(4:1-37)

- A. His Virtuous Proclamation (4:1-3)
 - **4 Nebuchadnezzar** the **king** to all the **peoples**, **nations**, and **men** of every language that **live** in **all the earth**:
- "May your **peace** abound! ² It has seemed **good to me** to declare the **signs** and **wonders** which the **Most High God** has **done for me**.

³ "How *great* are **His signs**And how *mighty* are **His wonders! His kingdom** is an *everlasting* kingdom
And **His dominion** is from *generation* to *generation*.

- B. His Vexing <u>Dream</u> and <u>Visions</u> (4:4-9)
- ⁴ "I, Nebuchadnezzar, was at ease in my house and flourishing in my palace.
 ⁵ I saw <u>a dream</u> and it made me <u>fearful</u>; and these fantasies as I lay on my bed and the <u>visions</u> in my mind kept <u>alarming me</u>.
 - ⁶ So I gave **orders** to bring into my presence all the **wise men** of **Babylon**, that they might **make known** to me the **interpretation** of the <u>dream</u>.
- ⁷Then the **magicians**, the **conjurers**, the **Chaldeans** and the **diviners** came in and I related the **dream** to them, but they could **not** make its **interpretation known** to **me**.

⁸ But finally <u>Daniel</u> came in before me, whose name is <u>Belteshazzar</u> according to the name of my god, and in whom is a <u>spirit</u> of the holy gods; and I related the <u>dream</u> to him, saving.

⁹ 'O Belteshazzar, chief of the magicians, since I know that a spirit of the holy gods is <u>in you</u> and no mystery baffles you, tell me the <u>visions</u> of my dream which I have seen, along with its interpretation.

C. His Visions Revealed (4:10-18)

Now these were the <u>visions</u> in my mind as I lay on my bed:
I was looking, and behold, there was a tree in the midst of the earth and its height was great.

And its height reached to the sky,

And it was visible to the end of the whole earth.

12 'Its foliage was beautiful and its fruit abundant,
And in it was food for all.
The beasts of the field found shade under it,
And the birds of the sky dwelt in its branches,
And all living creatures fed themselves from it.

¹³ 'I was looking in the <u>visions</u> in my mind as *I lay* on my bed, and behold, an *angelic* watcher, a holy one, descended from heaven.

¹⁴ 'He shouted out and spoke as follows:

<u>Chop down</u> the tree and <u>cut off</u> its branches,
<u>Strip off</u> its foliage and <u>scatter</u> its fruit;
Let the beasts flee from under it
And the birds from its branches.

¹⁵ "Yet **leave the <u>stump</u>** with its **roots** in the ground, But with a <u>band</u> of iron and bronze around it In the new grass of the field;

And let <u>him</u> be drenched with the dew of heaven,
And let him <u>share</u> with the beasts in the grass of the earth.

16 "Let his mind be changed from that of a man
And let a <u>beast's mind</u> be given to him,
And let seven periods of time pass over him.

And the decision is a command of the holy ones,
In order that the living may know

That the Most High is ruler over the realm of mankind,
And bestows it on whom He wishes
And sets over it the lowliest of men."

¹⁸ This is the dream which I, King Nebuchadnezzar, have seen.
Now you, Belteshazzar, tell me its <u>interpretation</u>, inasmuch as none of the wise men of my kingdom is able to make known to me the interpretation; but you are able, for a spirit of the holy gods is in you.'

D. His Visions Interpreted (4:19-27)

¹⁹ "Then **Daniel**, whose name is **Belteshazzar**, was <u>appalled</u> for a while as his thoughts alarmed him. The king responded and said,

'Belteshazzar, do not let the <u>dream</u> or its <u>interpretation</u> alarm you.'

Belteshazzar replied, 'My lord, if only the dream applied to those who hate you and its interpretation to your adversaries!

²⁰ The tree that you saw, which became large and grew strong, whose height reached to the sky and was visible to all the earth ²¹ and whose foliage was beautiful and its fruit abundant, and in which was food for all, under which the beasts of the field dwelt and in whose branches the birds of the sky lodged—
²² it is you, O king; for you have become great and grown strong, and your majesty has become great and reached to the sky and your dominion to the end of the earth.

²³ In that the king saw an angelic watcher, a holy one, descending from heaven and saying, "Chop down the tree and destroy it; yet leave the stump with its roots in the ground, but with a band of iron and bronze around it in the new grass of the field, and let him be drenched with the dew of heaven, and let him share with the beasts of the field until seven periods of time pass over him," ²⁴ this is the interpretation, O king, and this is the decree of the Most High, which has come upon my lord the king:

25 that you be driven away from mankind and your dwelling place be with the beasts of the field, and you be given grass to eat like cattle and be drenched with the dew of heaven; and seven periods of time will pass over you, until you recognize that the Most High is ruler over the realm of mankind and bestows it on whomever He wishes.

²⁶ And in that it was **commanded** to **leave** the **stump** with the **roots** of the **tree**, **your kingdom** will be **assured to you after you recognize** that it is **Heaven that** rules.

²⁷ Therefore, O king, may my advice be pleasing to you: break away now from your sins by doing righteousness and from your iniquities by showing mercy to the poor, in case there may be a prolonging of your prosperity.'

E. His *Visions* Fulfilled (4:28-37)

²⁸ "All *this* happened to **Nebuchadnezzar the king**.
 ²⁹ **Twelve months later** he was walking on the *roof* of the royal palace of **Babylon**.

The king reflected and said, 'Is this not <u>Babylon the great</u>, which <u>I myself</u> have <u>built</u> as a royal residence by the <u>might</u> of <u>my power</u> and for the <u>glory</u> of <u>my majesty</u>?'

While the word was in the king's mouth,
 a voice came from heaven, saying, 'King Nebuchadnezzar,
 to you it is declared: sovereignty has been removed from you,
 32 and you will be driven away from mankind,
 and your dwelling place will be with the beasts of the field.

You will be given grass to eat like cattle, and seven periods of time will pass over you until you recognize that the Most High is ruler over the realm of mankind and bestows it on whomever He wishes.

³³ Immediately the word concerning Nebuchadnezzar was fulfilled; and he was driven away from mankind and began eating grass like cattle, and his body was drenched with the dew of heaven until his hair had grown like eagles' feathers and his nails like birds' claws.

³⁴ "But at the <u>end</u> of that period, I, Nebuchadnezzar, raised my eyes toward heaven and my reason returned to me, and <u>I blessed</u> the <u>Most High</u> and <u>praised</u> and <u>honored Him</u> who lives forever;

For **His dominion** is an <u>everlasting</u> dominion, And **His kingdom** *endures* from **generation** to **generation**.

35 "All the inhabitants of the earth are accounted as nothing,
But He does according to His will in the host of heaven
And among the inhabitants of earth;
And no one can ward off His hand
Or say to Him, 'What have You done?'

And my majesty and splendor were restored to me for the glory of my kingdom, and my counselors and my nobles began seeking me out; so I was reestablished in my sovereignty, and surpassing greatness was added to me.

³⁷ Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, *praise, exalt* and *honor* the King of heaven, for <u>all</u> His works are <u>true</u> and His ways <u>just</u>, and He is able to humble those who walk in pride."

Another Key **Theme**→ Nebuchadnezzar's *Lessons* in <u>Humility</u>

1. Nebuchadnezzar *learned* by *personal* experience that God is able to humble those who are powerful and proud.

"Now <u>I</u>, Nebuchadnezzar, *praise*, *exalt* and *honor* the King of heaven,. and He is <u>able</u> to <u>humble</u> those who walk in <u>pride</u>." (4:37)

2. Nebuchadnezzar *learned* that it was **God's sovereign <u>power</u>** and **will** that **gave him** his **place** of power, and **allowed him** his **great achievements**.

"This sentence is by the **decree** of the **angelic** watchers
And the **decision** is a **command** of the **holy ones**,
In order that **the living** may **know**That the **Most High** is <u>ruler</u> over the **realm of mankind**,
And <u>bestows it</u> on whom <u>He wishes</u>
And sets over it the lowliest of men." (4:17)

...this is the interpretation O king, and this is the decree of the Most High,...

...until you *recognize* that the **Most High is ruler** over the **realm of mankind** and **bestows it** on whom **He wishes**. (4:24a, 25b)

3. Nebuchadnezzar *learned* through his **humility**, that the **God of Daniel** was truly the "**Most High God**," and was **worthy** of all **praise**, **honor**, and **glory**.

"But at the **end** of **that period**, **I**, **Nebuchadnezzar**, raised my eyes toward **heaven** and **my reason** returned to me, and **I blessed** the **Most High** and **praised** and **honored Him** who lives **forever**;...

Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, <u>praise</u>, <u>exalt</u> and <u>honor</u> the King of heaven, for all His works are *true* and His ways *just*, and He is able to <u>humble</u> those who walk in <u>pride</u>." (4:34, 37)

4. Nebuchadnezzar *learned* that **God** <u>opposes</u> the **proud**, but **gives** <u>grace</u> to the <u>humble</u>. (James 4:6)

At that time my reason returned to me.

And my majesty and splendor were restored to me for the glory of my kingdom,
and my counselors and my nobles began seeking me out;
so I was reestablished in my sovereignty,
and surpassing greatness was added to me. (4:36)

Personal Application

Learning *Humility* is not ever easy, but its Lessons are vital for Spiritual Growth and Maturity

A. **Times of** *humility* serve to "humble" hearts filled with <u>pride</u> and <u>arrogance.</u>

The <u>proud</u> look of man will be <u>abased</u>
And the <u>loftiness</u> of man will be <u>humbled</u>,
And the <u>LORD alone</u> will be <u>exalted</u> in that day.

For the **LORD of hosts** will have a **day of reckoning**Against **everyone** who is **proud** and **lofty**And against **everyone** who is **lifted up**,
That **he** may be **abased**. (Isaiah 2:11-12)

Whoever <u>exalts</u> himself shall be <u>humbled</u>; and whoever <u>humbles</u> himself shall be <u>exalted</u>. (Matthew 23:12)

B. Times of humility are times of divine teaching.

When **pride** comes, then comes **dishonor**, but with the **humble** is **wisdom**. (Proverbs 16:5, 11:2)

He leads the **humble** in **justice**, and He $\underline{\text{teaches}}$ the humble $\underline{\text{His way}}$. (Psalms 25:9)

"You shall **remember** all the way which the **LORD your God**has **led you** in the wilderness these **forty years**,
that He might **humble you**, **testing you**, to know what was in **your heart**, whether you would keep His **commandments** or not.

He <u>humbled</u> you and let you be *hungry*, and *fed you* with manna which you did not know, nor did your fathers know,

that He might make you <u>understand</u> that man does *not* live by *bread alone*, but man lives by everything that proceeds

out of the **mouth** of the LORD." (Deuteronomy 8:2-3)

C. Times of humility draw us closer to God.

For thus says the **high** and **exalted One** who lives forever, whose name is Holy, "I dwell on a high and holy place, and also with the contrite and lowly of spirit...(Isaiah 57:15)

Draw near to God and He will draw near to you.

Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded... <u>Humble yourselves</u> in the presence of the Lord, and He will exalt you. (James 4:8, 10)

D. "Putting on humility" means you are growing in godliness.

So, as those who have been <u>chosen</u> of God, holy and beloved, <u>put on</u> a heart of compassion, kindness, <u>humility</u>, <u>gentleness</u> and <u>patience</u>;.. (Colossians 3:12)

Therefore I, the **prisoner** of the **Lord**, implore you to **walk** in a manner **worthy** of the **calling** with which you have been called, with all **humility** and **gentleness**, with **patience**, showing **tolerance** for one another **in love**,..(Ephesians 4:1-2)

You younger men, likewise, be **subject** to *your* elders; and **all of you**, **clothe yourselves** with **humility** toward **one another**, for **GOD IS OPPOSED** TO THE **PROUD**, BUT **GIVES GRACE** TO THE **HUMBLE**. (I Peter 5:5)
