1. The *Punishment* of the <u>Serpent</u> (Leviathon) (27:1)

27 In that day the LORD will <u>punish</u> Leviathan the fleeing serpent, With His fierce and great and mighty sword,

> Even Leviathan the *twisted* serpent; and He will <u>kill</u> the dragon who *lives* in the sea.

2. The *Song* of the <u>Vineyard</u> (27:2-6)

² In that day, "A vineyard of wine, sing of it!

³ "I, the LORD, am its *keeper*; I *water it* every moment. So that **no one** will **damage it**, I guard it *night* and *day*.

⁴ "I have **no wrath**. Should someone give **Me briars** *and* **thorns** in **battle**, *Then* I would **step on them**, I would **burn them completely**.

> ⁵ "Or let him rely on My protection, Let him make peace with Me, Let him make peace with Me."

⁶In the days to come **Jacob** will **take** *root*, **Israel** will *blossom* and *sprout,* and they will *fill* the **whole world** with <u>fruit</u>.

- 3. The *Purging* of <u>Israel</u> (27:7-9)
- ⁷Like the striking of <u>Him</u> who has struck <u>them</u>, has He struck <u>them</u> (Israel)? Or like the slaughter of <u>His</u> slain, have <u>they</u> (Israel) been slain?

⁸ You contended with them by *banishing them*, by driving them <u>away</u>. With His fierce wind He has <u>expelled</u> them on the day of the *east wind*.

⁹ Therefore through *this* **Jacob's** *iniquity* will be <u>forgiven</u>; and **this** will be the **full price** of the <u>pardoning</u> of his *sin*:

When he makes all the **altar stones** like <u>pulverized</u> chalk stones; When Asherim and incense altars will <u>not stand</u>.

4. The *Solitary* condition of <u>Jerusalem</u> (27:10-11)

¹⁰ For the *fortified city* is <u>isolated</u>, A homestead *forlorn* and *forsaken* like the desert;

There the **calf will graze**, and there it will lie down and **feed** on its **branches**.

¹¹ When its *limbs* are dry, they are broken off; Women come *and* make a fire with them,

For **they** are <u>**not**</u> a people of *discernment*, therefore their **Maker** will <u>**not**</u> have *compassion* on them. and their **Creator** will <u>**not**</u> be *gracious* to them.

5. The *Regathering* of <u>Israel</u> (27:12-13)

¹² In that day the LORD will start His <u>threshing</u> from the flowing stream of the Euphrates to the brook of Egypt, and you will be <u>gathered up</u> one by one, O sons of <u>Israel</u>.

¹³ It will come about also *in that day* that a great <u>trumpet</u> will be blown, and *those* who were perishing in the land of Assyria and who were scattered in the land of Egypt will come and *worship* the LORD in the holy mountain at Jerusalem.

Personal Application

In tonight's text, **Isaiah** declares *another* **Song of the Vineyard** (27:2-6). In both **tonight's song**, and the **previous one** (5:1-7), the **Lord** is declared as the **Owner** and **Caretaker** of the *vineyard*, which represents **Israel** (5:1-7; 27:3).

Unlike the earlier **Song of the Vineyard** (5:1-7), tonight's **text** "sings" of **God's** provision and protection over **His vineyard** <u>Israel</u>,

and her (Israel's) "filling" the whole world with fruit. (27:6).

The **Bible** is filled with <u>songs</u> and <u>psalms</u> of *praise* and *worship* to our **God and Savior**. <u>Songs</u> of *praise* and *worship* have been written and sung by countless millions in every generation. For our <u>Personal Application</u> let's refresh ourselves with:

10 Song Topics that inspire us to Sing unto our God

1. The Salvation/Redemption we have in God our Savior

Lord I lift Your name on high Lord I love to <u>sing</u> Your praises I'm so glad You're in my life I'm so glad You came to <u>save us</u>

2. The Love of God

Oh, how He <u>loves</u> you and me, Oh, how He <u>loves</u> you and me. He gave His life, what more could He give; Oh, how He <u>loves</u> you, Oh, how He <u>loves</u> me, Oh, how He <u>loves</u> you and me... (Kurt Kaiser)

3. The Grace of God

Amazing <u>grace</u> how sweet the sound That *saved* a wretch like me I once was lost, but now I'm found Was blind but now I see... (John Newton, 1779)

4. The **Power of God**

Who is like Him The Lion and the Lamb - Seated on the <u>throne</u> Mountains <u>bow down</u> - Every ocean <u>roars</u> - To the <u>Lord of hosts</u>

Praise Adonai - From the rising of the sun - 'til the end of every day

Praise Adonai - All the nations of the earth All the angels and the saints - Sing praise (Paul Baloche, 2000)

5. The Victory we have in God our Savior

A mighty fortress is our God, a *bulwark* never failing; our helper he amid the flood, of mortal ills prevailing. For still our ancient foe, does seek to work us woe; his craft and *power* are great, and armed with cruel hate, on earth is <u>not</u> his equal...

And though this world, with **devils filled**, should **threaten** to **undo us**, we will *not fear* for **God has willed**, his **truth to <u>triumph</u>** through us. The **prince** of darkness **grim**, we tremble <u>not</u> for him; his **rage** we can **endure**, for lo! his <u>doom</u> is *sure;* one little **word** shall <u>fell him</u>. (Martin Luther, 1527-1529)

6. The <u>Personal Relationship</u> we have with the Lord

I come to the **garden alone** while the **dew** is still on the **roses**, and the <u>voice</u> I hear falling on **my ear** the **Son of God** *discloses*.
