C. **Pronouncing** *Woe* upon **Judah** for their **Alliance** with **Egypt** (30:1-17)

1. An *Alliance* contrary to the <u>Will of God</u> (30:1-2)

30 "Woe to the rebellious children," declares the LORD,
"Who execute a plan, but not Mine,
and make an alliance, but not of My Spirit,
in order to add sin to sin;

Who proceed down to <u>Egypt</u> without consulting Me, to take *refuge* in the safety of **Pharaoh** and to seek *shelter* in the shadow of **Egypt!**

2. An *Alliance* that will bring **Shame** and **Reproach** (30:2-5)

³ "Therefore the **safety** of **Pharaoh** will be your **shame** and the **shelter** in the shadow of **Egypt**, your **humiliation**.

⁴ "For their **princes** are at **Zoan** and their **ambassadors** arrive at **Hanes**.

⁵ "Everyone will be <u>ashamed</u> because of a people who *cannot* profit them, who are not for help or profit, but for shame and also for reproach."

3. An *Alliance* both <u>Perilous</u> and <u>Unprofitable</u> (30:6-7)

⁶ The oracle concerning the **beasts** of the **Negev**.

Through a land of *distress* and *anguish*, from where *come* lioness and lion, viper and flying serpent,

they carry their *riches* on the backs of young donkeys and their *treasures* on camels' humps, to a people who *cannot* <u>profit</u> *them*;

⁷ Even **Egypt**, whose **help** is **vain** and **empty**.

Therefore, I have called her "Rahab who has been exterminated."

4. An *Alliance* formed by a <u>Rebellious</u> people, *refusing* to hear the <u>Instruction</u> of the Lord (30:8-11)

⁸ Now go, write it on a **tablet** before them and inscribe it on a **scroll**, that it may **serve** in the time to come as **a witness forever**.

⁹ For this is a <u>rebellious</u> people, *false sons*, **sons** who **refuse** to **listen** to the **instruction of the LORD**;

¹⁰ Who say to the **seers,** "You **must <u>not</u> see visions**"; and to the **prophets**, "You must <u>not</u> prophesy to us **what is right**, speak to us **pleasant words**, **prophesy illusions**.

11 "Get out of the way, turn aside from the *path*,
Let us **hear** *no more* about the **Holy One of Israel**."

5. An *Alliance* resulting in the Collapse of Judah (30:12-14)

¹² Therefore thus says the **Holy One of Israel**, "Since you have *rejected* this word and have put your **trust** in *oppression* and *guile*, and have **relied** on them,

13 Therefore this <u>iniquity</u> will be to you like a *breach* about to fall, a *bulge* in a high wall, whose collapse comes suddenly in an instant,

¹⁴ Whose <u>collapse</u> is like the <u>smashing</u> of a <u>potter's jar</u>, so <u>ruthlessly</u> <u>shattered</u> that a sherd will not be found among its pieces to take <u>fire</u> from a hearth or to scoop <u>water</u> from a cistern."

6. An *Alliance* resulting in the "Flight" of the People (30:15-17)

¹⁵ For thus the **Lord God**, the **Holy One of Israel**, has said,

"In **repentance** and **rest** you will be **saved**, In **quietness** and **trust** is your **strength**." But you were **not willing**,

And you said, "No, for we will <u>flee</u> on horses," therefore you shall <u>flee!</u>
 "And we will ride on swift horses,"
 Therefore those who pursue you shall be swift.

¹⁷ One thousand will flee at the threat of one man;

You will <u>flee</u> at the **threat** of five, Until you are left as a **flag** on a *mountain top* and as a **signal** on a **hill.**

Personal Application The Peril of Unhealthy Alliances

1. As *believers*, we too are **warned** against making **unwise**, **unhealthy alliances** that are **contrary** to the **instruction** of **God**. (30:1-2)

"Woe to the rebellious children," declares the LORD, "Who execute a plan, but <u>not</u> Mine, and make an <u>alliance</u>, but <u>not</u> of My Spirit, In order to add sin to sin;..." (30:1)

Be sure to observe what I am **commanding you** this day: behold, I am going to *drive out* the Amorite before you, and the Canaanite, the Hittite, the Perizzite, the Hivite and the Jebusite.

Watch yourself that you **make <u>no covenant</u>** with the **inhabitants** of the land into which you are going, or it will become a <u>snare</u> in your **midst.** (Exodus 34:11-12)

It is better to **take <u>refuge</u>** in **the LORD** than to **trust** in man.

It is better to take <u>refuge</u> in **the LORD**than to **trust** in **princes**. (Psalm 118:8-9)

He who *walks* with wise men will be <u>wise</u>, But the <u>companion</u> of <u>fools</u> will *suffer harm*. (Proverbs 13:20)

Do not be **bound** <u>together</u> with <u>unbelievers</u>; for what **partnership** have **righteousness** and **lawlessness**, or what **fellowship** has **light** with **darkness**? (II Corinthians 6:14)

Do not be **deceived**: "Bad <u>company</u> corrupts good morals." (I Corinthians 15:33)

2. As *believers*, we should **never** become <u>rebellious</u> and **refuse** to listen to the **instruction** of **the Lord**. We should *never* **reject God's message** of what is <u>right</u>, in preference of a **message** and **words** that are more **agreeable** to *our* **will**, and "pleasant" to *our* hearing. (30:9-11)

For this is a <u>rebellious</u> people, false sons, sons who *refuse* to **listen** to the **instruction of the LORD**;

Who say to the **seers**, "You must **not see visions**"; and to the **prophets**, "You must **not prophesy** to us what is **right**, speak to us **pleasant words**, **prophesy illusions**.(30:9-10)

The prophets prophesy falsely, And the priests rule on their own authority; And My people love it so! But what will you do at the end of it? (Jeremiah 5:31)

For the **time** will come when they will **not endure sound doctrine**; but **wanting** to have their **ears tickled**, they will accumulate for themselves **teachers** in accordance to their **own desires**, and will **turn away** their **ears** from the **truth** and will **turn aside** to **myths**. (II Timothy 4:3-4)

3. As *believers*, we must **take heed** and **be warned** about choosing to do <u>iniquity</u>. For like a "breach" about to fall, a **bulge** in a **high wall**, its **destructive collapse** comes *suddenly*. (30:13-14)

Israel has *rejected* the **good**; the **enemy** will **pursue him**...

For they **sow the wind** and they **reap** the **whirlwind**.

The standing **grain** has **no heads**; it yields **no grain**. Should it **yield**, **strangers** would **swallow** it **up**.

Israel is swallowed up; they are now among the nations like a vessel in which no one delights. (Hosea 8:3, 7-8)

"According to what I have seen, **those** who **plow iniquity** and **those** who **sow trouble harvest** it. (Job 4:8)

His **own iniquities** will **capture the wicked**, and he will be **held** with the **cords** of **his sin**. (Proverbs 5:22)

4. As *believers*, when we make **poor choices** and **walk** *contrary* to the **will of God**, if **we are** *willing*, we can always <u>repent</u> and <u>quietly</u> <u>trust God</u> for <u>deliverance</u> and <u>strength</u>.

"In <u>repentance</u> and <u>rest</u> you will be <u>saved</u>,
In <u>quietness</u> and <u>trust</u> is your <u>strength</u>."
But you were <u>not willing</u>,.." (30:15)
