Embracing a **Shavuot** *Vision* **Renewing** our *Focus* as **Laborers** in **God's** <u>Harvest</u>

A. By *Personally* committing ourselves to *diligent* <u>labor</u> in the ongoing "spiritual" <u>harvest</u> that began on the Feast of <u>Shavuot</u> almost 2,000 years ago

Then **He (Jesus**) said to **His disciples**, "The <u>harvest</u> truly *is* **plentiful**, but the *laborers* are **few**.

Therefore *pray* the Lord of the <u>harvest</u> to send out *laborers* into His <u>harvest</u>." (Matthew 9:37-38)

So when **they (His disciples**) had come together, they were asking **Him (Jesus**), saying, **"Lord**, is it at *this time* You are restoring the <u>kingdom</u> to Israel?"

He said to them, "It is *not* for you to know times or epochs which the Father has fixed by His own authority;

but you will receive *power* when the *Holy Spirit* has come upon you; and you shall be <u>My witnesses</u> both in *Jerusalem*, and in all *Judea* and *Samaria*, and even to the *remotest part* of the *earth*." (Acts 1:6-8)

When the day of <u>Shavuot</u> had come, they were all together in one place ...

...Peter, standing with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: Fellow Judeans and all who are staying in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and pay attention to my words...

"...let the **whole house of Israel** know for *certain* that **God** has **made Him**—this <u>Yeshua</u> whom you had *crucified* both Lord and Messiah!"

So *those* who <u>received</u> his message were immersed, and that day about three thousand <u>souls</u> ("firstfruits") were *added*. (Acts 2:1, 14, 36, 41)

For **we** are **God's fellow workers**; **you** are <u>God's field</u>, God's *building*. (I Corinthians 3:9)

B. By *"Planting"* faithfully the "seed" of the <u>word of God</u> by the <u>preaching</u> of the gospel, and the <u>teaching</u> of the word

"Now the **parable** is this: the <u>seed</u> is the <u>word of God</u>." (Matthew 8:11)

....for **you** have been **born again**

not of **<u>seed</u>** which is **perishable** but **imperishable**, that is, through the **living** and **enduring** <u>word of God</u>. (I Peter 1:23)

How then will they <u>call</u> on Him in whom they have not believed?
How will they <u>believe</u> in Him whom they have not heard?
And how will they <u>hear</u> without a <u>preacher</u>?

 How will they <u>preach</u> unless they are *sent*? Just as it is written,
 "How BEAUTIFUL ARE THE FEET OF THOSE WHO BRING <u>GOOD NEWS</u> OF GOOD THINGS". (Romans 10:14-15)

What then is **Apollos**? And what is **Paul**? <u>Servants</u> *through* **whom you** <u>believed</u>, even as the Lord gave *opportunity* to each one.

l <u>planted</u>, Apollos <u>watered</u>, but God was causing the <u>growth</u>. (I Corinthians 3:5-6)

C. By *Participating* in the ongoing "commission" of making <u>disciples</u> of Messiah, and *establishing* them in the faith. As *new* believers *grow* and *mature*, they become "co-laborers" in the <u>harvest</u>—the "sowing" of the word of God, and the "reaping" of "fruit for life eternal." (John 4:36)

And Jesus came up and spoke to them (His disciples), saying,...

"Go therefore and make <u>disciples</u> of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)

And **He gave some** (*gifted* people) as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers,

for the <u>equipping</u> of the saints for the <u>work of service</u>, to the *building up* of the body of Messiah;

until we all attain to the **unity** of the **faith**, and of the **knowledge** of the **Son of God**, to a <u>mature man</u>, to the **measure** of the **stature** which belongs to the **fullness of** *Messiah*. (Ephesians 4:11-13) The **things** which you have **heard from me** in the presence of many witnesses, <u>entrust</u> these to <u>faithful men</u> who will be **able** to <u>teach others</u> also. (II Timothy 2:2) D. By *Praying* fervently for an **outpouring** of **God's** <u>Spirit</u>, and for a great "spiritual" revival and <u>harvest</u> among *both* Jews and Gentiles

Therefore <u>pray</u> the Lord of the *harvest* to **send out laborers** into *His harvest."* (Matthew 9:37-38)

Then **he** (the angel) said to me,... "This is the **word of the LORD** to **Zerubbabe**l saying, '*Not* by **might** nor by **power**, but by <u>My Spirit</u>,' says the LORD of hosts. (Zachariah 4:6)

...you will receive <u>power</u> when the <u>Holy Spirit</u> has come upon you; and you shall be <u>My witnesses</u> both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the **remotest part** of the **earth**." (Acts 1:8)

Be devoted to one another in brotherly love;.. rejoicing in hope, persevering in tribulation, devoted to prayer, (Romans 12:10a, 12)

"It will come about after this (end times)

that I will pour out My Spirit on all mankind;...

and your sons and daughters will **prophesy**, your old men will **dream dreams**, your young men will **see visions**...

And it will come about that **whoever** <u>calls</u> on the **name of the LORD** will be <u>delivered</u>;" (Joel 2:28, 32a)

E. By *Patiently* and **faithfully** <u>laboring</u>, even when times are **difficult**, and the **harvest** is **"scarce"**

Let us *not* lose heart in doing good, for in due time we <u>will reap</u> if we do not grow *weary*. (Galatians 6:9)

Therefore be *patient*, brethren, until the coming of the Lord.

The **farmer** waits for the **precious produce** of the **soil**, being **patient** about it, until it gets the **early** and **late rains**.

You too be *patient,* strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is <u>near</u>. (James 5:7-8)

Communion
