B. The **Judgment** of the **<u>King</u> of Babylon** (14:1-23)

1. The *Divine Restoration* of <u>Israel</u> (14:1-2)

14 When the LORD will have compassion on *Jacob* and again choose <u>Israel</u>, and settle them in their <u>own land</u>, then strangers will *join* them and *attach* themselves to the house of *Jacob*.

² The peoples will take them along and bring them to their place, and the house of <u>Israel</u> will *possess them* as an inheritance in the <u>land</u> of the LORD as male *servants* and female *servants*; and they will take their captors captive and will *rule over* their oppressors.

- 2. The *Derisive* "Taunt" against the King of Babylon (14:3-11)
 - a. His Oppressive power "broken" (14:3-8)
 - b. His Opulent position eradicated (14:9-11)

³ And it will be in the day when the LORD gives you (Israel) rest from your pain and turmoil and harsh service in which you have been enslaved,
 ⁴ that you will take up this taunt against the king of Babylon, and say,

"How the **oppressor** has **ceased**, And how **fury** has **ceased**!

 ⁵ "The LORD has <u>broken</u> the <u>staff</u> of the wicked, the scepter of rulers ⁶ which used to strike the peoples in fury with unceasing strokes, which subdued the nations in anger with unrestrained persecution.

 ⁷ "The whole earth is at rest and is quiet; they break forth into shouts of joy.
 ⁸ "Even the cypress trees rejoice over you, and the cedars of Lebanon, saying,
 Since you were laid low, no tree cutter comes up against us."

⁹ "<u>Sheol</u> from beneath is excited over you to *meet you* when you come; It *arouses* for you the spirits of the dead, all the *leaders* of the earth; It raises all the *kings* of the nations from their thrones.

"They will all respond and say to you,
 'Even you have been made weak as we,
 You have become like us.

¹¹ 'Your pomp and the music of your harps have been brought down to <u>Sheol</u>; Maggots are spread out as your bed beneath you and worms are your covering.'

3. The *Downfall* of <u>Satan</u> (14:12-15)

¹² "How you have <u>fallen</u> from <u>heaven</u>, O star of the morning, son of the dawn!

You have been <u>cut down</u> to the <u>earth</u>, You who have *weakened* the nations!

¹³ "But you said in your heart,
'*I will ascend* to heaven; *I will raise* my throne *above* the stars of God, and *I will* sit on the mount of *assembly* in the recesses of the *north*.

¹⁴ 'I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will make myself <u>like</u> the <u>Most High</u>.'

¹⁵ "Nevertheless you will be <u>thrust down</u> to <u>Sheol</u>, to the recesses of the pit.

4. The *Dishonoring* <u>death</u> of the King (14:16-20) ¹⁶ "Those who see you will gaze at you, They will **ponder** over you, *saying*, 'Is this the man who made the earth tremble, who shook kingdoms,

¹⁷ Who made the **world** like a **wilderness** and **overthrew** its cities, Who did **not allow** his **prisoners** to **go home**?'

¹⁸ "All the kings of the nations lie in glory, each in his own tomb.

 ¹⁹ "But you have been <u>cast out</u> of your tomb like a rejected branch,
 Clothed with the slain who are pierced with a sword, Who go down to the stones of the pit like a *trampled corpse*.

5. The *Demise* of the King's <u>Posterity</u> (14:20-23)

²⁰ "You will <u>not</u> be *united* with them in *burial,* Because you have *ruined* your country,
 You have *slain* your people.
 May the <u>offspring</u> of evildoers <u>not</u> be mentioned forever.

²¹ "Prepare for his sons a place of <u>slaughter</u> Because of the iniquity of their fathers.
They must not arise and take possession of the earth and fill the face of the world with cities."

²² "I will rise up <u>against</u> them," declares the LORD of hosts," and will <u>cut off</u> from Babylon name and survivors, offspring and <u>posterity</u>," declares the LORD.

²³ "I will also make it a possession for the hedgehog and swamps of water, and I will sweep it with the broom of destruction," declares the LORD of hosts.

Message Summary and Key Observations

- A. Having declared devastating judgments against Babylon in the last chapter (13), Isaiah begins the next chapter by reassuring *Israel* of her <u>survival</u> and <u>restoration</u> back to the land. *Israel* will outlast all of her conquerors, and receive "rest" from the "pain and turmoil" they had inflicted upon her. (14:1-3) The continued survival of the Jews, and their establishment in the land today, attests to the <u>faithfulness</u> of <u>God's promises</u> to those whom He has called.
- B. Tonight we read that *one day* the people of Israel will "<u>taunt</u>" the king of Babylon who had severely oppressed, subdued, and persecuted them, as well as other nations. For the LORD will *break* "the <u>staff</u> of the wicked," and the whole earth will "break forth into shouts of joy (14:4-7)." Our world today is filled with "kings" and leaders who use their power to <u>oppress</u> and <u>persecute</u> others, both believers and unbelievers. *One day*, maybe even soon, there will be a "day of reckoning," when the "<u>staff</u> "of the <u>wicked</u> will indeed be *broken* (14:5).

C. Isaiah describes how that, upon his death, the king of Babylon will be met with excitement by the inhabitants of <u>Sheol</u> (Hades). Upon his arrival, the *spirits* of previous leaders and kings will be "aroused" to meet the great king of Babylon. Sadly, however, the king is met with <u>derision</u> and <u>mockery</u>, for in <u>Sheol</u>, he is now "weak" like they now are, and the "pomp," music, and creature comforts afforded by his prior status as king of Babylon have now <u>vanished</u> (14:9-11).

The **key lesson** or **insight** that we can take from this is to realize that we *do not* **carry** with us to **eternal realms** the **same status** that we had in **this life**. Whatever "**greatness**" and **power** one had will be *useless* and *powerless* in <u>Sheol.</u>

- D. As Isaiah was describing the dramatic fall of the king of Babylon, his prophetic words seemed to be speaking of <u>one</u> who was of *greater* stature, who was the driving force behind the king. Many scholars believe these verses to be a reference to, and description of the <u>fall of Satan</u>→
 - → who has "<u>fallen</u> from heaven" (14:12a)
 - \rightarrow who is the "<u>star</u> of the morning" (14:12b)
 - → who has been "<u>cut down</u> to the earth (14:12c)
 - → who has "<u>weakened</u> the nations" (14:12d)
 - → who said he would "<u>ascend</u> to heaven" and raise his throne "<u>above</u> the stars of God (14:13a)
 - → who declared his intent to "<u>sit</u> on the mount of assembly" governing among the gods, "in the recesses of the <u>north</u>" (14:13b)
 - → who said he would "<u>ascend</u> above the heights of the clouds," and make himself "*like* the Most High" (14:14)
 - → who would be "thrust down to Sheol, to the recesses of the pit" (14:15)

The **seventy (followers)** returned with **joy**, saying, "Lord, even the **demons** are **subject to us** in **Your name**."

And **He (Jesus)** said to them, "I was watching <u>Satan fall</u> from heaven like lightning. (Luke 10:17-18)

Then the **fifth angel** sounded, and I saw a <u>star</u> from heaven which had <u>fallen</u> to the earth; and the **key** of the **bottomless pit** was **given to him**. (Revelation 9:1)

<u>Closing Exhortation</u> Avoiding the *Arrogance* of the **King**

Pride goes before <u>destruction</u>, And a <u>haughty spirit</u> before <u>stumbling</u>. (Proverbs 16:18)
