7. Israel's *Redeemer*—His <u>Unique</u> Position and **Sovereign** <u>Power</u> (44:6-28)

a. A *Declaration* of God's <u>Uniqueness</u> (44:6-8)

⁶ "Thus says **the LORD**, the **King of Israel** and his **Redeemer**, the **LORD of hosts**:

'I am the *first* and I am the *last*, and there is **no God** besides **Me**.

7 'Who is like Me? Let him proclaim and declare it; yes, let him recount it to Me in order, from the time that I established the ancient nation.

And let them **declare** to them the **things** that are **coming** and the **events** that are going to **take place**.

⁸ 'Do *not* tremble and do *not* be afraid; Have I not long since announced *it* to you and declared *it*?

And you are **My witnesses**.

Is there **any God** besides **Me**,

or is there any *other* **Rock**?

I know of **none**."

b. A *Description* of the Folly of <u>Idolatry</u> (44:9-20)

⁹ Those who fashion a graven image are all of them <u>futile</u>, and their precious things are of <u>no profit</u>; even their own witnesses fail to see or know, so that they will be put to shame.

Who has fashioned a god or cast an idol to no profit?
 Behold, all his companions will be put to shame,
 for the craftsmen themselves are mere men.

Let them all assemble themselves, let them stand up, let them tremble, let them together be **put to** *shame*.

¹² The man shapes <u>iron</u> into a cutting tool and does his work over the coals, fashioning it with hammers and working it with his strong arm. He also gets hungry and his strength fails; he drinks no water and becomes weary.

13 Another **shapes** wood, he extends a measuring line; he outlines it with red chalk.

He works it with planes and outlines it with a compass, and makes it like the **form** of a *man*, like the **beauty** of *man*, so that it may **sit** in a **house**.

¹⁴ Surely he cuts **cedars** for himself, and takes a **cypress** or an **oak** and raises *it* for himself among the trees of the forest. He plants a **fir**, and **the rain** makes it **grow**.

15 Then it becomes something for a man to burn, so he takes one of them and warms himself; he also makes a fire to bake bread.

He also makes <u>a god</u> and *worships it*; he makes it a **graven image** and *falls down* before it...

18 They do *not know*, <u>nor</u> do they *understand*, for **He** has **smeared over** their <u>eyes</u> so that they *cannot see* and their **hearts** so that they *cannot comprehend*...

c. A *Divine* promise of Israel's <u>Redemption</u> (44:21-28)

21 "Remember these things, O Jacob, and Israel, for you are My servant,
 I have formed you, you are My servant,
 O Israel, you will not be forgotten by Me.

²² "I have <u>wiped out</u> your *transgressions* like a thick cloud and your *sins* like a heavy mist.

Return to Me, for I have <u>redeemed</u> you."

²³ Shout for <u>ioy</u>, *O heavens*, for the **LORD** has done *it*! Shout <u>joyfully</u>, you **lower parts** of the *earth*; Break forth into a shout of **joy**, you *mountains*,

O forest, and every tree in it;
For the LORD has redeemed Jacob and in Israel He shows forth His glory.

²⁴ Thus says **the LORD**, your <u>Redeemer</u>, and the **one** who **formed you** from the **womb**,

"I, the LORD, am the <u>maker</u> of all things, stretching out the heavens by Myself and spreading out the earth all alone,

²⁵ Causing the omens of boasters to fail, making fools out of diviners, causing wise men to draw back and turning their knowledge into foolishness,

²⁶ Confirming the word of His <u>servant</u> and *performing* the purpose of His <u>messengers</u>.

It is I who says of Jerusalem, 'She shall be inhabited!'
And of the cities of Judah, 'They shall be built.'
And I will raise up her ruins again.

²⁷ "It is I who says to the **depth** of the **sea**, 'Be **dried up!**' And I will make your rivers dry.

²⁸ "It is I who says of <u>Cyrus</u>, 'He is **My shepherd**! And he will perform all **My desire**.'

And he declares of **Jerusalem**, 'She will **be built**,' And of the **temple**, 'Your **foundation** will **be laid**.'"

Message Summary God Declares to the World, "I AM" (He)

- → "I Am" the King of Israel and his Redeemer, the LORD of hosts (44:6a).
- → "I Am" uniquely God, the Eternal One.

"I am the <u>first</u> and I am the <u>last</u>, and there is <u>no God</u> besides Me. (44:6b)"

→ "I Am" *sovereign* over the **events of** <u>History</u>—<u>declaring</u> them, and **bringing** them <u>to pass</u>.

'Who is like Me? Let him *proclaim* and *declare it*, yes, let him **recount it** to Me in **order**, from the **time** that <u>I established</u> the **ancient nation**.

And let them *declare* to them the things that <u>are coming</u> and the **events** that are going to **take place**.(44:7)

→ "I Am" God, and there is <u>no other God</u> besides <u>Me</u>, and there is no other <u>Rock</u> (44:8).

Is there any <u>God</u> besides **Me**, or is there any **other** Rock? I know of **none**."

Those who fashion a <u>graven image</u> are all of them *futile*, and their <u>precious things</u> are of *no profit*; even their <u>own witnesses</u> *fail* to <u>see</u> or <u>know</u>, so that they will be <u>put to shame</u>. (44:8b-9)

→ "I Am" Israel's Great Redeemer:

- → Who has "formed" Israel to be His servant (44:21)
- → Who has wiped out Israel's transgressions (44:22)
- → *Who* establishes <u>joy</u> throughout <u>creation</u> with the <u>redemption</u> of Israel (44:23)
- \rightarrow *Who* is the <u>Creator</u> of all things (44:24)
- → Who makes foolish the wisdom of the wise (44:25)
- → Who has promised the restoration of Jerusalem and Judah (44:26)
- → Who has declared <u>Cyrus</u> to be **His "shepherd**," and **instrument** to rebuild **Jerusalem**, and lay the **foundation** of the **temple** (44:28)

Personal Application

Israel's Great Redeemer—Our Great Redeemer

In **Him (Jesus)** we have <u>redemption</u> through <u>His blood</u>, the *forgiveness* of our trespasses, according to the <u>riches</u> of <u>His grace</u>...(Ephesians 1:7)

... knowing that you were **not** <u>redeemed</u> with <u>perishable things</u> like <u>silver or gold</u> from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers, but with <u>precious blood</u>, as of a <u>lamb</u> <u>unblemished</u> and <u>spotless</u>, the <u>blood</u> of <u>Messiah</u>. (I Peter 1:18-19)

But when **Messiah appeared** as a **high priest** of the **good things** to come, He entered through the **greater** and **more perfect tabernacle**, **not** made with **hands**, that is to say, **not** of **this creation**;

and <u>not</u> through the **blood** of **goats** and **calves**, but through **His own <u>blood</u>**, **He entered** the **holy place** *once for all*, having obtained **eternal redemption**. (Hebrews 9:11-12)
