B. The Cleansing <u>Judgments</u> to Come (2:5-4:1)

1. The *Corruption* of the **People** (2:5-11)

⁵ Come, house of Jacob, and let us walk in the light of the LORD.

⁶ For <u>You</u> have abandoned Your people, the house of Jacob, Because they are <u>filled</u> with <u>influences</u> from the <u>east</u>, And they are <u>soothsayers</u> like the <u>Philistines</u>, And they strike <u>bargains</u> with the <u>children</u> of foreigners.

⁷Their **land** has also been **filled** with **silver** and **gold**And there is **no end** to their **treasures**;

Their **land** has also been **filled with <u>horses</u>**And there is **no end** to their **chariots**.

Their land has also been filled with idols; They worship the work of their hands, That which their fingers have made.

⁹ So the *common* man has been <u>humbled</u>
And the man of importance has been <u>abased</u>,
But do <u>not</u> forgive them.

¹⁰ Enter the rock and hide in the dust From the terror of the LORD and from the splendor of His majesty.

¹¹ The <u>proud</u> look of man will be *abased*And the <u>loftiness</u> of man will be *humbled*,
And the <u>LORD</u> alone will be *exalted* in that day.

2. The *Coming* Day of <u>Judgment</u> (2:12-21)

a. **Judgment against all** who are **proud** and **lifted up** (2:12)

¹² For the **LORD of hosts** will have a <u>day of reckoning</u>

Against everyone who is proud and lofty

And **against everyone** who is **lifted up.**That **he** may be **abased**.

b. **Judgment against all** that is **lofty** and **lifted up** (2:13-17)

¹³ And *it will be against* all the <u>cedars</u> of Lebanon that are *lofty* and *lifted up*, *Against* all the <u>oaks</u> of Bashan,

¹⁴ Against all the lofty mountains, Against all the hills that are lifted up,

Against every <u>high tower</u>, Against every <u>fortified wall</u>,

> Against all the <u>ships</u> of Tarshish And against all the beautiful craft.

¹⁷ The <u>pride</u> of man will be *humbled*And the <u>loftiness</u> of men will be *abased*;
And the <u>LORD</u> alone will be *exalted* in that day,

c. *Judgment* against the **idolatry of men** (2:18-22)

¹⁸ But the **idols** will **completely <u>vanish</u>**.

¹⁹ *Men* will go into *caves* of the **rocks**And into *holes* of the **ground**

Before the <u>terror</u> of the LORD And the <u>splendor</u> of His majesty, When **He arises** to make the **earth** *tremble*.

²⁰ In **that day** men will **cast away** to the **moles** and the **bats**Their <u>idols</u> of silver and their <u>idols</u> of gold,
Which **they made** for themselves to **worship**,

²¹ In order to **go** into the *caverns* of the **rocks** and the *clefts* of the **cliffs**Before the <u>terror</u> of the LORD and the <u>splendor</u> of His majesty,

When **He arises** to make the **earth** *tremble*.

Message Summary Judah's Corruption and "Day of Reckoning"

 - a. *Judgment* against all who are proud and lifted up (2:12)
 - b. *Judgment* against all that is <u>lofty</u> and <u>lifted up</u> (2:13-17)
 - c. *Judgment* against the <u>idolatry</u> of men (2:18-21)
 - 1) causing their idols to completely vanish (2:18)
 - 2) causing men to <u>hide</u> from the terror and splendor of the Lord (2:19-21)

Personal Application

As **Believers we need** to be *on guard* against that which brought **Judgment** against **Judah**

1. We need to be *on guard* against <u>eastern</u> philosophies, false <u>prognosticators</u>, and becoming "partners" with this world.

You **adulteresses**, do you not know that **friendship** with the **world** is **hostility** toward **God**?

Therefore whoever wishes to be a <u>friend</u> of the <u>world</u> makes himself an *enemy* of God. (James 4:4)

"'As for the **person** who turns to **mediums** and to **spiritists**, to play the **harlot** after them, I will also set My face **against** that **person** and will **cut him off** from among **his people**."

(Leviticus 20:6)

2. We need to be *on guard* against the **corrupting influences** of **wealth** and **power**.

"you shall surely set a king over you whom the LORD your God chooses,...

Moreover, he shall **not** *multiply* <u>horses</u> for **himself,..**He shall **not multiply wives** for **himself**, or else **his heart** will *turn* **away**; **nor** shall he **greatly increase** <u>silver</u> and <u>gold</u> for **himself.**(Deuteronomy 17:15-17)

Woe to those who go down to Egypt for help *and rely* on <u>horses</u>, And *trust* in chariots because they are *many*

And in **horsemen** because they are **very strong**, But they **do not look** to the **Holy One of Israel**, nor **seek the Lord!** (Isaiah 31:1)

3. We need to be *on guard* against <u>idolatry</u> and the *worship* of the works of our hands and minds.

Therefore consider the **members** of your **earthly body** as **dead to** *immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire*, and *greed*, which amounts to **idolatry**.

For it is because of **these things** that the <u>wrath</u> of God will come upon the **sons of disobedience**, (Colossians 3:5-6)

The rest of mankind, who were not killed by these plagues, did <u>not</u> repent of the works of their <u>hands</u>, so as not to worship demons, and the <u>idols</u> of gold and of silver and of brass and of stone and of wood, which can neither see nor hear nor walk; (Revelation 9:20)

4. We need to be on guard against pride and loftiness

<u>Pride</u> goes **before** <u>destruction</u>, And a **haughty spirit before stumbling**. (Proverbs 16:18)

Thus I will **punish** the world for its **evil**And the **wicked** for their **iniquity**;

I will also put **an end** to the **arrogance** of the **proud**And abase the **haughtiness** of the **ruthless**. (Isaiah 13:11)

For all that is in the world, the **lust** of the **flesh** and the **lust** of the **eyes** and the **boastful pride of life**, is **not** from the **Father**, but is from the **world**.

The world is <u>passing away</u>, and *also* its **lusts**; but the **one** who **does the** *will* **of God lives forever**. (I John 2:16-17)
