D. **Promising** a *Time* of Future <u>Restoration</u> for Israel (30:18-26)

1. A *Time* characterized by <u>Grace</u> and <u>Compassion</u> (30:18-19)

¹⁸ Therefore the **LORD** *longs* to be <u>gracious</u> to you, and therefore **He** *waits* on high to have *compassion* on you.

> For the LORD is a God of <u>justice;</u> How blessed are all those who *long* for Him.

- ¹⁹O people in Zion, inhabitant in Jerusalem, you will weep no longer. He will surely be <u>gracious</u> to you at the sound of your cry; when He hears it, He will answer you.
- 2. A *Time* characterized by the <u>Teaching</u> and <u>Guidance</u> of God (30:20-21)

²⁰ Although the Lord has given you bread of *privation* and water of oppression, He, your <u>Teacher</u> will no longer hide Himself, but your eyes will behold your <u>Teacher</u>.

> ²¹ Your *ears* will <u>hear</u> a word behind you, "This is the way, <u>walk</u> in it," whenever you turn to the *right* or to the *left.*

3. A *Time* when they will <u>destroy</u> their <u>Idols</u> (30:22)

²² And you will <u>defile</u> your graven images overlaid with silver, and your molten <u>images</u> plated with gold.

You will scatter them as an impure thing, and say to them, "Be gone!"

4. A *Time* characterized by God's abundant <u>Provision</u> (30:23-25)

²³ Then He will give you rain for the seed which you will sow in the ground, and bread from the yield of the ground, and it will be <u>rich</u> and <u>plenteous</u>; on that day your *livestock* will graze in a <u>roomy</u> pasture.

²⁴ Also the *oxen* and the *donkeys* which work the ground will eat <u>salted fodder</u>, which has been winnowed with shovel and fork.

²⁵ On every **lofty mountain** and on every **high hill** there will be **streams** running with **water** on the day of the **great slaughter**, when the **towers fall**.

5. A Time characterized by God's glorious Light and Healing (30:26)

²⁶ The *light* of the moon will be as the *light* of the sun, and the *light* of the sun will be seven times *brighter*, like the *light* of seven days, on the day the LORD <u>binds up</u> the *fracture* of His people and <u>heals</u> the *bruise* <u>He</u> has inflicted.

E. **Predicting** the **coming** *Indignation* of <u>God</u> (30:27-33)

1. The *Indignation* against <u>all Nations</u> (30:27-28)

²⁷ Behold, the name of the LORD comes from a remote place; burning is <u>His anger</u> and dense is His smoke;

> His lips are filled with <u>indignation</u> and His tongue is like a *consuming fire*;

²⁸ His breath is like an overflowing torrent, which reaches to the neck, to shake the <u>nations</u> back and forth in a sieve, and to *put* in the jaws of the peoples the bridle which leads to ruin.

2. The Indignation against Assyria (30:29-33)

²⁹ You (Israel) will have songs as in the night when you keep the festival, and gladness of heart as when one marches to the sound of the flute, to go to the mountain of the LORD, to the Rock of Israel.

³⁰ And the LORD will cause His voice of authority to be heard, and the descending of His arm to be seen in *fierce anger*, and *in* the flame of a *consuming fire*

in *cloudburst, downpour* and *hailstones*.

³¹ For at the **voice** of the **LORD** <u>Assyria</u> will be **terrified**, *when* **He strikes** with the **rod**.

³² And every blow of the rod of *punishment*, which the LORD will lay on him,
will be with *the music of* tambourines and lyres;
and in battles, brandishing weapons, <u>He</u> will fight them.

³³ For **Topheth** has long been **ready**, indeed, it has been **prepared** for the **king**.

He has made it deep and large, a pyre of fire with plenty of wood; the breath of the LORD, like a torrent of brimstone, sets it afire.

The *Character* of Israel's Future <u>Restoration</u> – A Summary (30:18-26)

- \rightarrow *Characterized* by <u>Grace</u> and <u>Compassion</u> (30:18-19)
- → *Characterized* by the **Presence of God** our <u>Teacher</u> (teachers), and **His Personal** <u>Guidance</u> (30:20-21)
- \rightarrow *Characterized* by the **destruction** of <u>Idols</u> among them (30:22)
- → *Characterized* by God's abundant <u>Provision</u> (30:23-25)
- → *Characterized* by the Glory and <u>Light</u> of God's Presence (30:26a)
- \rightarrow *Characterized* by the <u>Healing</u> Power of God (30:26b)

<u>New Testament Comparison</u>→ Messiah's *First* Coming— *Glimpses* of Israel's Future <u>Restoration</u>

1. When **Messiah** *came*, **His Ministry** was *characterized* by <u>Grace</u> and <u>Compassion</u>

And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth...

For of **His (Jesus) fullness** we have all received, and <u>grace</u> upon <u>grace</u>. (John 1:14, 16)

For the <u>grace</u> of God has *appeared*, bringing salvation to all men, (Titus 2:11)

Seeing the **people, He (Messiah)** felt <u>compassion</u> for **them**, because they were **distressed** and **dispirited** like **sheep** without a **shepherd**. (Matthew 9:36)

When **He (Jesus)** went ashore, **He** saw a **large crowd**, and felt <u>compassion</u> for them and *healed* their sick. (Matthew 14:14)

2. When **Messiah** *came*, the people "beheld" their **Divine** <u>Teacher</u>

... this **man (Nicodemus)** came to **Jesus** by night and said to **Him**, "<u>Rabbi</u>, we know that **You** have **come from God** *as* a <u>teacher</u>; for **no one** can do these *signs* that **You do** unless **God is** *with* him." (John 3:2) When Jesus had finished these words, the crowds were amazed at <u>His teaching</u>; for He was teaching them as *one* having *authority*, and *not* as their scribes. (Matthew 7:28-29)

So Jesus answered them and said, "My <u>teaching</u> is *not Mine,* but **His** who **sent Me.** (John 7:16)

3. When **Messiah** *came*, **He demonstrated** His **Power** to *abundantly* make <u>**Provisions**</u>

Ordering the people to sit down on the grass, He (Jesus) took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up toward heaven, He blessed the food, and breaking the loaves He gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds (5,000 people),

and they <u>all</u> ate and were *satisfied*. They picked up what was **left over** of the broken pieces, **twelve** *full* **baskets**. (Matthew 14:19-20)

4. When Messiah came, He manifested a glorious Light

In Him was *life,* and the *life* was the <u>Light</u> of men (John 1:4)

Then **Jesus** again spoke to them, saying, "**I am** the <u>Light</u> of the world; he who follows Me will *not* walk in the *darkness*, but will have the <u>Light</u> of life." (John 8:12)

and leaving **Nazareth**, **He (Messiah)** came and settled in... the region of **Zebulun** and **Naphtali**. This was to **fulfill** what was spoken through **Isaiah** the **prophet**:...

"THE **PEOPLE** WHO WERE *SITTING* IN **DARKNESS SAW A <u>GREAT LIGHT</u>**, AND THOSE WHO WERE *SITTING* IN THE **LAND** AND **SHADOW OF** *DEATH*, UPON THEM A <u>LIGHT</u> DAWNED." (Matthew 4:13-14, 16)

5. When Messiah came, He Healed the People

Jesus was going through all the cities and villages, *teaching* in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the *kingdom*, and <u>healing</u> every kind of <u>disease</u> and every kind of <u>sickness</u>. (Matthew 9:35)
