1. The *Prophecy* against **Aram** (Syria) (17:1-3)

17 The oracle concerning <u>Damascus</u>.

"Behold, **Damascus** is about to be *removed* from being **a city** and will become a *fallen ruin*.

² "The cities of Aroer are forsaken; they will be for flocks to lie down in, and there will be no one to frighten them.

³ "The **fortified city** will disappear from *Ephraim*, and *sovereignty* from **Damascus** and the **remnant of** <u>Aram</u>;

they will be like the *glory* of the sons of *Israel*," declares the **LORD** of hosts.

2. The *Purging* of Israel's <u>Population</u> (17:4-6)

⁴ Now *in that day* the *glory* of <u>Jacob</u> will fade, and the fatness of his flesh will become lean.

⁵ It will be even like the **reaper** gathering the **standing grain**, as his arm **harvests** the **ears**, or it will be like one **gleaning ears** of **grain** in the valley of **Rephaim**.

⁶ Yet *gleanings* will be left in it like the **shaking** of an **olive tree**, two or three olives on the topmost bough, four or five on the branches of a fruitful tree, declares the LORD, the God of Israel.

3. The *Picture* of a **Repentant Israel** (17:7-8)

⁷ In that day man will have <u>regard</u> for his Maker and his eyes will <u>look</u> to the Holy One of Israel.

⁸ He will <u>not</u> have **regard** for the **altars**, the **work** of **his hands**, **Nor** will he **look** to that which his **fingers** have **made**, even the **Asherim** and **incense stands**.

4. The *Perilous* condition of *sinful* <u>Israel</u> (17: 9-11)

⁹ In that day their strong cities will be like forsaken places in the forest, or like branches which they abandoned before the sons of Israel; and the land will be a desolation.

¹⁰ For you have <u>forgotten</u> the **God of your** *salvation* and have **not remembered** the **rock** of **your** *refuge*.

Therefore you **plant** *delightful* **plants** and set them with **vine slips** of a **<u>strange</u>** *god*.

¹¹ In the day that you **plant** *it* you carefully **fence** *it* **in**, and in the **morning** you bring **your seed** to *blossom*;

But the harvest will be a heap in a day of sickliness and incurable pain.

5. The *Portrait* of Assyria's Judgment (17:12-14)

¹² Alas, the *uproar* of many people who *roar* like the *roaring* of the seas, and the *rumbling* of <u>nations</u> who rush on like the *rumbling* of mighty waters!

¹³ The <u>nations rumble</u> on like the *rumbling* of many waters, But <u>He</u> will *rebuke them* and they will *flee* far away,

and be **chased** like **chaff** in the mountains before the wind, or like **whirling dust** before a gale.

¹⁴ At **evening time**, behold, *there is terror!* Before **morning** they are **no more**.

Such *will be* the **portion** of those who **plunder us** and the **lot** of those who **pillage us**.

Personal Application

So *what* Happened to the **Northern Kingdom** of **Israel** (Ephraim)? *What* led to their **Judgment by God**?

Some Likely **Reasons**:

1. *Israel* had **aligned** with, and allowed **themselves** to be *influenced* by **Aram** (**Syria**), and other **pagan** nations. (II Kings 17:7-19)

Now *this* came about because the **sons of Israel** had **sinned** against the **LORD their God...**

and **walked** in the **customs** of the **nations**whom **the LORD** had **driven out** before the **sons of Israel**,
and in the **customs** of the **kings of Israel** which they had introduced...

The sons of Israel did things secretly which were not right against the LORD their God...

They set for themselves **sacred** pillars and **Asherim** on every **high hill** and under every **green tree**,...

They **served** <u>idols</u>, concerning which **the Lord** had said to them, "You shall <u>not</u> do this thing." Yet **the Lord** warned Israel and Judah through all **His prophets** and every **seer**, saying,

"Turn from your evil ways and keep My commandments,
My statutes according to all the law which I commanded your fathers,
and which I sent to you through My servants the prophets."

(II Kings 17:7, 8, 9a, 10, 12-13)

- 2. *Israel* aligned itself with <u>Aram</u> (Syria), and <u>attacked Judah</u> (the **Southern Kingdom**), and the **house of <u>David</u>**. (7:1-9)
- 3. We read tonight that *Israel's* "fortified city" would disappear, and its "glory fade." (17:3a, 4a). When *Assyria* invaded <u>Israel</u> and <u>Aram</u> (Syria), they deported much of the populace except for a *very small* remnant (17:4-6).

In the **ninth year** of **Hoshea**, the **king of** Assyria **captured** Samaria and carried Israel away into <u>exile</u> to Assyria, and settled them in **Halah** and **Habor**, on the river of Gozan, and in the cities of the **Medes**. (II Kings 17:6)

- 4. We read tonight that *Israel* had **forgotten** the "**God** of their **salvation**," and the "**rock** of their **refuge** (17:10).
- 5. We read tonight *Israel's* joint "planting" together with the *strange* "vine" of Aram (Syria), would eventually reap a harvest of "ruin" in a day of sickness and deep sorrow (17:10-11).

Closing Comments

It seems as though *only* when **men** face **great difficulties**, **suffering**, and **ruin**, do they *then* <u>turn</u> from their "idols" and <u>look</u> to their <u>Maker</u>?

⁴ Now *in that day* the *glory* of Jacob will <u>fade</u>, and the **fatness** of his *flesh* will become <u>lean</u>...

⁷ In that day man will have regard for his Maker and his eyes will look to the Holy One of Israel.
