## The Book of Daniel God's Prophet and Statesman

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## VI. **Daniel's** *Trial* in the <u>Lion's Den</u> (6:1-28)

## A. The **Prominence** of **Daniel** (6:1-3)

6 It seemed good to Darius to appoint 120 satraps over the kingdom, that they would be in charge of the whole kingdom, <sup>2</sup> and over them three commissioners (of whom Daniel was one), that these satraps might be accountable to them, and that the king might not suffer loss.

<sup>3</sup> Then this **Daniel** began *distinguishing* himself among the **commissioners** and **satraps** because he possessed an *extraordinary spirit*, and the **king** planned to <u>appoint him over</u> the entire kingdom.

## B. The *Plot* against **Daniel** (6:4-9)

<sup>4</sup> Then the **commissioners** and **satraps** began trying to find a ground of <u>accusation</u> against Daniel in regard to government affairs; but they could find <u>no</u> ground of accusation or evidence of corruption, inasmuch as he was faithful, and <u>no</u> negligence or corruption was to be found in him.

<sup>5</sup> Then these men said, "We will <u>not</u> find any ground of **accusation against** this **Daniel** unless we find *it* **against him** with regard to the <u>law</u> of his God."

<sup>6</sup> Then these **commissioners** and **satraps** came by **agreement** to the **king** and spoke to him as follows: "**King Darius**, live forever!

<sup>7</sup> All the commissioners of the kingdom, the prefects and the satraps, the high officials and the governors have consulted together that the king should establish a statute and enforce an injunction that anyone who makes a petition to any god or man besides you, O king, for thirty days, shall be cast into the lions' den.

<sup>8</sup> Now, O king, establish the injunction and sign the <u>document</u> so that it may not be changed, according to the <u>law</u> of the <u>Medes</u> and <u>Persians</u>, which may <u>not</u> be revoked." <sup>9</sup> Therefore King Darius signed the <u>document</u>, that is, the <u>injunction</u>.

## C. The *Piety* of **Daniel** (6:10-11)

Now when **Daniel** knew that the **document** was signed, he entered his **house** (now in his roof chamber he had windows open toward **Jerusalem**); and **he** <u>continued</u> kneeling on his knees **three times** a day, praying and giving thanks before his **God**, as he had been doing previously.

<sup>11</sup> Then these **men** came by **agreement** and found **Daniel** making **petition** and **supplication** before **his God**.

### D. The *Prosecution* of <u>Daniel</u> (6:12-17)

<sup>12</sup> Then they approached and **spoke** before the **king** about the **king's injunction**, "Did you not sign an **injunction** that **any man** who makes a **petition** to **any god** or **man besides** <u>you</u>, **O king**, for **thirty days**, is to be **cast** into the **lions' den?**" The **king** replied,

"The statement is **true**, according to the **law** of the **Medes** and **Persians**, which may **not** be **revoked**."

<sup>13</sup> Then they answered and spoke before the king,
"Daniel, who is one of the exiles from Judah, pays no attention to you,
O king, or to the injunction which you signed,
but keeps making his petition three times a day."

<sup>14</sup> Then, as soon as the king heard this statement, he was *deeply distressed* and set *his* mind on *delivering* Daniel; and even until sunset he kept exerting himself to rescue him.

<sup>15</sup> Then these men came by agreement to the king and said to the king, "Recognize, O king, that it is a <u>law</u> of the Medes and Persians that no injunction or statute which the king establishes may be changed."

Then the king gave orders, and Daniel was brought in and <u>cast</u> into the <u>lions' den</u>.
 The king spoke and said to Daniel,
 "Your God whom you constantly serve will Himself <u>deliver</u> you."

<sup>7</sup> A **stone** was brought and laid over the **mouth** of the **den**; and the **king sealed it** with his own signet **ring** and with the signet **rings** of his **nobles**, so that **nothing** would be **changed** in regard to **Daniel**.

## E. The *Preservation* of $\underline{\mathbf{Daniel}}$ (6:18-24)

<sup>18</sup>Then the **king** went off to his palace and spent the night **fasting**, and **no entertainment** was brought before him; and **his sleep fled** from him.

Then the king arose at dawn, at the break of day, and went in haste to the lions' den.
 When he had come near the den to Daniel, he cried out with a troubled voice. The king spoke and said to Daniel,

"Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God, whom you constantly serve, been able to deliver you from the lions?"

21 Then Daniel spoke to the king, "O king, live forever!

My God sent His angel and shut the lions' mouths and they have not harmed me, inasmuch as I was found innocent before Him; and also toward you, O king, I have committed no crime."

<sup>23</sup> Then the king was very pleased and gave orders for Daniel to be taken up out of the den. So Daniel was taken up out of the den and no injury whatever was found on him, because he had trusted in his God.

<sup>24</sup> The king then gave orders, and they brought those men who had maliciously accused Daniel, and they cast them, their children and their wives into the lions' den; and they had not reached the bottom of the den before the lions overpowered them and crushed all their bones.

#### F. The *Proclamation* of the **King** (6:25-28)

25 Then Darius the king wrote to all the peoples, nations and men of every language who were living in all the land: "May your peace abound!
26 I make a decree that in all the dominion of my kingdom men are to fear and tremble before the God of Daniel;

For **He** is the **living God** and enduring **forever**,

And **His kingdom** is one which will **not be destroyed**,

And **His dominion** will be **forever**.

27 "He <u>delivers</u> and <u>rescues</u> and performs <u>signs</u> and <u>wonders</u>
 In <u>heaven</u> and on <u>earth</u>,
 Who has also <u>delivered Daniel</u> from the *power* of the lions."

 28 So this <u>Daniel</u> enjoyed <u>success</u> in the reign of <u>Darius</u>
 and in the <u>reign</u> of <u>Cyrus the Persian</u>.

# Chapter Summary "No Nosh for the Lions Today,"— God Reflecting on the Character of Daniel

## A. Daniel Had an Impeccable Testimony

Then the **commissioners** and **satraps** began trying to find a **ground** of **accusation against Daniel...** 

but they could find <u>no</u> ground of accusation or evidence of corruption, inasmuch as he was faithful, and no negligence or corruption was to be found in him. (6:4)

## B. Daniel Had an Immovable Faith

Now when **Daniel knew** that the document was **signed**, he entered his house...; and he **continued kneeling** on his knees **three times** a day, **praying** and **giving thanks** before **his God**, as he had been doing **previously**...

The **king** spoke and said to **Daniel**, "**Your God** whom you **constantly serve** will **Himself deliver you**."...(6:10, 16b)

## C. Daniel Had an Incredible God

Then **Daniel** spoke to the **king**,..**My** <u>God</u> sent *His* angel and **shut the lions' mouths** and they have **not harmed me**,.. (6:21-22)

Then **Darius** the **king** <u>wrote</u> to all the **peoples**, **nations** and *men of* **every language** who were living in all the land:...

I make a *decree* that in **all** the **dominion** of **my kingdom** men are to <u>fear</u> and <u>tremble</u> before the <u>God</u> of **Daniel**;

For **He** is the *living* **God** and enduring <u>forever</u>,
And *His kingdom* is one which will <u>not</u> be destroyed,
And *His dominion* will be <u>forever</u>.

He **delivers** and **rescues** and **performs signs** and **wonders** in **heaven** and on **earth**, who has **also delivered Daniel** from the **power of the lions**."(6:25, 26-27)

## Personal Application The world is a "lion's den." How do we avoid getting devoured?

1. By Remaining sober and alert to the Adversary

Be of <u>sober</u> spirit, be on the <u>alert</u>. Your adversary, the <u>devil</u>, prowls around like a roaring <u>lion</u>, seeking someone to <u>devour</u>. (I Peter 5:8)

2. By *Resisting* in the **strength** of the **Armor of God** 

Finally, **be strong in the Lord** and in the **strength** of **His might**. Put on the **full armor of God**, so that you will be able to **stand firm** against the **schemes** of the **devil**...

Therefore, take up the <u>full armor of God</u>, so that you will be able to **resist** in the **evil day**, and having done everything, to **stand firm**...

#### HAVING GIRDED YOUR LOINS WITH TRUTH

#### HAVING PUT ON THE **BREASTPLATE** OF **RIGHTEOUSNESS**

having shod YOUR **FEET** WITH THE **PREPARATION** OF THE **GOSPEL OF PEACE**;...

taking up the shield of faith...

#### and take THE HELMET OF SALVATION

and the **sword** of the **Spirit**,..the **word of God.** 

With all <u>prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u> pray at all times in the Spirit,... be on the *alert* with all <u>perseverance</u> and <u>petition</u> for all the saints,... (Ephesians 6:10-18)

## 3. By *Resting* faithfully in the power and deliverance of God

At my first **defense no one** supported me (Paul), but all **deserted** me; may it **not** be counted **against them**.

But the Lord <u>stood with me</u> and <u>strengthened me</u>, so that *through me* the proclamation might be fully accomplished, and that all the Gentiles might *hear*; and I was <u>rescued out of the lion's mouth</u>.

The Lord will <u>rescue me</u> from every **evil deed**, and will bring me **safely** to **His heavenly kingdom**; to **Him** be the **glory** forever and ever. Amen. (II Timothy 4:16-18)

## 4. By *Restraining* the "devouring" power of the <u>Tongue</u>

For the **whole Law** is *fulfilled* in one word, in the *statement*, "YOU SHALL **LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR** AS YOURSELF."

But if you <u>bite</u> and <u>devour</u> one another, take care that you are not *consumed* by one another. (Galatians 5:14-15, also James 3)
