1. A *Prediction* of the King's immanent <u>Death</u> (38:1)

38 In *those* days Hezekiah became <u>mortally ill</u>. And Isaiah the prophet the son of Amoz came to him and said to him, "Thus says the LORD, 'Set your house in *order*, for you shall <u>die</u> and not live."

2. A Prayerful appeal to God (38:2-3)

²Then Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and prayed to the LORD,

³ and said, "**Remember now, O LORD**, I *beseech* You, how I have **walked before You** in *truth* and with a *whole heart*, and have **done** what is *good* in **Your sight**." And **Hezekiah** *wept bitterly*.

3. A *Promise* of additional Life (38:4-5)

⁴ Then the word of the LORD came to Isaiah, saying,
 ⁵ "Go and say to Hezekiah,
 'Thus says the LORD, the God of your father David,

"I have heard your <u>prayer</u>, I have seen your <u>tears</u>; behold, I will <u>add fifteen years</u> to your <u>life</u>.

4. A *Plea* for a <u>Sign</u> (38:6-8) (II Kings 20:8)

⁶I will *deliver* you and this city from the hand of the king of Assyria; and I will <u>defend</u> this city." ⁷ "This shall be the <u>sign</u> to you from the LORD, that the LORD will *do* this thing that He has spoken:

⁸ Behold, I will cause the shadow on the stairway, which has gone down with the sun on the stairway of Ahaz, to <u>go back</u> ten steps." So the sun's shadow went <u>back</u> ten steps on the stairway on which it had gone down.

5. A *Psalm* from King Hezekiah (38:9-20)

⁹ A <u>writing</u> of Hezekiah king of Judah after his <u>illness</u> and recovery:

¹⁰ I said, "In the *middle* of **my life** I am to **enter** the **gates of Sheol**; I am to be <u>deprived</u> of the **rest** of *my years*."

¹¹ I said, "I will not <u>see</u> the LORD, the LORD in the land of the *living;* I will <u>look</u> on man *no more* among the **inhabitants** of the **world**.

 ¹² "Like a shepherd's tent my dwelling is pulled up and removed from me; As a weaver I rolled up my life. He cuts me off from the loom; From day until night You make an end of me.

¹³ "I composed my soul until morning.
 Like a lion—so He <u>breaks</u> all my bones,
 from day until night You make an end of me.

¹⁴ "Like a swallow, *like* a crane, so I *twitter;*I *moan* like a dove; my eyes look wistfully to the heights;
O Lord, I am *oppressed*, be *my security*.

¹⁵ "What shall I say?
For He has spoken to me, and He Himself has <u>done it;</u>
I will wander about all my years because of the *bitterness* of my soul.

¹⁶ "O Lord, by *these* things *men* live, and in all these is the *life* of my spirit;
O restore me to <u>health</u> and let *me live!*

¹⁷ "Lo, for *my own* welfare I had great *bitterness;* it is **You** who has <u>kept</u> my soul from the **pit of** *nothingness*, for **You have** *cast* all my sins *behind* Your back.

¹⁸ "For Sheol cannot thank You, death cannot praise You; those who go down to the pit cannot hope for Your faithfulness. ¹⁹ "It is **the living** who **give** <u>thanks</u> to You, as I do today; a father *tells* his sons about <u>Your faithfulness</u>.

²⁰ "The LORD will surely save me; so we will play my songs on stringed instruments all the days of our life at the house of the LORD."

6. A *Prescription* for <u>Healing</u> recounted (38:21-22)

²¹ Now **Isaiah** had said, "Let them take a **cake of figs** and *apply it* to the <u>boil</u>, that **he may** <u>recover</u>."

²² Then **Hezekiah** had said, "What is the <u>sign</u> that I shall *go up* to the house of the LORD?"

Personal Application Hezekiah's Psalm—I think Many of Us can <u>Relate</u> to it

1. Like *Hezekiah*, I think many of us can **relate** to **receiving** a **blunt message** of **bad news**.

In *those* days **Hezekiah** became <u>mortally ill</u>. And **Isaiah the prophet...**came to him and said to him, "Thus says **the LORD**, 'Set your **house in** *order*, for you shall <u>die</u> and **not live**." (38:1)

"<u>Bad news</u> travels fast, <u>good news</u> take the scenic route." (Doug Larsen)

2. Like *Hezekiah*, many of us have wondered *why* those who <u>walk</u> <u>righteously</u>, have to face severe <u>sickness</u> or <u>tragedy</u>. (38:3)

Then Hezekiah...prayed to the LORD,

and said, "**Remember now, O LORD**, I *beseech* You, how I have **walked before You** in *truth* and with a *whole heart*, and have **done** what is *good* in **Your sight**." And **Hezekiah** *wept bitterly*.

<u>Many</u> are the *afflictions* of the <u>righteous</u>, But **the Lord** *delivers* him out of them all. (Psalm 34:19) 3. Like *Hezekiah*, I think we all **anguish** over hearing of a <u>life cut</u> <u>short</u> in its **prime**.

I **(Hezekiah)** said, "In the <u>middle</u> of **my life** I am to enter the **gates of Sheol**; I am to be *deprived* of the <u>rest</u> of **my years**."(37:10)

Like *Hezekiah*, I think many of us for various reasons, are *fearful* of <u>death</u>, and do not readily *desire* to be "cut off" from life in this world. (38:11, 16, 18-19)

My **heart** is in **anguish** within me, And the **terrors of <u>death</u> have fallen upon me**. (Psalm 55:4)

5. Like *Hezekiah*, I believe *we all* to a certain degree, have <u>regrets</u> about *unaccomplished* things in our lives. (38:10, 19)

"Most Christians are being crucified on a cross between two thieves: Yesterday's <u>regret</u> and tomorrow's <u>worries</u>." — Warren W. Wiersbe

6. Like *Hezekiah*, some of us have **suffered great** <u>physical</u> pain and <u>spiritual</u> anguish due to sickness and other tragic events. (38:9-13)

Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I *am* <u>pining away;</u> <u>Heal me</u>, O LORD, for my bones are *dismayed.* (Psalm 6:2)

 Like *Hezekiah*, almost all of us have experienced the blessing of having been <u>healed</u> of severe *sickness* and *pain*— we can relate to his joyful praise to God. (38:20)

> "The LORD will surely save me; so we will play my songs on stringed instruments all *the* days of our life at the house of the LORD."(38:20)

O LORD my God,

I cried to You for *help*, and You <u>healed</u> me...

Weeping may last for the *night,* But a **shout of** <u>ioy</u> *comes* in the *morning*. (Psalm 30:2, 5b)

8. Like *Hezekiah*, some of us can relate to God giving a friend or loved one *additional* years of <u>life</u>. (38:4-5)
