1. A *Descent* into Chaos (19:1-4)

19 The oracle concerning Egypt.

Behold, **the Lord** is riding on a **swift cloud** and is about to come to **Egypt**; The **idols of Egypt** will **tremble** at **His presence**, and the **heart** of the **Egyptians** will **melt** within them.

² "So *I will* <u>incite</u> <u>Egyptians</u> <u>against</u> <u>Egyptians</u>; and they will each fight <u>against</u> his brother and each <u>against</u> his neighbor, city <u>against</u> city <u>and</u> kingdom <u>against</u> kingdom.

³ "Then the spirit of the Egyptians will be <u>demoralized</u> within them; and *I will confound* their strategy, so that they will resort to idols and ghosts of the dead and to mediums and spiritists.

- ⁴ "Moreover, *I will deliver* the **Egyptians** into the **hand** of a <u>cruel master</u>, and a **mighty king** will *rule* over them," declares the **Lord GoD of hosts**.
 - 2. A *Destruction* of Egypt's <u>Natural Resources</u> (19:5-10)
- ⁵ The waters from the sea will dry up, and the river will be parched and dry.
 - ⁶ The *canals* will emit a stench, the *streams* of Egypt will *thin out* and *dry up*; the reeds and rushes will *rot away*.

⁷The <u>bulrushes</u> by the Nile, by the edge of the Nile and all the <u>sown fields</u> by the Nile will become *dry*, be <u>driven away</u>, and be <u>no more</u>.

⁸ And the **fishermen** will <u>lament</u>, and **all** those who **cast a line** into the **Nile** will <u>mourn</u>, and those who **spread nets** on the waters will **pine away**.

⁹ Moreover, the manufacturers of <u>linen</u> made from **combed flax** and the **weavers** of **white cloth** will be utterly **dejected**.

¹⁰ And the <u>pillars</u> of **Egypt** will be **crushed**;
All the **hired laborers** will be **grieved in soul**.

3. A *Delusional, Disoriented* Leadership (19:11-15)

¹¹ The <u>princes</u> of Zoan are mere fools; the advice of Pharaoh's <u>wisest advisers</u> has become stupid.

How can **you men** say to **Pharaoh**, "I am **a son** of the **wise**, **a son** of **ancient kings**"?

¹² Well then, **where** are your <u>wise men</u>? Please let **them** tell you, and let **them** understand what the **LORD** of hosts has *purposed* against Egypt.

¹³ The princes of Zoan have acted foolishly, The princes of Memphis are deluded;

Those who are the **cornerstone** of **her tribes** have led **Egypt astray**.

14 The LORD has mixed within her a spirit of distortion;
They have led Egypt astray in all that it does,
As a drunken man staggers in his vomit.

¹⁵ There will be <u>no work</u> for **Egypt** Which *its* **head** or **tail**, *its* **palm branch** or **bulrush**, **may do.**

4. A *Dreadful* Fear of <u>Israel</u> (19:16-17)

¹⁶ In *that day* the Egyptians will become like women, and they will *tremble* and be in *dread* because of the *waving* of the hand of the LORD of hosts, which He is going to *wave* over them.

¹⁷ The land of <u>Judah</u> will become a <u>terror</u> to Egypt; everyone to whom it is mentioned will be in *dread* of it, because of the <u>purpose</u> of the <u>LORD</u> of hosts which <u>He is purposing</u> against them.

5. A *Divine* Reawakening (19:18-22)

¹⁸ In that day five cities in the land of Egypt will be speaking the <u>language</u> of Canaan and swearing allegiance to the Lord of hosts; one will be called the City of Destruction.

¹⁹ In *that day* there will be an <u>altar</u> to the LORD in the midst of the land of Egypt, and a <u>pillar</u> to the LORD near its border.

²⁰ It will become a **sign** and a **witness** to **the LORD of hosts** in the land of **Egypt**; for they will **cry** to **the LORD** because of **oppressors** and **He** will send them a **Savior** and a **Champion**, and **He** will **deliver them**.

²¹ Thus **the Lord** will make **Himself known** to **Egypt**, and the **Egyptians** will **know the Lord** in **that day**.

They will even worship with sacrifice and offering, and will make a vow to the LORD and perform it.

²² The LORD will strike Egypt, striking but healing; so they will return to the LORD, and He will respond to them and will heal them.

6. A *Dramatic* Unity (19:23-25)

²³ In that day there will be a highway from Egypt to Assyria, and the Assyrians will come into Egypt and the Egyptians into Assyria, and the Egyptians will worship with the Assyrians.

²⁴ In that day <u>Israel</u> will be the third party with <u>Egypt</u> and <u>Assyria</u>, a blessing in the midst of the earth, ²⁵ whom the LORD of hosts has blessed, saying, "Blessed is Egypt My people, and Assyria the work of My hands, and Israel My inheritance."

The *Judgment* of **Egypt**—A **Summary**

A. Why was God judging Egypt?

- 1. *Judged* because of their <u>idolatry</u> (19:1)
- 2. **Judged** because of their **occult practices** (19:3)
- 3. *Judged* because of *foolish* and *unwise* <u>leadership</u> (19:11-14)

B. *How* was **Egypt judged**?

- 1. Their <u>idols</u> would "tremble" at the presence of the Lord, and the heart of the Egyptians would "melt within them" (19:1)
- 2. They would have **<u>civil war</u>** among them (19:2)

- 3. Their <u>spirit</u> would be **demoralized** and their "strategy" confounded—leading them to the pursuit of <u>evil practices</u> (19:3)
- 4. They would be **conquered** and **ruled** by a *cruel* **master** and **king** (19:4)
- 5. They would experience <u>draught</u>, and the Nile with its surrounding fields and plants would <u>dry up—destroying</u> their <u>crops</u> (19:5-7)
- 6. Their <u>fishing</u> industry would suffer, and so would their <u>linen</u> industry— <u>all</u> working classes would suffer (19:8-10)
- 7. Their wise men (leaders) would act <u>foolishly</u>, leading them <u>astray</u>—
 The Lord would send them a "spirit" of confusion (19:11-14)
- 8. They would *suffer* extensive <u>unemployment</u> (19:15)
- 9. They would live in <u>fear</u> and <u>dread</u> of the **Lord of hosts** "waving **His hand**" over them, and the "terror" of the land of <u>Judah</u> against them (19:16-17)

Personal Observations/Application

- A. When **God** brought *judgments* against **Egypt**, **He** would do so through <u>various ways</u>. As we saw tonight, civil war, cruel conquerors, natural disasters, economic hardship, and "foolish" confusing leadership can oftentimes be the result of the judgment of God upon a nation.
- B. The *judgments* upon Egypt were the result of <u>idolatry</u>, <u>spiritism</u>, and "foolish," perverted <u>leadership</u>. Egypt's ungodliness and wicked <u>practices</u> resulted in <u>God's judgments</u>, and serve as a <u>warning</u> to all nations that they can expect to "reap" the same if they practice evil.
- C. According to **Isaiah's prophetic prediction**, **Egypt** would, "in **that day**," **cry out** to **the LORD** because of **oppressors**, and that **He** would **send them** a **Savior** and a "Champion," and *deliver* them. At <u>that time</u> **Egypt** will "know the LORD," and worship Him with sacrifice and offering. **Egypt**, though stricken by Him, will return to the LORD and be healed.

Miraculously at that time, the ancient *enemies* of Egypt, Assyria, and Israel will all be the people of God, <u>united</u>, and a "<u>blessing</u> in the midst of the earth (19:21-25).
