The Book of Daniel God's Prophet and Statesman

I. Daniel's <u>Exile</u> to Babylon (1:1-21)
II. Nebuchadnezzar's <u>Troublesome Dream</u> (2:1-49)

III. Nebuchadnezzar's <u>Threat</u> against the Jews (3:1-30) (Part 1)

A. The *Conceit* of the <u>King</u> (3:1-3)

3 Nebuchadnezzar the *king* made an <u>image of gold</u>, the height of which *was* sixty cubits *and* its width six cubits; he set it up on the plain of Dura in the province of Babylon.

² Then **Nebuchadnezzar** the *king* sent *word* to assemble the **satraps**, the **prefects** and the **governors**, the **counselors**, the **treasurers**, the **judges**, the **magistrates** and all the **rulers** of the **provinces** to come to the **dedication** of the **image** that **Nebuchadnezzar** the **king** had set up.

³ Then the satraps, the prefects and the governors, the counselors, the treasurers, the judges, the magistrates and all the rulers of the provinces were assembled for the *dedication* of the <u>image</u> that Nebuchadnezzar the *king* had set up; and they stood before the <u>image</u> that Nebuchadnezzar had set up.

B. The *Command* to Worship the <u>King's Image</u> (3:4-7)

⁴ Then the herald loudly proclaimed: "To you the <u>command</u> is given, O peoples, nations and men of every language, ⁵ that at the moment you hear the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery, bagpipe and all kinds of music, you are to fall down and worship the golden image that Nebuchadnezzar the king has set up.

⁶ But whoever does *not* fall down and <u>worship</u> shall immediately be **cast** into the **midst** of a **furnace** of **blazing fire**."

⁷ Therefore at that time, when all the **peoples** heard the sound of the **horn**, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery, bagpipe and all kinds of music, all the **peoples**, nations and *men* of every language fell down and <u>worshiped</u> the <u>golden image</u> that Nebuchadnezzar the king had set up.

C. The *Conspiracy* of the <u>Chaldeans</u> (3:8-12)

⁸ For *this reason* at that time certain <u>Chaldeans</u> came forward and brought <u>charges</u> against the Jews.

⁹ They responded and said to Nebuchadnezzar the king:
"O king, live forever! ¹⁰ You, O king, have made a decree that every man who hears the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery, and bagpipe and all kinds of music, is to fall down and worship the golden image.

¹¹ But *whoever* does <u>not</u> fall down and *worship* shall be cast into the midst of a furnace of blazing fire.

¹² There are **certain Jews** whom <u>you</u> have **appointed** over the **administration** of the province of **Babylon**, *namely* **Shadrach**, **Meshach** and **Abed-nego**.

These men, O king, have <u>disregarded vou;</u> they do <u>not</u> serve <u>vour</u> gods or *worship* the golden image which <u>you</u> have set up."

D. The *Charge* of the <u>King</u> (3:13-15)

¹³ Then Nebuchadnezzar in rage and anger gave orders to bring Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego; then these men were brought before the king.

¹⁴ Nebuchadnezzar responded and said to them, "Is it true, Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, that you do <u>not</u> serve my gods or worship the golden image that I have set up?

¹⁵ Now if you are ready, at the moment you hear the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery and bagpipe and all kinds of music, to fall down and worship the image that I have made, very well.

But if you do <u>not worship</u>, you will immediately be <u>cast</u> into the **midst** of a **furnace** of **blazing fire**; and **what god** is there **who can** *deliver you* **out** of **my hands**?"

E. The Bold *Confession* of Faith (3:16-18)

¹⁶ Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego replied to the king, "O Nebuchadnezzar, we do *not* need to give you an <u>answer</u> concerning this matter.

> ¹⁷ If it be so, our God whom we serve is <u>able</u> to <u>deliver us</u> from the furnace of blazing fire; and <u>He will deliver us</u> out of your hand, O king.

¹⁸ But even if He <u>does not</u>, let it be known to you, O king, that we are <u>not</u> going to serve your gods or worship the golden image that you have set up."

Message Summary 4 Key *Observations*

1. The *Pride* of <u>Nebuchadnezzar</u>

Daniel chapter 3 begins with King Nebuchadnezzar making a large <u>image of gold</u> in the province of Babylon. Having been declared by Daniel to be the "king of kings", and the "head of gold" in his <u>dream</u> (2:37-38), Nebuchadnezzar undoubtedly took <u>pride</u> in this status, and sought personal glory from all, through the <u>worship</u> of his image.

> Nebuchadnezzar hadn't yet understood that his high position was granted him by <u>God</u>, for it is "He who <u>removes</u> kings and <u>establishes</u> kings (2:21)."

There is a **saying** that seems to fit here, that **"absolute power** *corrupts* **absolutely**." The **scriptures** are filled with <u>warnings</u> to **believers** about the **peril of** <u>pride</u>:

Pride goes before destruction, And a haughty spirit before stumbling. (Proverbs 16:18)

A man's <u>pride</u> will bring him *low*, But a **humble spirit** will obtain *honor*. (Proverbs 29:23)

As **believers**, we are admonished <u>not</u> to think **more highly** of **ourselves** than we ought to think (Romans 12:3) and that; **GOD** IS <u>OPPOSED</u> TO THE <u>PROUD</u>, BUT GIVES <u>GRACE</u> TO THE <u>HUMBLE</u> (James 46b).

2. The *Persecution* of the <u>Godly</u>

For **this reason** at that time **certain Chaldeans** came forward and **brought** <u>**charges**</u> against **the** <u>**Jews**</u>...

There are **certain Jews** whom *you* have appointed... These **men**, **O** king, have **disregarded you**; they **do** <u>not</u> serve your gods or <u>worship</u> the golden image which *you* have set up." (3:8, 12)

> Indeed, <u>all</u> who desire to *live godly* in **Messiah Jesus** will be persecuted. (II Timothy 3:12)

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"*Blessed* are those who have been <u>persecuted</u> for the sake of *righteousness*, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:10)

3. The *Peril* of "Image" Worship

"You shall have no other gods before Me.

"You shall <u>not</u> make for yourself <u>an idol</u>, or any likeness of what is in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the water under the earth. You shall <u>not worship</u> them or <u>serve them</u>; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God,.."(Exodus 20:3-5a)

Being then the **children of God**, we ought <u>not</u> to think that the **Divine Nature** is like *gold* or *silver* or *stone*, an <u>image</u> formed by the art and thought of man. (Acts 17:29)

As **believers**, we too are **confronted** by "**images**" that have been "**set up**," and **idolized** by those in **powerful positions**, who **declare** that they should be to be **embraced** and "**worshipped**."

Today we to have "images" of gold" (wealth), along with images of power, pleasure, physical beauty, prestige (fame), politics, works of art, and so called wisdom, that both entice and implore us to pay them homage. These all compete for the attention, love, and "worship" that should *only* be given to our great God and Savior.

4. The **Bold** *Proclamation* of <u>Faith</u>

Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego answered and said to the king,... we do not need to give you an answer concerning this matter.

If it be *so*, **our** God whom we serve is <u>able</u> to deliver us from the **furnace** of **blazing fire**; and **He will** <u>deliver us</u> out of **your hand**,...

But *even* if *He does* not, let it be known to you, O king, that we are <u>not</u> going to serve your gods or worship the golden image that you have set up. (2:16-18)

As we face the "furnace" of affliction and persecution for our beliefs, may God grant us <u>courage</u> and <u>faith</u> like that of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego.

,..but sanctify Messiah as Lord in your hearts, always *being* ready to make <u>a defense</u> to everyone who asks you to give an account for the <u>hope</u> that is in you, yet with *gentleness* and *reverence; (I Peter 3:15)*

> Have I not commanded you? Be <u>strong</u> and <u>courageous</u>! Do not tremble or be dismayed, for the LORD your God is <u>with you</u> wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

Messianic Apologetics Challenge

Jews feel that since we worship and exalt (the Image of)Jesus, that we are breaking God's command concerning images we have an "<u>image</u>" problem...How do we answer this?

- 1. First, as Messianic believers, we **worship** the <u>one true God</u>, the God of Israel, and proclaim His oneness or uniqueness. (Deut. 6:4) (Eph. 4:6)
- 2. According to scripture, there is an *"image"* of God because man was created according to the *"image* and likeness" of God. (Gen. 1:26-27)
- According to scripture, we also believe that God did "<u>appear</u>" before men in various ways, even in the "form" of a man. These are called theophanies. (Gen. 18:1-33) (Gen. 32:24-30) (Ex. 24:9-12) (Num. 12:6-8)
- 4. We also believe that though the **Tanach** (O.T.) does not specifically proclaim **Messiah** to be **"divine" in nature**, the **scriptures** do ascribe **exaltation** and **worship** to:
 - a. An exalted <u>Son</u>—(Psalm 2:7-12) (Isaiah 9:6
 b. An exalted <u>King</u>—(Psalm 2:6) (Psalm 72:1-11) (Jer. 23:6)
 c. An exalted "Son of Man"—(Daniel 7:13-14) (Zech. 13:17)
- That being said, we believe that at the appointed time, and in accordance with prophetic scripture, God sent forth His "Anointed", His Messiah. The New Testament reveals the Messiah as "only begotten <u>Son</u>" of God: (Galatians 4:4) (John 3:16)
 - a. Who is the "<u>living Word</u>", the living "expression" of the thoughts and will of God

In the beginning was **the Word**, and the **Word** was **with God**, and the **Word** <u>was</u> **God**....And the **Word** <u>became</u> flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

...No one has **seen** God at any time; the only **begotten God** who is in the **bosom** of the **Father**, He has **explained** Him. (John 1:1, 14, 18)

b. Who is declared as a **manifestation** of the **one true God**

For **in Him** (Messiah) all the **fullness** of <u>Deity</u> dwells in **bodily form**. (Colossians 2:9) Jesus answered them, "…<u>I and the Father are one</u>." (John 10:25a, 30)

c. Who is the "image" of the invisible God

And **He** is the <u>image</u> of the <u>invisible God</u>, the firstborn of all creation. (Colossians 1:15)

God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, in these last days has spoken to us <u>in</u> His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things,

through whom also He <u>made</u> the world. And He is the radiance of His glory and the <u>exact representation</u> of His <u>nature</u>,... (Hebrews 1:1-3a)

Messianic Apologetics Challenge

Jews feel that since we worship and exalt (the *Image* of) Jesus, that we are breaking God's commands concerning worshipping another god, and worshipping the *image* of a Man. We have an "<u>image</u>" problem...How do we <u>answer</u> this?

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 - c. An *exalted* "<u>Son of Man</u>"—(Daniel 7:13-14) (Zech. 13:17)

- 5. That being said, we believe that at the appointed time, and in accordance with prophetic scripture, God sent forth His "Anointed," His Messiah. The New Testament reveals and declares Jesus the Messiah to be:
 - a. The <u>Word made flesh</u>. (John 1:1, 14)-The **revelation/expression** of the very "Life" and Purposes of God (I John 1:1-2)

In the beginning was **the Word**, and the **Word** was **with God**, and the **Word** <u>was</u> **God**....And the **Word** <u>became</u> flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw **His glory**, **glory** as of the **only begotten** of the **Father**, full of **grace** and **truth**.

...**No one** has **seen God** at any time; the only **begotten God** who is in the **bosom** of the **Father**, **He** has **explained** Him. (John 1:1, 14, 18)

b. The <u>Son of Man</u> (Matthew 18:11, 20:28) (John 12:23)

c. The "only begotten Son" of God. (Galatians 4:4) (John 3:16)

d. The **fullness** of <u>Deity</u> in **bodily form**. (Colossians 2:9)

e. The "image" of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. (Colossians 1:15)

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
