is**.

(Ephesians 5:15-17)

#### 4. *Live* Lovingly...

So, as **those** who have been **chosen of God**, **holy** and **beloved**, put on a heart of **compassion**, **kindness**, **humility**, **gentleness** and **patience**; **bearing** with **one another**, and **forgiving each other**, whoever has a **complaint** against anyone; just as the **Lord forgave you**, so **also should you**.

**Beyond** all these things <u>put on love</u>, which is the **perfect bond** of **unity**. (Colossians 3:12-14)

#### 5. Live Faithfully...

Trust in the LORD with all your heart do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him,
And He will make your paths straight. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

Therefore, my **beloved brethren**, be **steadfast, immovable**, always **abounding** in the **work of the Lord**, knowing that **your toil** is **not** *in* vain **in the Lord**. (I Corinthians 15:58)

#### 6. Live Courageously...

"Have I not **commanded** you? Be **strong** and **courageous**!

Do **not** tremble or be dismayed, for the **Lord your God**is **with you wherever you go**." (Joshua 1:9)

"Be **strong**, and let us show ourselves <u>courageous</u> for the sake of **our people** and for the **cities of our God**; and may **the LORD** do what **is <u>good</u> in** *His sight***." (II Samuel 10:12)** 

#### 7. Live Relationally...

...and let us consider how to **stimulate** one another to **love** and **good deeds**, **not forsaking** our own **assembling together**, as is the habit of some, but **encouraging one another**, and all the **more** as you see **the day drawing near**. (Hebrews 10:24-25)
