<sup>2</sup> In *that day* the <u>Branch</u> of the LORD will be *beautiful* and *glorious*, and the <u>fruit</u> of the earth *will be* the *pride* and the *adornment* of the survivors of Israel.

<sup>3</sup> It will come about that he who is *left* in Zion and remains in Jerusalem will be called <u>holy</u> everyone who is *recorded for life* in Jerusalem.

<sup>4</sup>When the **Lord** has <u>washed away</u> the filth of the daughters of Zion and <u>purged</u> the *bloodshed* of Jerusalem from her midst, by the *spirit* of judgment and the *spirit* of burning,

5 then the LORD will create over the whole area of Mount Zion and over her assemblies a cloud by day, even smoke, and the brightness of a flaming fire by night; for over all the glory will be a canopy.

<sup>6</sup> There will be a <u>shelter</u> to *give* shade from the heat by *day*, and *refuge* and *protection* from the storm and the rain.

# The *Characteristics* of the **Messianic** Kingdom {A Summary}

### **Previously** we **learned** that:

- A. During the **Messianic** *Kingdom*, the nation of **Israel** will be **preeminent** among the nations, and **Jerusalem**, particularly the "mountain" of the house of the LORD (the **Temple mount**), will be established as the *governing authority* in the **Kingdom** (2:2).
- B. During the **Messianic** *Kingdom*, all the **nations** will seek to "**go up**" to the **mountain** of the **LORD**, to the **house** of the **God of Jacob** (3:3a). They will "**stream**" into **Jerusalem** →
  - → That He may <u>teach us</u> concerning His ways
    → And that we may <u>walk</u> in His paths."
    - → For the <u>law</u> will **go forth** from *Zion*And the <u>word</u> of the LORD from *Jerusalem*. (3:3b)
- C. During the **Messianic** *Kingdom*, **God** will "judge between the **nations** (2:4a)." **He** will **render** <u>decisions</u> for **many peoples** (2:4b)."

Let the **field exult**, and all that is in it.

Then all the **trees** of the forest will **sing for joy**Before the **LORD**, for **He is coming**,

For **He** is **coming** to **judge the earth**.

**He** will <u>judge</u> the **world** in *righteousness*And the **peoples** in **His** *faithfulness*. (Psalm 96:12-13)

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Then a **shoot** will **spring** from the **stem of Jesse**, And a **branch** from his roots will **bear fruit**...

And **He** will **delight** in the **fear of the LORD**, And **He** will **not judge** by what **His eyes see**, Nor make a **decision** by what **His ears hear**;

But with *righteousness* He will <u>judge</u> the **poor**, And <u>decide</u> with *fairness* for the *afflicted* of the *earth*; (Isaiah 11:1, 3-4a)

- D. The **Messianic** *Kingdom* will be **characterized** by a **true** and **lasting peace** (2:4b).
  - → "they will hammer their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks (2:4b)"
  - → "Nation will <u>not</u> lift up <u>sword</u> against nation (2:4c),"
  - → "and *never again* will they <u>learn war</u> (2:4c)."

#### Tonight we learned that:

E. In the *Kingdom*, the **Messiah**, the "<u>Branch</u> of the LORD," will be "beautiful and glorious (4:2a)."In the *Kingdom*, the Messiah, the "<u>fruit</u> of the earth," will be the "pride and the adornment" of the surviving <u>remnant</u> of Israel (4:2b).

May there be **abundance of grain** in the **earth** on top of the **mountains**; Its **fruit** will **wave** like **the cedars of Lebanon**; And may **those** from the city **flourish** like **vegetation** of the **earth**.

May *his* name endure *forever*;
May *his* name increase as long as the sun *shines*;
And let *men* <u>bless themselves</u> by <u>him</u>;
Let all nations call *him* blessed. (Psalm 72:16-17)

For my eyes (Simeon) have seen Your <u>salvation</u>,... A **LIGHT OF REVELATION** TO THE **GENTILES**, And the <u>glory</u> of Your people <u>Israel</u>." (Luke 2:30, 32)

- F. In the *Kingdom*, the surviving <u>remnant</u>, those who are "left in Zion," and remain in Jerusalem will be characterized by <u>holiness</u>—"everyone who is *recorded* for <u>life</u> in Jerusalem (4:3)."
- G. During the establishment of the *Kingdom*, the **Lord** will <u>wash away</u> the **filth**, and <u>cleanse</u> (cast out) the bloodshed of Jerusalem through the <u>Spirit</u> of *judgment* and the <u>Spirit</u> of *burning*—a fire that *sifts* and *refines*.

"But who can endure **the day of** *His coming*? And who can stand when *He appears*? For *He* is like a **refiner**'s **fire** and like **fullers**' **soap**.

He will sit as a smelter and purifier of silver, and He will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, so that they may present to the LORD offerings in righteousness." (Malachi 3:2-3).

"As for **me** (John the Baptist), **I baptize you** with **water for repentance**, but <u>He</u> who is **coming** after me is **mightier than I,..**<u>He</u> will **baptize you** with the **Holy Spirit** and <u>fire...</u>

and <u>He</u> will thoroughly clear His threshing floor, and <u>He</u> will gather His wheat into the barn, but <u>He</u> will <u>burn up</u> the chaff with unquenchable fire." (Matthew 3:10-13)

H. In the *Kingdom*, the LORD will create a "<u>cloud</u> by day," and "a flaming <u>fire</u> by night" over the whole area of Mount Zion. Over the "glory' will be a *canopy*, and a *shelter* to give protection from heat and rainstorms (4:5-6) (see Isa. 25:4)

### The "Branch" of the LORD A Messianic Title

In *that day* the **Branch** of the LORD will be *beautiful* and *glorious*,.. (4:2) Then a **shoot** will **spring** from the **stem of Jesse**, And a branch from his roots will bear fruit... But with *righteousness* He will *judge* the poor, And decide with fairness for the afflicted of the earth; And He will strike the earth with the rod of His mouth, And with the breath of His lips He will slay the wicked. (Isaiah 11:1, 4) \_\_\_\_\_ "Behold, the days are coming," declares the LORD, "When I will raise up for David a righteous Branch; And **He** will **reign** as **king** and act **wisely** And do *justice* and *righteousness* in the land. (Jeremiah 23:5) In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch of David to spring forth; and He shall execute justice and righteousness on the earth. (Jeremiah 33:15) Then say to him (Joshua the high priest), 'Thus says the LORD of hosts, "Behold, a man whose name is Branch, for **He** will **branch out** from **where He is**; and He will build the temple of the LORD. " (Zechariah 6:12-13) -----I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star." (Revelation 22:16)

"I, Jesus, have sent My angel to testify to you these things for the churches.

What is the **name** of **King Messiah**? R. Abba bar Kahana said: "LORD [Adonai] is his name, for it is written, I will raise unto **David a righteous Shoot**...and this is the **name**. whereby he shall be called: The Lord is our righteousness.(Jer. 23:5-6)."

R. Y'hoshu'a said: "SHOOT [Tzemah] is his name, for it is written, Behold a man whose name is **Shoot** and who shall **shoot up** out of his place and build the Temple of the Lord (Zech. 6:12)."

The Messiah is called by eight names: Yinnon, Tzemah (Shoot), Pele ["Miracle"], Yo'etz ["Counselor"], Mashiach ["Messiah"], El ["God"], Gibbor ["Hero"], and Avi'Ad Shalom [Eternal Father of Peace"]. (**The Messiah Texts**, Raphael Patai, pgs.21-22)
