The Book of Daniel God's Prophet and Statesman

V. The *Termination* of the **Babylonian Kingdom** (5:1-31)

A. The *Desecration* of the **Temple Vessels** (5:1-4)

Belshazzar the king held a **great feast** for a thousand of his nobles, and he was **drinking wine** in the presence of the thousand.

When Belshazzar tasted the wine, he gave orders to bring the gold and silver vessels which Nebuchadnezzar his father had taken out of the temple which was in Jerusalem, so that the king and his nobles, his wives and his concubines might drink from them.

³ Then they brought the **gold** <u>vessels</u> that had been **taken out** of the **temple**, the <u>house of God</u> which *was* in **Jerusalem**; and the **king** and his **nobles**, his **wives** and his **concubines** *drank* from them.

⁴ They **drank** the **wine** and **praised** the **gods** of **gold** and **silver**, of **bronze**, **iron**, **wood** and **stone**.

B. The *Daunting* Appearance of a Man's Hand (5:5-6)

⁵ Suddenly the **fingers** of a **man's** <u>hand</u> emerged and began *writing* opposite the **lampstand** on the plaster of the **wall** of the king's palace, and the **king** saw the *back* of the <u>hand</u> that did the *writing*.

⁶Then the king's face grew *pale* and his thoughts *alarmed him*, and his hip joints went *slack* and his knees began *knocking together*.

C. The *Desperation* of the $\underline{\mathbf{King}}$ (5:7-9)

⁷ The king called aloud to bring in the conjurers, the Chaldeans and "Any man who can read this inscription and explain its interpretation to me shall be clothed with purple and have a necklace of gold around his neck, and have authority as third ruler in the kingdom."

⁸ Then all the king's wise men came in, but they <u>could not</u> read the inscription or make known its interpretation to the king.
⁹ Then King Belshazzar was greatly alarmed, his face grew even paler, and his nobles were perplexed.

D. The *Demand* to see **Daniel** (5:10-16)

¹⁰ The **queen** entered the banquet hall because of **the words** of the **king** and his **nobles**; the **queen** spoke and said,

"O king, live forever! Do not let your thoughts alarm you or your face be pale.
11 There is a man in your kingdom in whom is a spirit of the holy gods;
and in the days of your father, illumination, insight and wisdom
like the wisdom of the gods were found in him.

And **King Nebuchadnezzar**, your **father**, your **father** the **king**, **appointed him chief** of the **magicians**, **conjurers**, **Chaldeans and diviners**.

¹² This was because an **extraordinary spirit**, **knowledge** and **insight**, **interpretation** of **dreams**, **explanation** of **enigmas** and **solving** of **difficult problems** were **found** in this **Daniel**, whom the **king** named **Belteshazzar**.

Let **Daniel** now **be summoned** and **he** will **declare** the **interpretation**."

13 Then **Daniel** was **brought in** before the **king**.

The **king** spoke and said to **Daniel**,

"Are you that **Daniel** who is one of the *exiles* from **Judah**,

whom **my father** the **king** *brought* from **Judah**?

¹⁴ Now I have heard about **you** that a **spirit** of the **gods** is **in you**, and that *illumination*, *insight* and **extraordinary** *wisdom* have been found **in you**.

¹⁵ Just now the **wise men** *and* the **conjurers** were brought in before me... but they **could not** declare the **interpretation** of the **message...**

Now if you are **able** to read the **inscription** and make its **interpretation known to me**, you will be clothed with **purple** and **wear** a necklace of **gold** around your neck, and you will have **authority** as the **third ruler** in the **kingdom**."

E. The *Denouncement* of the <u>King</u> (5:17-24)

¹⁷ Then **Daniel** answered and said before the **king**,
"**Keep your gifts** for yourself or **give your rewards** to someone else; however, **I will** read the **inscription** to the **king** and make the **interpretation** <u>known</u> to **him**.

¹⁸O king, the Most High God <u>granted</u> sovereignty, grandeur, glory and majesty to Nebuchadnezzar your father.

¹⁹ **Because** of the **grandeur** which <u>He</u> bestowed on him, all the peoples, nations and *men* of every language feared and trembled before him;...

²⁰ But when his heart was *lifted up* and his spirit became so proud that he behaved arrogantly, he was deposed from his royal throne and his glory was taken away from him.

²¹ He was also driven away from mankind, and his heart was made like that of beasts, and his dwelling place was with the wild donkeys. He was given grass to eat like cattle, and his body was drenched with the dew of heaven

until **he** *recognized* that the **Most High God** is <u>ruler</u> over the <u>realm</u> of <u>mankind</u> and *that* **He sets over it** whomever **He wishes**.

²² Yet <u>you</u>, his son, Belshazzar, have <u>not</u> humbled your heart, even though you *knew* all this, ²³ but you have exalted yourself <u>against</u> the Lord of heaven; and they have brought the <u>vessels</u> of <u>His house</u> before you, and you and your nobles, your wives and your concubines have been drinking wine from <u>them</u>;

and <u>you</u> have *praised* the **gods of silver** and **gold**, of **bronze**, **iron**, **wood** and **stone**, which do **not see**, *hear* or *understand*.

But the **God** in whose **hand** are **your life-breath** and all **your ways**, you have **not glorified**. ²⁴ Then the **hand** was **sent from Him** and this **inscription** was **written out**.

F. The *Dire* Interpretation (5:25-29)

²⁵ "Now this is the **inscription** that was **written out**: 'MENĒ, MENĒ, TEKĒL, UPHARSIN.' ²⁶ This is the **interpretation** of the **message**:

'MENĒ'—God has <u>numbered</u> your kingdom and put an *end* to it.

27 'TEKĒL'—you have been <u>weighed</u> on the scales and found *deficient*.

28 'PERĒS'—your kingdom has been <u>divided</u> and <u>given over</u> to the Medes and Persians."

²⁹ Then **Belshazzar** gave **orders**, and they **clothed Daniel** with **purple** and *put* a necklace of **gold** around his neck, and issued a **proclamation** concerning him that he *now* had *authority* as the **third** *ruler* in the **kingdom**.

G. The *Demise* of the **Kingdom** (5:30-31)

³⁰ That **same night Belshazzar** the **Chaldean king** was <u>slain</u>.

³¹ So **Darius the Mede** received the **kingdom** at about the age of **sixty-two**.

<u>Discussion</u>—<u>When</u> do we know as a **Nation**, if the "*Handwriting* is on the **Wall**?"

1. When, like *Babylon*, *we* have a **culture characterized** by increasing **decadence**, and when *we* as a **nation** begin to **desecrate God's "holy vessels,"** and **things of God**.

Belshazzar the king held a great feast for a thousand of his nobles, and he was drinking wine in the presence of the thousand.

When Belshazzar tasted the wine, he gave orders...

Then they brought the gold vessels that had been taken out of the temple, the house of God which was in Jerusalem; and the king and his nobles, his wives and his concubines drank from them. (5:1-2a, 3)

The **earth** is also **polluted** by its **inhabitants**, for they **transgressed laws**,

violated statutes, broke the everlasting covenant.

Therefore, a curse devours the earth, and those who live in it are held guilty.

Therefore, the inhabitants of the earth are burned,
and few men are left. (Isaiah 24:5-6)

2. When, like *Babylon*, we begin to embrace <u>idolatry</u> in all its <u>forms</u> and <u>practices</u>—the "handwriting may be on the wall."

They drank the wine and praised the <u>gods</u> of gold and silver, of bronze, iron, wood and stone. (5:4)

For the <u>wrath</u> of God is *revealed* from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,...

Professing to be **wise**, they became **fools**, and exchanged the **glory** of the **incorruptible God** for an **image**...

and worshipped and served the <u>creature</u> rather than the **Creator**, who is **blessed forever**...(Romans 1:18, 22-23a, 25b)

3. When, like *Babylon*, we <u>exalt</u> ourselves against the **Lord of heaven**, the "handwriting may be on the wall."

...but you (Belshazzar) have <u>exalted yourself</u> against the Lord of heaven;.. and you have praised the gods of silver and gold,.. which do not see, hear or understand.

But the **God** in whose hand are *your* life-breath and *your* ways, you have not glorified. (5:23)

4. When, like the *king of Babylon*, our **leaders** and "wise men" do not **learn** from **God's** *past* <u>judgments</u> upon sin—the "handwriting may be on the wall."

He (Nebuchadnezzar your father) was also driven away from mankind, and his heart was made like that of beasts, and his dwelling place was with the wild donkeys... until he recognized that the Most High God is ruler over the realm of mankind and that he sets over it whomever He wishes."

"Yet you, his son, Belshazzar, have <u>not</u> humbled your heart, even though <u>you knew</u> all this, but you have <u>exalted</u> yourself over the Lord of heaven; (5:21-22)
