V. Isaiah's *Description* of the Fourteenth Year of King Hezekiah (36:1-39:8)

E. The *Thoughtless* <u>Vanity</u> of <u>King Hezekiah</u> (39:1-8)

1. A *Pompous* show of Wealth (39:1-2)

39 At that time **Merodach-baladan** son of Baladan, king of **Babylon**, sent **letters** and a **present** to **Hezekiah**, for he heard that he had been **sick** and had *recovered*.

² Hezekiah was pleased, and <u>showed</u> them all his treasure house, the *silver* and the *gold* and the *spices* and the *precious oil* and his *whole armory* and <u>all</u> that was found in his *treasuries.*

There was **nothing** in his **house** nor in <u>all</u> his **dominion** that **Hezekiah** did not <u>show</u> them.

2. A Personal Inquiry (39:3-4)

³ Then **Isaiah the prophet** came to **King Hezekiah** and said to him, "*What* did these **men** say, and from *where* have they come to you?"

And **Hezekiah** said, "They have come to me from a far country, from **<u>Babylon</u>**."

⁴ He said, "*What* have they seen in your house?" So Hezekiah answered,
"They have seen <u>all</u> that is in my house;
there is nothing among my treasuries that I have *not* shown them."

3. A Prophetic Judgment (39:5-8)

⁵ Then **Isaiah** said to **Hezekiah**,

"Hear the word of the LORD of hosts,

⁶ 'Behold, the days are coming when <u>all</u> that is in your house and <u>all</u> that your fathers have laid up in store to this day will be <u>carried</u> to Babylon; *nothing* will be left,' says the LORD.

⁷ 'And some of your <u>sons</u> who will issue from you, whom you will beget, will be <u>taken away</u>, and they will become officials in the palace of the king of Babylon."

⁸ Then Hezekiah said to Isaiah, "The word of the LORD which you have spoken is good." For he thought, "For there will be peace and truth in my days."

Personal Application A King's <u>Vanity</u>—A Prophetic <u>Judgment</u> Biblical *Exhortations* to *those* who "Boast" in their wealth, power, and wisdom→

→ Thus says the LORD, "Let not a wise man <u>boast</u> of his wisdom, and let not the mighty man <u>boast</u> of his might, let not a rich man <u>boast</u> of his riches;

but let him who **boasts** <u>boast</u> of this, that he **understands** and *knows Me*, that I am the LORD who exercises lovingkindness, justice and **righteousness** on earth; for I *delight* in these things," declares the LORD. (Jeremiah 9:23-24)

→ In the wilderness He <u>fed you</u> (Israel) manna which your fathers did not know, that He might humble you and that He might test you, to do good for you in the end.

Otherwise, you may **say** in **your** *heart*, '<u>My</u> power and the strength of <u>my</u> hand made me this <u>wealth</u>.'

But you shall **remember** the **LORD your God**, for it is **He** who is **giving you power** to **make** <u>wealth</u>, that **He** may confirm **His covenant** which **He swore** to **your fathers**, as *it is* **this day**. (Deuteronomy 8:16-18)

→ Instruct those who are <u>rich</u> in this present world <u>not</u> to be <u>conceited</u> or to fix their hope on the *uncertainty* of riches, but on <u>God</u>, who richly supplies us with all things to enjoy.

Instruct them to **do good**, to be **rich** in **good works**, to be **generous** and ready to **share**,

storing up for themselves the treasure of a good *foundation* for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is <u>life</u> indeed.

(II Timothy 6:16-19)

→ Do not <u>boast</u> about *tomorrow*, For you do not know what a day may *bring forth*.

Let *another* praise you, and <u>not</u> your *own mouth*; A stranger, and <u>not</u> your *own lips*. (Proverbs 27:1-2)

→ Riches do <u>not</u> profit in the day of <u>wrath</u>, But righteousness *delivers* from death. (Proverbs 11:4)

→ He who *trusts* in his riches will <u>fall</u>, But the *righteous* will <u>flourish</u> like the *green* leaf. (Proverbs 11:28)

A rich man's *wealth* is his strong city, And like a high <u>wall</u> in his own <u>imagination</u>. (Proverbs 18:11)

→ Furthermore, as for every man to whom God has <u>given</u> riches and wealth, He has also empowered him to eat from them and to receive his reward and rejoice in his labor; this is the <u>gift of God</u>. (Ecclesiastes 5:19)

→ so that, just as it is written, "LET HIM WHO BOASTS, BOAST IN THE LORD." (I Corinthians 1:31)

A Final Example of "Boasting"

→ "All *this* happened to <u>Nebuchadnezzar</u> the king.

Twelve months later he was walking on the roof of the royal palace of Babylon.

The king *reflected* and said, 'Is this not **Babylon the** *great*, which <u>I myself</u> have *built* as a **royal residence** by the *might* of <u>my power</u> and for the *glory* of <u>my majesty</u>?'

While the word was in the king's mouth, a voice came from heaven, saying,

'King Nebuchadnezzar, to you it is declared: sovereignty has been <u>removed</u> from you,

and you will be *driven away* from mankind, and your dwelling place *will* be with the <u>beasts</u> of the field.

You will be given grass to eat like cattle,

and **seven periods** of time will pass over you **until you recognize** that the **Most High** is <u>ruler</u> over the **realm of mankind** and **bestows it** on **whomever** <u>He wishes</u>.'

Immediately the word concerning Nebuchadnezzar was *fulfilled;* and he was driven away from mankind and began *eating grass* like cattle,

> and his **body** was *drenched* with the **dew of heaven** until his **hair** had *grown* like **eagles**' *feathers* and his **nails** like **birds**' *claws*.

"But at the <u>end</u> of that period, I, Nebuchadnezzar, raised *my eyes* toward heaven and *my reason* returned to me, and I blessed the Most High and *praised* and *honored Him* who lives forever; (Daniel 4:28-34)
