1. His *Posture* of <u>Humility</u> before God (37:1)

37 And when King Hezekiah heard *it*, he *tore* his clothes, *covered* himself with sackcloth and *entered* the house of the LORD.

2. His Pursuit of God's Prophet (37:2-7)

² Then he sent Eliakim who was over the household with Shebna the scribe and the elders of the priests, covered with sackcloth, to <u>Isaiah</u> the prophet, the son of Amoz.

³ They said to **him**, "Thus says **Hezekiah**, 'This day is a day of *distress, rebuke* and *rejection*; for **children** have come to **birth**, and there is *no strength* to <u>deliver</u>.

⁴ Perhaps the Lord your God will hear the words of *Rabshakeh*, whom his master the king of Assyria has sent to *reproach* the living God, and will <u>rebuke</u> the words which the Lord your God has heard.

Therefore, offer a prayer for the remnant that is left."

⁵ So the servants of King Hezekiah came to Isaiah.

⁶ Isaiah said to them, "Thus you shall say to your master,

'Thus says **the LORD**, "Do <u>not</u> be afraid because of the words that you have heard, with which the servants of the king of Assyria have blasphemed Me.

⁷ Behold, I will put a <u>spirit</u> in him so that he will hear a rumor and return to his own land. And I will make him fall by the sword in his own land.""

3. His Persistent Threats from Rabshakeh (37:8-13)

⁸ Then **Rabshakeh returned** and found the **king of Assyria** fighting against **Libnah** for he had heard that the **king** had left **Lachish**.

⁹When he heard *them* say concerning *Tirhakah* king of Cush, "He has come out to <u>fight</u> *against* you," and when **he heard** *it* he sent **messengers** to **Hezekiah**, saying,

¹⁰ "Thus you shall say to Hezekiah king of Judah, 'Do <u>not</u> let your God in whom you <u>trust</u> deceive you, saying, "Jerusalem will <u>not</u> be given into the hand of the king of Assyria."

¹¹ Behold, you have **heard** what the **kings of Assyria** have **done** to all the **lands**, <u>destroying</u> them completely. So will <u>you</u> be spared?

> ¹² Did the gods of those nations which my fathers have destroyed deliver them, even Gozan and Haran and Rezeph and the sons of Eden who were in Telassar?

¹³ Where is the king of Hamath, the king of Arpad, the king of the city of Sepharvaim, and of Hena and Ivvah?"

4. His *Prayer* for <u>Deliverance</u> (37:14-20)

¹⁴ Then Hezekiah took the *letter* from the hand of the messengers and read it, and he went up to the house of the LORD and *spread it out* before the LORD.

¹⁵ Hezekiah <u>prayed</u> to the LORD saying,

¹⁶ "O LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, ,
 who is enthroned *above* the cherubim, You are the God
 You *alone*, of <u>all</u> the kingdoms of the earth.

You have made heaven and earth.

¹⁷ Incline Your ear, O LORD, and *hear;* open Your eyes, O LORD, and see; and *listen* to all the <u>words</u> of Sennacherib, who sent *them* to *reproach* the living God.

¹⁸ Truly, **O LORD**, the **kings of Assyria** have *devastated* all the countries and their lands,

¹⁹ and have **cast** their **gods** into **the fire**, for they were <u>not</u> **gods** but the **work** of **men's hands**, wood and stone. So they have *destroyed* them.

²⁰ Now, O LORD our God, <u>deliver us</u> from his hand that <u>all</u> the kingdoms of the earth may know that <u>You alone</u>, LORD, are God."

Personal Application

Hezekiah's <u>Response</u> to Fearful Threats and Adversity, A <u>Model</u> for us to follow, when facing severe <u>adversity</u>→

→A. Hezekiah, facing *threats* from a powerful adversary, <u>humbled</u> himself, and went before <u>the LORD</u>.

And when **King Hezekiah heard** *it* (Sennacherub's *threats*), he <u>tore</u> his clothes, covered himself with <u>sackcloth</u> and *entered* the *house* of <u>the LORD</u>. (37:1)

He leads the <u>humble</u> in justice, And He teaches the <u>humble</u> His way. (Psalm 25:9)

"For **My hand** *made* all these *things,* Thus all these *things* came into **being**," declares **the LORD.** "But to *this one* I will look, To him who is <u>humble</u> and <u>contrite</u> of spirit, and who *trembles* at <u>My word.</u> (Isaiah 66:2)

→B. Hezekiah used trusted <u>servants</u> and "<u>elders</u>" to help *bear* his burden, and *communicate* his desperate need for help.

Then **he (Hezekiah)** <u>sent</u> *Eliakim* who was over the household with *Shebna* the scribe and the *elders* of the priests, covered with <u>sackcloth</u>, to Isaiah the prophet,..(37:2). For by *wise guidance* you will wage war, And in **abundance of** <u>counselors</u> there is **victory**. (Proverbs 24:4)

→C. Hezekiah sought out the prophet Isaiah to both <u>intercede</u> for them, and to hear the <u>word</u> of the Lord regarding these threats.

Isaiah said to them (Hezekiah's messengers), "Thus you shall say to your master, 'Thus says the LORD,

"Do <u>not</u> be afraid because of the words that you have heard, with which the servants of the king of Assyria have *blasphemed Me.* Behold I will <u>put</u> a spirit *in him*...And I will make him <u>fall</u>...(37:6-7)

Your <u>word</u> is a *lamp* to my feet And a *light* to my path.

You are my hiding place and my shield; I wait for Your word. (Psalm 119:105, 114)

→D. Hezekiah, though he continued to receive personal <u>threats</u> from the Assyrian king (37:8-13), he <u>faced</u> those fears with <u>faith</u> in God.

Then **Hezekiah** took the **letter** from the hand of the **messengers** and *read it*, and he *went up* to the **house of the LORD** and *spread it out before* **the LORD**. (37:14)

I sought the LORD, and He answered me, And <u>delivered me</u> from all my fears. (Psalm 34:4)

The LORD is my light and my <u>salvation</u>; whom shall I fear? The LORD is the <u>defense</u> of my life; whom shall I dread? (Psalm 27:1)

...in addition to all (the **armor of God**), taking up the <u>shield of faith</u> with which you will be able to **extinguish** all the **flaming arrows** of the **evil one**. (Ephesians 3:16)

→E. Hezekiah <u>Prayed</u> to the one true God for <u>deliverance</u>.

¹⁵ Hezekiah <u>prayed</u> to the LORD saying,..
"You are the God, You alone, of all the kingdoms of the earth...

Now, O LORD our God, <u>deliver us</u> from his hand that *all* the kingdoms of the earth may know that *You alone*, LORD, are God."(37:15-16, 20)

Be *anxious* for nothing, but in everything by <u>prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u> with **thanksgiving** let your **requests** be made **known to God**.

And the **peace of God**, which **surpasses** all *comprehension*, will **guard** your **hearts** and your **minds** in **Messiah Jesus**. (Philippians 4:6-7)
