1. The *Contrast* of two Future <u>Cities</u> (26:1-6)

26 In that day this song will be sung in the land of Judah:

"We have a <u>strong</u> city; He sets up *walls* and *ramparts* for <u>security</u>.

² "Open the **gates**, that the *righteous* nation may enter, the **one** that remains *faithful.*

³ "The *steadfast* of mind You will keep in perfect <u>peace</u>, because **he** *trusts* in You.

⁴ "*Trust* in the LORD forever, For in GOD the LORD, we have an everlasting *Rock*.

- ⁵ "For He has brought low those who dwell on high, the unassailable <u>city</u>; He lays it low, He lays it low to the ground, He casts it to the dust.
- ⁶ "The foot will trample it, the feet of the afflicted, the steps of the helpless."
- 2. The *Constancy* of the <u>Righteous</u> (26:7-9)

⁷ The way of the <u>righteous</u> is *smooth;* O Upright One, make the path of the righteous <u>level</u>.

⁸ Indeed, while following the way of Your judgments, O LORD, We have waited for You eagerly;

Your *name*, even Your *memory*, is the <u>desire</u> of *our* souls. ⁹ At night my *soul* <u>longs</u> for You, Indeed, my *spirit* within me <u>seeks</u> You *diligently*; For when the **earth** experiences **Your** *judgments* the **inhabitants** of the **world** <u>learn righteousness</u>.

3. The *Callousness* of the <u>Wicked</u> (26:10-11)

¹⁰ Though the <u>wicked</u> is shown favor, he does <u>not</u> learn righteousness;

he deals <u>unjustly</u> in the land of *uprightness*, and does <u>not perceive</u> the *majesty* of the LORD.

¹¹ O LORD, Your hand is *lifted up* yet they do not see it.

They see Your zeal for the people and are put to shame; indeed, fire will *devour* Your enemies.

4. The *Converse* <u>Futures</u> of the **Righteous** and the **Wicked** (26:12-15)

a. Peace and Prosperity granted the <u>Faithful</u> (26:12-13, 15)

b. Punishment and Destruction upon the Wicked dead (26:14)

¹² LORD, You will establish <u>peace</u> for us, since You have also **performed** for us all **our works**.

¹³ O LORD our God, other *masters* besides You have ruled us; But through You alone we confess Your name.

¹⁴ The dead will not live, the departed spirits will not rise;

Therefore **You** have **<u>punished</u>** and <u>destroyed</u> them, and **You** have **wiped out** all **remembrance** of them.

¹⁵ You have *increased* the nation, O LORD, You have *increased* the nation, You are *glorified;* You have *extended* all the borders of the <u>land</u>.

5. The *Chastisement* of <u>God's People</u> recalled (26:16-19)

¹⁶ O LORD, they sought You in *distress;* they could only *whisper* a prayer, Your <u>chastening</u> was upon them.

¹⁷ As the **pregnant woman** approaches *the time* to give **birth**, She **writhes** *and* **cries** out in her **labor pains**, thus **were** <u>we</u> before **You**, **O** LORD.

> ¹⁸ <u>We</u> were *pregnant*, we writhed *in labor*, <u>We</u> gave *birth*, as it seems, *only* to *wind*. <u>We</u> could **not accomplish** *deliverance* for the *earth*, **Nor** were **inhabitants** of the world *born*.

¹⁹ Your dead will live; their corpses will rise.

You who lie in the dust, awake and shout for joy,

For your dew *is* as the dew of the dawn, and the earth will *give birth* to the departed spirits.

6. The *Coming* Indignation (26:20-21)

²⁰ Come, my people, enter into your rooms and close your doors behind you; hide for a little while until indignation runs its course.

²¹ For behold, the LORD is about to come out from His place to <u>punish</u> the inhabitants of the earth for their *iniquity;* and the earth will *reveal* her <u>bloodshed</u> and will no longer cover her <u>slain</u>.

Isaiah's Testimonial Song—A <u>Summary</u> *Eight* Key Observations

- We saw the *Divine* (future) Protection of <u>Jerusalem</u> (26:1-2)
 a. A *city* <u>saved</u> and <u>secured</u> by God (26:1)
 b. A *city* opened to a righteous nation (26:2a)
- 2. We saw a *Declaration* of <u>Peace</u> to the Faithful (26:2b-4)
 a. Who have *steadfastly* <u>trusted</u> in God (26:2b-3)
 b. Who have an "everlasting Rock" that they can <u>trust</u> forever (26:4)
- 3. We saw the *Destruction* of the "Lofty" <u>City</u> (26:5-6)
 a. A *city* "brought low" to the dust (26:5)
 b. A *city* trampled by the afflicted and helpless (25:6)
- 4. We saw the *Devotion* of the <u>Righteous</u> (26:7-9)
 - a. Who follow a path made <u>level</u> by the Lord (26:7)
 - b. Who remain <u>devoted</u> at *all times* to the Lord (26:8-9a)
 - 1) waiting *eagerly* for Him in the *midst* of judgments (26:8a)
 - 2) desiring earnestly His name and memory (26:8b)
 - 3) seeking *diligently* for Him in the night (26:9a)
 - c. Who <u>recognize</u> that when the earth *experiences* judgment, its inhabitants learn <u>righteousness</u> (26:9b)
- 5. We saw the "Dense" Condition of the <u>Wicked</u> (26:10-11)
 - a. Who, though being shown favor, do not learn righteousness, (26:10)
 - 1) continuing to deal *unjustly* in the land of *uprightness* (26:10a)
 - 2) unable to perceive the majesty of the LORD (26:10b)
 - b. Who do not perceive God's works and zeal among His people (26:11)

- 6. We saw the *Destiny* of the <u>Righteous</u> (nation) (26:12-13, 15, 19)
 - a. Who will receive the <u>restoration promises</u> of God (26:12-13, 15)
 - 1) the establishment of $\underline{\text{peace}}$ (26:12)
 - 2) the <u>increase</u> of the nation and its borders (26:15)
 - 3) the *promise* of a **joyous bodily** <u>resurrection</u> from the **dead** (26:19)
 - b. Who had endured great *distress*, and <u>chastening</u> from the Lord (26:16-18)
 - 1) a *distress* so great that they could *barely* utter a prayer (26:16)
 - 2) a *distress* likened to the labor <u>pains</u> of childbirth (26:17)
 - a *distress* enhanced by the <u>pain</u> of a failed "pregnancy" (a non-deliverance) (26:18)
- 7. We saw the *Demise* of the <u>Wicked</u> (26:14)
 - a. **Denied** a <u>resurrection</u> unto life (26:14a)
 - b. Punished and destroyed (26:14b)
 - c. **Remembered** <u>no more</u> (26:14c)
- 8. We are to "Hunker *Down*" on the *Day* of <u>God's Indignation</u> (26:20-21)
 - a. A *Day* to "<u>hide</u> for a while" until the indignation passes (26:20)
 - b. A *Day* when the Lord <u>punishes</u> the world for its iniquity (26:21a)
 - c. A *Day* when the **earth** will <u>reveal</u> its "bloodshed" (26:21b)

Personal Application

Isaiah's *Teachings* and *Instructions* to <u>us</u> as the <u>Day</u> of <u>God's Indignation</u> approaches;

- 1. *Teaching us* that God will keep us "in *perfect peace*, if we steadfastly <u>trust</u> in **Him**, who is our "everlasting <u>Rock</u>." (26:3-4)
- Instructing us that when judgments come, we are to eagerly wait on Him, remember Him, and seek Him diligently, knowing that when the earth experiences judgments, its inhabitants "learn righteousness." (26:8-9)
- 3. Instructing us that there will come a time that we may need to enter our rooms,
- "<u>close</u> the **doors**, and <u>hide</u> for a little while, "until <u>indignation</u> runs *its* course." (26:20)."
