4. **Israel's** *Restoration* from **Babylonian Exile** (43:14-21)

¹⁴ Thus says the LORD your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel, "For your sake I have sent to <u>Babylon</u>, and will bring them all down as fugitives,

Even the **Chaldeans**, into the **ships** in which they **rejoice**.

¹⁵ "I am the LORD, your Holy One, the Creator of Israel, your King."

¹⁶ Thus says **the LORD**, **Who** makes **a way** through the **sea** and a **path** through the **mighty waters**,

17 Who brings forth the *chariot* and the *horse*, the *army* and the *mighty man* (They will **lie down together** and **not** rise again;

They have been *quenched* and *extinguished* like a **wick**):

¹⁸ "Do not call to mind the **former things**, or ponder things of the **past.**

¹⁹ "Behold, **I will do** something <u>new</u>, now it will **spring forth**; will you not **be aware** of it?

I will even make a *roadway* in the wilderness. *rivers* in the desert.

²⁰ "The beasts of the field will *glorify Me*, the jackals and the ostriches, because I have given <u>waters</u> in the wilderness and rivers in the desert, to give drink to <u>My chosen people</u>.

²¹ "The **people** whom **I formed** for **Myself** will **declare My praise**.

5. Israel's *Recalcitrance* Recalled (43:22-28)

²² "Yet you have <u>not</u> called on Me, O Jacob; but you have become weary of Me, O Israel.

23 "You have <u>not</u> brought to **Me** the **sheep** of your **burnt offerings**, <u>nor</u> have you **honored Me** with your **sacrifices**.

I have **not** burdened you with **offerings**, nor wearied you with incense.

24 "You have bought Me no sweet cane with money, nor have you filled Me with the fat of your sacrifices; rather you have burdened Me with your sins, you have wearied Me with your iniquities.

²⁵ "I, even I, am the one who *wipes out* your transgressions for My own sake, and I will not *remember* your sins.

²⁶ "Put **Me in remembrance**, let us *argue* our case together; state your *cause*, that you may be *proved* right.

²⁷ "Your first forefather sinned, and your <u>spokesmen</u> have *transgressed* against **Me.**

²⁸ "So I will **pollute** the <u>princes</u> of the **sanctuary**, and I will **consign Jacob** to the **ban** and **Israel to** *revilement*.

6. Israel's *Revival* Predicted (44:1-5)

44 "But now *listen*, **O** Jacob, **My servant**, and **Israel**, whom I have *chosen*:

²Thus says **the Lord** who **made you** and **formed you** from the **womb**, who will **help you**, 'Do **not fear, O Jacob My servant**; and you **Jeshurun** whom I have **chosen**.

³ 'For I will pour out <u>water</u> on the thirsty *land* and streams on the dry ground;

I will pour out My <u>Spirit</u> on your offspring and My *blessing* on your descendants;

⁴ and they will **spring up** among the **grass** like **poplars** by streams of **water**.'

⁵ "This **one** will say, 'I am the LORD'S'; and that **one** will **call** on the **name** of **Jacob**;

and **another** will **write** *on* his **hand**, 'Belonging to the LORD,' and will **name Israel's name** with **honor**.

Personal Application Tonight we read that God declared to Israel:

"Behold, I will do something new," (43:19a), Also,

earlier in **Isaiah**, **God** declared that **He** would **do** "new things." (42:9) As **believers**, *we too* have been **blessed** with "new things" from **God**—

1. We are a part of a "New creation" in Messiah

Therefore if anyone is *in Messiah*, *he is* a <u>new creature</u>; the <u>old</u> things passed away; behold, <u>new</u> things have come. (II Corinthians 5:17)

2. We have received the Blessings of a "New Covenant"

...but **our adequacy** is from **God**, who made us **adequate** as **servants** of a **New Covenant**...(II Corinthians 3:6a)

But now **He (Messiah)** has obtained a *more* excellent ministry, by as much as **He** is also the **mediator** of a *better* <u>covenant</u>, which has been enacted on *better* promises.

(Hebrews 8:6)

3. We now have a "New Relationship" to God

For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified...

Therefore, **brethren**, since we have **confidence**to enter the **holy place** by the **blood of Jesus**,
by a **new and living way**which **He inaugurated** for us **through the** veil, that is, **His** flesh,

and since we have a **great priest** over the **house of God**, let us **draw near** with a sincere heart in **full assurance of** <u>faith</u>,... (Hebrews 10:14, 19-22a)

But now **we** have been **released** from the **Law**, having **died** to that by which we were **bound**,

so that **we serve** in <u>newness</u> of the <u>Spirit</u> and **not** in **oldness** of the <u>letter</u>. (Romans 7:6)

4. We (Jews and Gentiles) are now one "New Man" in Messiah

For **He Himself (Messiah)** is **our peace**, who made **both groups** (**Jews** and **Gentiles**) **into one** and broke down the **barrier** of the **dividing wall**, by abolishing in **His flesh** the **enmity**,..

so that *in* **Himself He** might make the **two** into **one** *new* **man**, *thus* establishing **peace**, and might **reconcile** them both in **one body to God** through **the cross**,...(Ephesians 2:14-16)

5. We have been promised a <u>New Heavens</u> and a <u>New Earth</u>

"For, behold, I *create* <u>new</u> heavens and a <u>new</u> earth; and the **former things** shall **not** be **remembered** or come to mind." (Isaiah 65:17)

Then I (John) saw a <u>new</u> heaven and a <u>new</u> earth; for the first heaven and the first earth passed away, and there is no longer any sea.

And I saw the **holy city**, <u>new Jerusalem</u>, coming down out of **heaven** from **God**, made ready as a **bride** adorned for her **husband**...

And **He** who sits on the **throne** said, "Behold, **I am** making **all things** <u>new</u>." (Revelation 21:1-2, 5a)

6. We, as believers, have many reasons to sing to God a "New Song"

Sing to Him a new song; play skillfully with a shout of joy. (Psalm 33:3)

Sing to the LORD a <u>new song</u>; sing to the LORD, all the earth. (Psalm 96:1)

O sing to the LORD a <u>new song</u>, for **He** has done wonderful things, (Psalm 98:1)

And they sang a <u>new song</u>, saying,

"Worthy are You (the Lamb) to take the book and to break its seals;
for You were slain, and purchased for God with Your blood
men from every tribe and tongue and people and nation..."

(Revelation 5:9)
