J. Proclaiming the *Blessings* of Israel's Future <u>Kingdom</u> (35:1-10)

1. The *Rejuvenation* of the <u>Land</u> (35:1-2)

35 The <u>wilderness</u> and the <u>desert</u> will be *glad*, and the <u>Arabah</u> will *rejoice* and *blossom*;

Like the **crocus**² It will **blossom** profusely
and **rejoice** with **rejoicing** and **shout of joy**.

The *glory* of **Lebanon** will be given to it, The *majesty* of **Carmel** and **Sharon**.

They will **see** the **glory** of **the LORD**, The **majesty** of **our God**.

2. The *Reassuring* of the <u>Dispirited</u> and <u>Fearful</u> (35:3-4)

³ Encourage the exhausted, and strengthen the feeble.

⁴ Say to those with *anxious heart*, "Take **courage**, <u>fear not.</u> Behold, **your God** will come *with vengeance*;

the recompense of God will come, But He will <u>save you</u>."

3. The *Restoration* of the **Physically Disabled** (35:5-6a)

⁵Then the <u>eyes</u> of the <u>blind</u> will be *opened* and the <u>ears</u> of the <u>deaf</u> will be *unstopped*.

⁶Then the <u>lame</u> will <u>leap</u> like a *deer*, and the **tongue** of the **mute** will **shout for joy**.

4. The *Rich* Supply of Water in the Land (35:6b-7)

For <u>waters</u> will *break forth* in the wilderness and <u>streams</u> in the Arabah.

⁷ The **scorched land** will become a **pool** and the **thirsty ground springs** of **water**;

In the haunt of **jackals**, its resting place, **grass** becomes **reeds** and **rushes**.

5. The *Roadway* of the **Redeemed** (35:8-9)

⁸ A <u>highway</u> will be there, a <u>roadway</u>, and it will be called the <u>Highway of Holiness</u>.

The **unclean** will <u>not</u> travel on it, but it *will* be for him who **walks** *that* way, and **fools** will <u>not</u> wander *on it*.

⁹ No lion will be there, Nor will any vicious beast go up on it;

These will <u>not</u> be found there. but the **redeemed** will **walk** *there*,

6. The *Return* and **everlasting Joy** of the **Ransomed** (35:10)

And the <u>ransomed</u> of the LORD will return and come with joyful shouting to <u>Zion</u>, With everlasting joy upon their heads.

They will find **gladness** and **joy**, and **sorrow** and **sighing** will **flee away**.

Isaiah's *Description* of the Future <u>Kingdom</u> of Israel—A <u>Summary</u>

- A. **Isaiah** *describes* the land of the **kingdom of Israel** as **flourishing** with *abundance* and *productivity*. The **land** will **"rejoice and blossom,"** and certain **places** (**Carmel** and **Sharon**) will be characterized by **"glory"** and **"majesty"** (35:1-2a).
- B. Isaiah *declares* that those in the kingdom will <u>see</u> the glory of the LORD, and the majestic <u>presence</u> of God (35:2a).
- C. **Isaiah** *exhorts* the **believers**, to <u>encourage</u> those who are **weak and fearful** to be **courageous**, because **their God** will both **avenge** and **save them** (35:3-4).
- D. **Isaiah** *describes* how that **those** who are **suffering** from <u>disability</u> and <u>infirmity</u> at this time will be <u>healed</u> (35:5-6a).
- E. **Isaiah** describes that water will be abundant and plentiful in the kingdom:

For waters will "break forth" in the wilderness
And streams in the Arabah.

The scorched land will become a pool

And the thirsty ground springs of water, (35:6b-7)

F. Isaiah *declares* that there will be a <u>roadway</u> in the <u>kingdom</u> for the <u>redeemed</u> to walk in Israel. It will be called the "Highway of Holiness" for <u>those</u> who "walk that way (35:8-9)."

The *unclean* will <u>not</u> travel on it,..

And *fools* will <u>not</u> wander *on it*.

No *lion* or *vicious beast* will <u>go up</u> on it; (35:8-9)

G. Isaiah declares that the <u>ransomed</u> of the LORD will return to Zion, and that they will be characterized by "joyful shouting," and "everlasting joy." There they will find "gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing will <u>flee away</u> (35:10)."

Personal Application

So, while **we await** the **coming** of this **amazing** and **wonderful kingdom**, **what** do **we do**?

We do the Will of God.

Doing the will of God— <u>Various Texts</u>→

- → He (God) has told you, O man, what is good;
 And what does the LORD require of you
 But to do justice, to love kindness,
 And to walk humbly with your God? (Micah 6:2)
- → <u>Rejoice</u> always; <u>pray</u> without ceasing; in everything <u>give thanks</u>; for this is <u>God's will</u> for <u>you</u> in <u>Messiah Jesus</u>. (I Thessalonians 5:16-18)
 - → For this is the <u>will of God</u>, your <u>sanctification</u>; that is, that you abstain from <u>sexual immorality</u>; that each of you know how to <u>possess</u> his own vessel in <u>sanctification</u> and <u>honor</u>, not in <u>lustful passion</u>, like the <u>Gentiles</u> who do not know <u>God</u>; (I Thessalonians 4:3-5)
- → For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men, instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age,
 - **looking** for the **blessed hope** and the **appearing** of the **glory** of our **great God** and **Savior**, **Messiah Jesus**, (Titus 2:11-13)
- → ...but sanctify Messiah as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a <u>defense</u> to everyone who asks you to give an account for the <u>hope</u> (Messianic) that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence; (I Peter 3:15)
 - → Let us <u>not</u> lose heart in <u>doing good</u>, for in *due time* we will reap if we do <u>not</u> grow weary. So then, while we have opportunity, let us <u>do good</u> to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the *faith*. (Galatians 6:9-10)
 - → Let us **hold fast** the <u>confession</u> of **our <u>hope</u>** without wavering, for <u>He</u> who **promised is** *faithful*; and let us consider how to *stimulate* one another to <u>love</u> and <u>good deeds</u>,
 - <u>not</u> forsaking our own <u>assembling together</u>, as is the habit of some, but <u>encouraging</u> one another, and all the more as you see the day drawing near. (Hebrews 10:23-25)
 - → Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations,
 baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit,
 teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo,
 I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20)
