H. **Pronouncing** *Woe* upon <u>Assyria</u>, and a **Future** *Hope* for <u>Zion</u> (33:1-24)

1. The Woe Pronounced (33:1)

33 Woe to you, O destroyer, while you were not destroyed; And he who is treacherous, while *others* did not deal treacherously with him. As soon as you finish destroying, <u>you</u> will be <u>destroyed</u>; As soon as you cease to deal treacherously, *others* will deal treacherously with <u>you</u>.

2. The *Prayer* of the <u>Righteous</u> (33:2)

 ² O LORD, be gracious to us; we have *waited* for You. Be their *strength* every morning, Our *salvation* also in the time of distress.

3. The *Plunder* of the <u>Assyrian Army</u> (33:3-4)

³ At the sound of the **tumult peoples flee**; At the **lifting up** of **Yourself** *nations disperse*.

⁴ Your <u>spoil</u> is *gathered as* the caterpillar *gathers*; As *locusts* rushing about <u>men</u> rush about on it. 4. The *Praise* of the *Exalted Lord* (33:5-6)

⁵ The LORD is exalted, for He dwells on high; He has filled Zion with *justice* and *righteousness.*

⁶ And **He** will be the *stability* of **your times**, A wealth of *salvation, wisdom* and *knowledge;* the *fear* of the LORD is his treasure.

5. The *Perilous* Condition of <u>Judah</u> (33:7-9)

⁷ Behold, their brave men *cry* in the streets, the **ambassadors of peace** *weep bitterly*.

⁸ The **highways** are **desolate**, the **traveler** has **ceased**, **He** has **broken** the <u>covenant</u>, he has **despised** the **cities**, **He** has **no regard** for **man**.

⁹ The land mourns and pines away, Lebanon is shamed and withers; Sharon is like a desert plain, And Bashan and Carmel lose their foliage.

6. The *Proclamation* of <u>Judgment</u> (33:10-12)

¹⁰ "Now I will *arise*," says the LORD, "Now I will be *exalted*, now I will be *lifted up*.

¹¹ "You have **conceived** *chaff*, you will **give birth to** *stubble;* **My breath** will *consume you* like a fire.

> ¹² "The **peoples** will be **burned to lime**, like **cut thorns** which are **burned in the fire**.

7. The *Panic* of the <u>Godless</u> (33:13-14)

¹³ "You who are *far away*, hear what I have done; and you who are *near*, acknowledge My might."

- ¹⁴ Sinners in Zion are *terrified*; *trembling* has seized the godless. "Who among us can live with the consuming fire? Who among us can live with continual burning?"
 - 8. The *Piety* and *Secure Position* of the <u>Righteous</u> (33:15-17)

¹⁵ He who walks *righteously* and speaks with sincerity,

He who rejects *unjust gain* and shakes his hands so that they hold *no bribe*; He who stops his *ears* from hearing about *bloodshed* and shuts his eyes from looking upon *evil*;

¹⁶ He will dwell on the *heights*, his refuge will be the *impregnable rock*, his *bread* will be given *him*, his *water* will be sure.

¹⁷ Your eyes will see the <u>King</u> in His beauty; they will behold a far-distant land.

9. The Past <u>Reflections</u> of the Righteous (33:18-19)

¹⁸ Your heart will <u>meditate</u> on *terror:* "Where is he who *counts?* Where is he who weighs? Where is he who *counts the towers*?"

¹⁹ You will **no longer** see a *fierce people*, a people of *unintelligible speech* which no one **comprehends**, of a *stammering tongue* which no one **understands**.

10. The *Poetic Picture* of Zion–Secure in the Lord (33:20-24)

 ²⁰ Look upon <u>Zion</u>, the city of our *appointed feasts*; Your eyes will see <u>Jerusalem</u>, an *undisturbed habitation*,
A *tent* which will not be folded; its *stakes* will never be pulled up, Nor any of *its cords* be torn apart.

²¹ But there the majestic One, the LORD, will be for us a place of rivers and wide canals on which no boat with oars will go, and on which no mighty ship will pass—

²² For the LORD is our *judge*, the LORD is our *lawgiver,* the LORD is our *king*; He will <u>save us</u>—

²³ Your tackle hangs slack (Assyria); it cannot hold the base of its mast firmly, nor spread out the sail.

> Then the **prey** of an **abundant** *spoil* will be **divided**; the <u>lame</u> will take the *plunder*.

²⁴ And **no resident** will say, "**I am sick**"; the **people** who **dwell there** will be <u>forgiven</u> *their* **iniquity**.

Insights from Tonight's Chapter

1. As in the case of **Assyria**, no matter how **big** and *destructive* an **empire** or **nation** might become, there will be <u>divine retribution</u> for its *treachery*, especially when it has affected **God's people**.

As soon as **you finish** *destroying*, <u>you</u> will be *destroyed*; As soon as **you cease** to **deal** *treacherously*, *others* will **deal** *treacherously* with <u>you</u>. (33:1)

2. No matter how *stressful* and *desperate* times may become, we are to <u>wait upon God</u> for strength, salvation, stability, and wisdom.

² O LORD, be gracious to us; we have waited for You. Be their strength every morning, Our salvation also in the time of <u>distress</u>...

⁶ And **He** will be the *stability* of your times, A wealth of *salvation*, *wisdom* and *knowledge;* the fear of the LORD is his *treasure*. (33:2, 6)

3. No matter how *godless* and *sinful* the **nations** and **people** may become, **God** will always **preserve** and **protect** a <u>righteous remnant</u>.

"Who among us can <u>live</u> with the consuming fire? Who among us can <u>live</u> with continual burning?"

He who rejects unjust gain and shakes his hands so that they hold no bribe; He who stops his ears from hearing about bloodshed and shuts his eyes from looking upon evil;

He will dwell on the heights, his refuge will be the impregnable rock; his bread will be given *him*, his water will be *sure*. (33:14b-16)

4. No matter how *bleak* and *desperate* it looks for <u>Zion</u> and <u>Jerusalem</u>, there will come a time when **they**, and **their inhabitants** will be <u>secure</u> and "<u>undisturbed</u>."

Look upon <u>Zion</u>, the city of our *appointed feasts;* Your eyes will see <u>Jerusalem</u>, an *undisturbed habitation*, A tent which will *not be folded*; its stakes will *never be pulled up,* Nor any of its cords be *torn apart*. (33:20)
