<sup>22</sup> Stop regarding <u>man</u>, whose breath *of life* is in his nostrils; For *why* should he be <u>esteemed</u>?

b. The *Removal* of their <u>Supply</u> and <u>Support</u> (3:1-7)

3 For behold, the Lord GOD of hosts is going to <u>remove</u> from Jerusalem and Judah Both *supply* and *support*, the whole *supply* of bread and the whole *supply* of water;

<sup>2</sup> The **mighty man** and the **warrior**, The **judge** and the **prophet**, The **diviner** and the **elder**,

<sup>3</sup> The captain of fifty and the honorable man, The counselor and the expert artisan, And the skillful enchanter.

<sup>4</sup> And I will make mere *lads* their <u>princes</u>, and <u>capricious</u> *children* will <u>rule</u> over them, <sup>5</sup> and the people will be *oppressed*, Each one by another, and each one by his neighbor;

The youth will storm *against* the elder and the inferior *against* the honorable.

<sup>6</sup> When a man *lays hold* of his brother in his father's house, saying,

"You have a cloak, you shall be our <u>ruler</u>, and these **ruins** will be under <u>your charge</u>,"

<sup>7</sup> He will *protest* on that day, saying,
"I will <u>not</u> be *your* healer,
For in my house there is *neither* bread nor cloak;
You should <u>not</u> appoint me <u>ruler</u> of the people."

c. The *Results* of <u>Rebellion</u> and <u>Sin</u> (3:8-12)

<sup>8</sup> For **Jerusalem** has **stumbled** and **Judah** has **fallen**, Because their **speech** and their **actions** are <u>against</u> the LORD, To <u>rebel</u> against His glorious presence.

<sup>9</sup>The **expression** of their **faces** bears **witness** *against them*, and they **display their** <u>sin</u> like Sodom; They do **not** *even* **conceal** *it*.

> *Woe* to them! For they have brought <u>evil</u> on themselves.

<sup>10</sup> Say to the <u>righteous</u> that *it will go* well *with them*, For they will **eat** the **fruit** of their **actions**.

<sup>11</sup> Woe to the <u>wicked</u>! It will go badly with him, for what he deserves will be done to him.

> <sup>12</sup> O My people! Their oppressors are <u>children</u>, and women <u>rule</u> over them.

O My people! Those who guide you lead you astray and confuse the direction of your paths.

#### c. The *Results* of <u>Rebellion</u> and <u>Sin</u> (3:8-12)

- *Having* <u>rebelled</u> against the LORD (3:8-9)
   a) *with* their speech and actions (3:8)
  - b) with their arrogant and open display of sin (3:9a)
- 2) *Having* brought <u>evil</u> upon themselves (3:9b-12)
  a) well-being upon the <u>righteous</u> (3:10a)
  - b) **"woe"** upon the <u>wicked</u> (3:9b, 11)
- 3) *Having* brought <u>disorder</u> in their midst (3:12)
  - a) *being* <u>oppressed</u> by *children* (3:12a)

## Personal Application In the **midst** of the *collapse* of **Judean society**, tonight **we also** read <u>this</u> verse:

"Say to the <u>righteous</u> that *it will go* well with them, For they will eat the fruit of their actions (3:10)."

## How do we live as "the righteous" in a society that is *collapsing*?

1. We live *courageously*, <u>walking</u> according to <u>righteous principles</u>, even though they will be *unpopular*, and even *hated*, in an increasingly decadent society.

Who is there to harm you if you prove zealous for what is good?

But even if **you** should **suffer** for the sake of <u>**righteousness**</u>, **you** are *blessed*. AND **DO NOT FEAR THEIR INTIMIDATION**, AND DO **NOT** BE **TROUBLED**,

but sanctify Messiah as Lord in your hearts, always *being ready* to make a <u>defense</u> to everyone who asks you to give an account for the *hope* that is in you, yet with *gentleness* and *reverence*; (I Peter 3:13-15)

2. We *communicate* wisely, <u>sharing God's truths</u> uncompromisingly, yet lovingly, towards those "outside," who may *oppose* and even be *hostile* to **our beliefs** and **values.** (Colossians 4:5-6)

Conduct yourselves with <u>wisdom</u> toward <u>outsiders</u>, making the **most** of the *opportunity*.

Let your <u>speech</u> always be with <u>grace</u>, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should *respond* to each person. (Colossians 4:5-6)

3. We *connect* with **other believers** *consistently*, that we may receive **comfort**, **instruction**, and **encouragement** from *others*, who are **living** <u>faithfully</u>, according to the <u>truths</u> and <u>promises</u> of **God's word**.

Let us hold fast the <u>confession</u> of **our hope** *without* wavering, for **He** who **promised** is **faithful**; and let us consider how to **stimulate one another** to *love* and *good deeds*, **not forsaking** our own <u>assembling together,...</u>but **encouraging** *one another*; and all the more as you see *the day* drawing near. (Hebrews 10:23-25)

4. We *commit* to **spending time** in **prayer**, and the **study of God's word**, knowing that these **disciplines** are essential to maintaining a *healthy* **spiritual life** in a **godless**, and **spiritually wicked world**.

Be anxious for *nothing*, but in everything by <u>prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u> with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

And the <u>peace</u> of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will <u>guard</u> your *hearts* and your *minds* in **Messiah Jesus**. (Philippians 4:6-7)

> <u>Your word</u> I have *hidden* in **my heart**, That I might <u>not sin</u> against You. (Psalm 119:11)

5. We *continue* to **walk** according to the **indwelling** <u>Spirit of God</u>, who sanctifies, renews, and empowers believers to *live* <u>godly</u> and <u>righteously</u> in an unrighteous world.

*Create* in me a clean heart, O God, And *renew* a steadfast spirit within me.

Do <u>not</u> cast me away from Your presence, And do <u>not</u> take Your <u>Holy Spirit</u> from me.

*Restore* to me the joy of Your salvation, And *uphold me by Your* generous <u>Spirit</u>.

*Then* I will *teach* transgressors Your ways, And **sinners** shall be *converted* to You. (Psalm 51:10-13)
