### The <u>Feasts</u> of Israel... God's Prophetic <u>Timeline</u>

- A. The Feast of Passover (Exodus 12:1-20) (Leviticus 23:4-5)
  - 1. <u>Date</u> of Feast— The evening of 14<sup>th</sup> of Nisan (March/April) (Lev. 23:5)

#### 2. Key Rituals—

- a. The selecting and "keeping" of the Passover lamb from the  $10^{th}$  till the  $14^{th}$  of Nisan (Ex. 12:3-6)
- b. The <u>killing</u> of the **Passover lamb**, its <u>blood</u> spread upon the **doorposts** on the Hebrews' homes, **protecting** them from the **plague of death** (Ex. 12:12:5-7, 13)
- c. The <u>Seder Feast</u> the Passover lamb, unleavened bread, bitter herbs (Ex. 12:8-11) (Matt. 26:17, Mark 14:13-14, Luke 22:11)

#### 3. **<u>Prophetic Timeline Events</u>**→

 a. The selecting and "keeping" of the Passover lamb → *Points* to the 'Triumphal entry"—The <u>Presentation</u> of the Messianic King—taking place <u>5 days</u> before Passover, beginning on 10<sup>th</sup> of Nisan (John 12:1, 12-15)

Jesus, therefore, <u>six days</u> before the <u>Passover</u>, came to Bethany where Lazarus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead...

On the <u>next day</u> the **large crowd** who had come to the feast, when they heard that **Jesus** was **coming** to **Jerusalem**, took the **branches** of the palm trees and went out to **meet Him**, and *began* to shout, "**Hosanna! BLESSED IS HE** WHO **COMES** IN THE NAME OF **THE LORD**, even the <u>King</u> of Israel."

Jesus, finding a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written, "FEAR NOT, DAUGHTER OF ZION; BEHOLD, YOUR <u>KING</u> IS COMING, SEATED ON A DONKEY'S COLT." (John 12:1, 12-15) (Zech. 9:9)

b. The <u>killing</u> of the **Passover lamb**→ *Points* to the <u>Crucifixion</u>, the sacrificial <u>death</u> of the <u>Lamb of God</u> (John 1:29, 36, Isa. 53:7, I Pet. 1:18-19, Rev. 5:6)

"Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29)

Clean out the old leaven... For <u>Messiah our Passover</u> also has been **sacrificed.** (I Corinthians 5:7)

#### B. The Feast of <u>Unleavened Bread</u> (Nisan 15-21) (Leviticus 23:6-8)

 <u>Date</u> of Feast—From the 15<sup>th</sup> to the 21<sup>st</sup> of Nisan (April) (Exodus 12:15, 18) Both the first day (15<sup>th</sup>) and the seventh day (21<sup>st</sup>) would be <u>Sabbath</u> (rest) days. (Lev. 23:7-8) 2. Key Ritual

The **removal of <u>leaven</u>** (symbolic of **evil**) from **all homes**, and the **eating** of *only* <u>unleavened</u> bread for **7 days** (Nisan 15-21) (Ex. 12: 19-20)

3. <u>Prophetic Timeline Event</u> → *Points* to the **removal of** <u>sin</u>, and the <u>consecration</u> of the **people** 

<u>Clean out</u> the old <u>leaven</u> so that you may be a new lump, just as you are *in fact* <u>unleavened</u>. For Messiah our Passover also has been <u>sacrificed</u>.

Therefore let <u>us</u> celebrate the feast, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of *malice* and *wickedness*, but with the <u>unleavened bread</u> of *sincerity* and *truth*. (I Corinthians 5:7)

C. The Feast of Firstfruits (Leviticus 23:9-14)

- 1. <u>Date</u> of Feast—"on the day <u>after</u> the <u>Sabbath</u>" (Lev. 23:11)—2 views
  - → either the day after the Sabbath (Sunday) of Passover week (Nisan 15-21)
    → or the day after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Passover week (the 15<sup>th</sup>, also a Sabbath) making Firstfruits—The <u>16<sup>th</sup> of Nisan</u> (this is the view of most of Judaism)
- 2. Key Ritual

The *waving* of a <u>sheaf</u> from the *barley* harvest as a <u>firstfruits</u> offering before the Lord. The grain from this offering is ground into fine flour and mixed with oil. The Lord's acceptance of the <u>firstfruits</u> offering brought about the consecration and acceptance of the <u>rest</u> of the harvest. (Lev. 23:14)

3. <u>**Prophetic Timeline Event**</u>  $\rightarrow$  *Points* to the <u>**Resurrection**</u> of the <u>**Messiah**</u>

But now **Messiah** has been *raised* from the dead, the <u>firstfruits</u> of those who are asleep. (I Corinthians 15:20)

- D. The Feast of Weeks (Shavuot weeks) (Leviticus 23:15-22)
  - 1. <u>Date</u> of Feast—From the day of the Feast of Firstfruits ((Nisan 16), Israel would begin a <u>50 day count</u> (7 *weeks* plus a *day*) called "counting of the <u>Omer</u>."

The <u>50<sup>th</sup> day</u> of this count is the <u>6<sup>th</sup> of Sivan</u> (June), and is *another* <u>firstfruits</u> offering—the <u>firstfruits</u> of the <u>wheat</u> harvest. (Lev. 23:15-17, 20)

- 2. Key Rituals and Traditions
  - a. The **waving** of <u>2 *leavened* loaves</u> of **fine flour** before **the Lord** as a **firstfruits offering** of the <u>wheat</u> harvest (Lev.23:17, 20). Along with the **firstfruits** offering there were various other **offerings.** (Lev. 23:18-20)

- b. Shavuot would be a Sabbath, a day of rest, and when they reaped the harvest, they would <u>not reap</u> to the very *corners* of their field nor gather gleanings, but leave them for the needy and alien. (Lev. 23:21-22)
- 3. <u>Prophetic Timeline Event</u> → *Points* to the coming of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>, and the "spiritual" firstfruits harvest of 3,000 Jewish believers (Acts 2:41)

When the **day of Pentecost** (<u>Shavuot-Weeks</u>) had come, they (the **disciples**) were all **together** in one place...

And they were all filled with the <u>Holy Spirit</u> and began to **speak** with other tongues, as the <u>Spirit</u> was giving them utterance...

But Peter,..raised his voice and declared (the gospel) to them...

So then, **those** who had **received** his **(Peter's) word** were **baptized**; and **that day** there were added about <u>three thousand souls</u>. (Acts 2:1, 4, 14a, 41) (James 1:18)

# E. The Summer "Harvest"—The "Interval" between the Feast of Weeks and the Feast of Trumpets

- 1. <u>Date</u>—Began with the coming of the Holy Spirit during Shavuot (Feast of Weeks) and is *continuing* at this <u>present</u> time (Acts 1:6-8)
- <u>Key Purpose</u>—The gathering of a "spiritual" <u>harvest</u> of "*fruit* for life eternal" (John 4:35-36) (Acts 13:48). The calling of both Jews and Gentiles into "one body" of believers (the Church)—a "*mystery*" now revealed (Eph. 3:1-11) (Matt. 16:18) (Col. 1:18) (Eph. 1:22-23)
- 3. <u>Prophetic Timeline Event</u> → The "postponement" of the establishment of Israel's Kingdom, and the proclamation of the gospel of the Messiah—the "great commission" (Matt. 28:19-20) (Rom. 11:25)

So when they (the **disciples**) had come together, they were asking **Him (Jesus)**, saying, "Lord, is it at <u>this time</u> You are **restoring** the <u>kingdom</u> to Israel?"

He said to them, "It is not for you to know *times* and *epochs* which the Father has fixed by His own authority; but you... shall be My <u>witnesses</u>...even to the remotest part of the earth."(Acts 1:6-8)

#### F. The **Feast of Trumpets** (Leviticus 23:23-25)

- 1. <u>Date</u> of Feast—The 1<sup>st</sup> day of the seventh month— Tishrei (September) (Lev. 23:24)
- 2. <u>Key Rituals</u>— On this feast day Israel was to have a Sabbath (rest), a holy assembly—a gathering together *before* the Lord, and a "reminder" by the <u>blowing of trumpets</u>.

## 3. <u>Prophetic Timeline Event</u> → *Points* to Israel's <u>Regathering</u> back to their <u>Land</u>

And **He (Messiah)** will send forth **His angels** with A <u>GREAT TRUMPET</u> and THEY WILL <u>GATHER TOGETHER</u> **His elect** from the **four winds**, from one end of the sky to the other. (Matthew 24:31) (Isa. 27:12-13) (Deut.30:1a, 3)

**Note**  $\rightarrow$  Many believe that it will be during the **Feast of Trumpets** that **believers**, both *asleep* and <u>living</u>, will hear the "trumpet of God," and be "<u>caught up</u>" (raptured) to meet the Lord in the <u>air</u> during <u>His return</u> (I Thess. 4:16-17)

- G. The Day of <u>Atonement</u> (Leviticus 23:26-32)
  - 1. <u>Date</u>—The 10<sup>th</sup> day of the seventh month—Tishrei (September)
  - Key Rituals—A Sabbath (rest) day, a day for holy assembly, a day of humbling (fasting)—the day commanded for Israel to make <u>atonement</u> (receive "covering") for their <u>sins</u>, both *nationally* and *individually* (Lev. 23:27-28)
  - 3. <u>Prophetic Timeline Event</u> → *Points* to Israel's day of national <u>repentance</u> and <u>cleansing</u> from sin when the Lord returns (Zech. 12:10, 13:1)

"I will *pour out* on the **house of David** and on the inhabitants of **Jerusalem**, the **Spirit** of *grace* and of *supplication*, so that they will **look on** <u>Me</u> whom they <u>pierced</u>, and they will <u>mourn for Him</u>, as one **mourns** for an **only son**, and they will **weep bitterly** over **Him**..."

> In *that day* a fountain will be opened for the house of David and for the inhabitants of Jerusalem, for <u>sin</u> and for <u>impurity</u>. (Zechariah 12:10, 13:1)

- Note → As believers, we have received an <u>eternal atonement</u> and <u>cleansing</u> for our sins through the priestly work, and atoning sacrifice of Jesus our Messiah. (Hebrews 10:10-14, 9:24-28)
- H. The Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot booths) (Leviticus 23:33-44)
  - 1. Date of Feast—From the 15<sup>th</sup> to the 22<sup>nd</sup> of Tishrei (Sept./Oct.)
  - <u>Key Rituals</u>— The 15<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> days are Sabbaths (rests), a feast lasting 8 days that celebrates the final "ingathering" of the fall harvest of crops
    - a. The *waving* of the <u>lulav</u> and the <u>etrog</u>, and <u>rejoicing</u> before the Lord (Lev. 23:40)
    - b. The **building** of "<u>sukkahs</u>" (booths) to live in for 7 days (Lev.23:42-43)
  - 3. <u>Prophetic Timeline Event</u> → *Points* to Israel's final "Ingathering" and <u>Restoration</u>—The establishment of Israel's promised <u>Kingdom</u>

And the LORD will be **king** over all the earth; in *that day* the LORD will be *the only* **one**, and **His name** *the only* **one**...

Then it will come about that any who are left of all the nations that went against **Jerusalem** will go up from year to year to **worship the King**, the **LORD of hosts**, and to **celebrate** the <u>Feast of Booths</u>. (Zechariah 14:9, 16)
