The Book of Daniel God's Prophet and Statesman

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F. The *Condemnation* of the <u>King</u> (3:19-23)

¹⁹ Then **Nebuchadnezzar** was filled with <u>wrath</u>, and his **facial expression** was altered toward **Shadrach**, **Meshach** and **Abed-nego**.

He answered by giving orders to heat the furnace seven times more than it was usually heated.

²⁰ He commanded certain valiant warriors who were in his army to tie up Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego in order to <u>cast</u> them into the furnace of blazing fire.

²¹ Then these men were *tied up* in their trousers, their coats, their caps and their *other* clothes, and were <u>cast</u> into the **midst** of the furnace of blazing fire.

²² For *this reason*, because the king's command was urgent and the furnace had been made *extremely* hot, the flame of the fire <u>slew</u> those men who carried up Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego.

> ²³ But these three men, Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, fell into the midst of the furnace of blazing fire still tied up.

G. The "*Companion*" in the <u>Fire</u> (3:24-25)

²⁴ Then Nebuchadnezzar the king was <u>astounded</u> and stood up in haste; he responded and said to his high officials, "Was it not *three men* we cast bound into the midst of the fire?"

They replied to the **king**, "**Certainly**, **O king**." ²⁵ He said, "Look! I see <u>four men</u> *loosed* and walking *about* in the midst of the fire without harm, and the **appearance** of the <u>fourth</u> is like a <u>son</u> of *the* gods!"

H. The *Confirmation* of a **Powerful** <u>Deliverance</u> (3:26-27)

²⁶ Then Nebuchadnezzar came near to the door of the furnace of blazing fire; he responded and said, "Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, come out, you servants of the Most High God, and come here!"

Then Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego came out of the midst of the fire.

²⁷ The satraps, the prefects, the governors and the king's high officials gathered around and saw in regard to these men that the fire had <u>no effect</u> on the bodies of these men nor was the hair of their head singed, nor were their trousers damaged, nor had the smell of fire even come upon them.

I. The *Capitulation* of the <u>King</u> (3:28-30)

²⁸ Nebuchadnezzar responded and said, "<u>Blessed</u> be <u>the God</u> of Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, who has sent <u>His angel</u> and <u>delivered</u> His servants who put their <u>trust</u> in Him, violating the king's command, and yielded up their bodies so as <u>not</u> to serve or worship any god except their <u>own God</u>.

²⁹ Therefore I make <u>a decree</u> that any people, nation or tongue that speaks anything offensive against the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego shall be torn limb from limb and their houses reduced to a rubbish heap, inasmuch as there is no other god who is able to <u>deliver</u> in this way."

³⁰ Then the king caused Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego to <u>prosper</u> in the province of Babylon.

Message Summary Key Observations

A. The *Peril* of <u>Anger</u> and <u>Rage</u>

Then **Nebuchadnezzar** was <u>filled with wrath</u>, and his **facial expression** was **altered** toward Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego...

,..because the **king's command** *was* **urgent** and the **furnace** had been made **extremely hot**, the **flame** of the **fire slew** those **men** who **carried up** Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego. (3:19, 22)

Personal Application→ Cease from <u>anger</u> and forsake <u>wrath</u>; Do **not fret**; *it leads* only to <u>evildoing</u>. (Psalm 37:8)

> Do *not* be eager in **your heart** to be <u>angry</u>, For <u>anger</u> *resides* in the **bosom of fools**. (Ecclesiastes 7:9)

B. The *Presence* of <u>God</u> in the <u>Furnace</u>

He (the king) said, "Look! I see <u>four</u> men loosed and walking about in the <u>midst</u> of the <u>fire</u> without harm, and the **appearance** of the **fourth** is like a <u>son of *the* gods</u>!" (3:25)

C. The *Powerful* <u>Deliverance</u>

The satraps, the prefects, the governors and the king's high officials... saw in regard to **these men** that **the fire** had <u>no effect</u> on the **bodies** of **these men** *nor* was the **hair** of their head *singed*, *nor* were their **trousers** *damaged*, *nor* had the **smell** of **fire** *even* come *upon* **them**. (3:27)

D. The *Praise* of the <u>King</u>

- 1. *Praising* the <u>God</u> of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego (3:28a)
- 2. *Praising* the <u>Faith</u> and <u>Dedication</u> of the three Jews (3:28b)

E. The *Proclamation* of the <u>King</u>

Therefore I make a <u>decree</u> that *any* people, nation or tongue that speaks anything offensive against...<u>God</u>... shall be torn limb from limb and their houses **reduced** to a rubbish heap, inasmuch as there is **no other god** who is **able to** <u>deliver</u> in this way."(3:29)

F. The *Prosperity* of the *Faithful*

Then the king caused Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego to prosper in the province of Babylon.

Personal Application

As **Believers**, we too may face a "*fiery* furnace" for our <u>faith</u>, but God has promised

to never leave or forsake us (Hebrews 13:5-6)

But now, thus says **the LORD**, **your Creator**, **O Jacob**, And **He** who **formed you**, **O Israel**, "Do not *fear*, for **I have redeemed you**; **I have called you** by *name*; **you are** *Mine*!

"When you **pass through** the *waters*, I will be <u>with you</u>; And **through** the *rivers,* they will *not* overflow you. When you <u>walk</u> through <u>the fire</u>, you will <u>not</u> be scorched, <u>Nor</u> will the flame burn you. (Isaiah 43:1-2)

"Behold, I have *refined you*, but not as **silver;** I have *tested you* in the <u>furnace of affliction</u>." (Isaiah 48:1)

"Beloved, do not be surprised at the <u>fiery</u> ordeal among you, which comes upon you for your <u>testing</u>, as though some strange thing were happening to you;" but to the degree that you share the sufferings of Messiah, keep on rejoicing,..

if you are *reviled* for the name of Messiah, you are blessed, because the <u>Spirit</u> of glory and of God *rests* on you. (I Peter 4:12-14)

God is our **refuge** and **strength**, a very **present help** in **trouble**...

The LORD of hosts is <u>with us;</u> the God of Jacob is our stronghold. (Psalm 46:1,11)

My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the <u>strength</u> of my heart and my portion forever...

But as for **me**, the <u>nearness</u> of God is my good; I have made the LORD God my *refuge*, that I may tell of all *Your* works. (Psalm 73:26, 28)

"At my (Paul's) first defense <u>no one</u> supported me, but <u>all</u> deserted me; may it not be counted against them. But the Lord <u>stood</u> with me and <u>strengthened</u> me, so that the proclamation might be fully accomplished, and that all the Gentiles might *hear;* and I was <u>rescued</u> out of the lion's mouth." (II Timothy 4:16-17)

Closing Comments

The **deliverance** of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego a *picture* of <u>our</u> deliverance in Messiah?

- A. Were *we* not facing the "<u>wrath</u>" of a King, having broken His Laws? (John 3:36) (Eph. 2:1-3)
- B. Were *we* not facing a **judgment of "fire"** (ie hellfire)" (Revelation 20:12-15)
- C. Were *we* not **delivered** by a "<u>Companion</u>", a "Son of God" who came among us to **loose us** from our **bonds** and **save us** from **death**. (John 3:17, 36) (Romans 5:8-9) (Heb. 2:14-15) (I John 2:1-2)
