¹⁴ Thus says the LORD, "The products of *Egypt* and the merchandise of *Cush* and the *Sabeans*, men of stature, will come over to you and will be <u>yours</u>;

They will **walk** *behind you*, they will come over **in** *chains* and will *bow down* to **you**; they will make *supplication* to you: 'Surely, **God** is *with you*, and there is **none else**, **no other God**.'''

> ¹⁵ Truly, You are a God who <u>hides</u> Himself, O God of Israel, Savior!

b. The *Shame* of the *Idol-makers* (45:16-17)

¹⁶ They will be put to <u>shame</u> and even *humiliated*, all of them; the *manufacturers* of <u>idols</u> will go away together in *humiliation*.

> ¹⁷ Israel has been saved by the LORD with an *everlasting* salvation;

You will not be put to shame or humiliated to all eternity.

- c. The *Superiority* of our <u>God and Savior</u> (45:18-25)
 - 1) *Who* has "formed" the earth to be inhabited (45:18)
 - 2) *Who* has revealed *openly* His righteous will (45:19)
 - 3) *Who*, unlike **dumb idols**, has <u>predicted</u> what will be from **long ago** (45:20-21)
 - 4) *Who* desires that **all men** <u>repent</u> and be <u>saved</u> (45:22)
 - 5) *Who* has "sworn" that all will <u>submit</u> to Him (45:23)
 - 6) *Who* has declared that, "only <u>in the Lord</u>," will men receive righteousness, strength, justification, and glory (45:24-25)

¹⁸ For thus says **the LORD**, who **created the heavens**

(He is the God who *formed* the earth and *made it,* He established it and did <u>not</u> create it a *waste* place, *but* formed it to be inhabited),

"I am the LORD, and there is none else.

¹⁹ "I have <u>not</u> spoken in secret, in some dark land; I did not say to the offspring of Jacob, 'Seek Me in a waste place';

I, the LORD, speak *righteousness*, declaring things that are *upright*.

²⁰ "Gather yourselves and come; Draw near together, you fugitives of the <u>nations;</u>

They have *no knowledge*, who carry about their wooden **idol** and **pray** to a **god** who *cannot save*.

²¹ "Declare and set forth *your case*; indeed, let them consult together. Who has announced this from of old? Who has long since declared it?

> Is it not I, the LORD? And there is *no* other God besides Me, a <u>righteous God</u> and a <u>Savior;</u> there is *none* except Me.

²² "<u>Turn to Me</u> and <u>be saved</u>, all the *ends* of the earth; for I am God, and there is *no other*.

²³ "I have sworn by Myself, the word has gone forth from My mouth in righteousness and will <u>not</u> turn back, That to Me every knee will bow, every tongue will swear allegiance. ²⁴ "They will say of Me,
<u>'Only</u> in the LORD are <u>righteousness</u> and <u>strength.</u>" Men will come to Him,
and all who were angry at Him will be put to shame.

²⁵ "*In the LORD* all the offspring of <u>Israel</u> will be <u>justified</u> and will glory."

Our God and Savior—An Intertextual Study

Tonight we read in **Isaiah**:

And there is *no* other God besides Me, a <u>righteous God</u> and a <u>Savior;</u> there is *none* except Me.

²² "<u>Turn to Me</u> and <u>be saved</u>, all the ends of the earth; for I am God, and there is no other...

²⁴ "They will say of **Me**, '<u>Only</u> *in the LORD* are <u>righteousness</u> and <u>strength</u>...'

²⁵ "In the LORD all the offspring of Israel will be justified and will glory." (Isaiah 45:21b-22, 24a, 25)

Our text tonight in **Isaiah** sure **sounds** a lot like **New Testament teaching,** where we read about our **need** for <u>repentance, salvation, righteousness</u>, and <u>justification</u> by faith in Jesus our Savior.

"You yourselves know, from the **first day** that **I (Paul)** set foot in **Asia**, how I was with you the whole time,.. solemnly **testifying** to both <u>Jews</u> and <u>Greeks</u> of <u>repentance</u> toward God and <u>faith</u> in our Lord Jesus the Messiah. (Acts 20:18, 21)

They said, "<u>Believe</u> in the Lord Jesus, and you will be <u>saved</u>, you and your household."(Acts 16:31)

For I am not ashamed of the **gospel**, for it is the **power of God** for <u>salvation</u> to everyone who <u>believes</u>, to the **Jew first** and also to the **Greek**.

For *in it the* <u>righteousness</u> of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "BUT THE RIGHTEOUS *man* SHALL LIVE BY <u>FAITH</u>." (Romans 1:16-17) He (God) made Him (Jesus) who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the <u>righteousness</u> of God <u>in Him</u>. (II Corinthians 5:21)

Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus the Messiah, (Romans 5:1)

A Jewish Question—If <u>God</u> is our Savior, *why* is it that we have to <u>believe</u> in Jesus as our Savior? A twofold answer:

1) Jesus the Messiah is the <u>means</u> by which God would bring <u>salvation</u> to the world, for both Jews and Gentiles.

"For <u>God</u> so *loved* the world, that <u>He gave</u> His only begotten Son, that whoever <u>believes in Him</u> shall not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

In this is **love**, *not* that we **loved God**, but that **He loved us** and **sent His Son** to be the **propitiation** for **our sins**. (I John 4:10)

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men, (Titus 2:11)

2) Jesus, the eternal Son of God, is the manifestation of God our Savior.

For the *grace* of God has <u>appeared</u>, bringing salvation to all men, instructing us...to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age,

looking for the **blessed** *hope* and the *appearing* of the *glory* of our great <u>God and Savior</u>, Messiah Jesus, (Titus 2:11-13)

Now all these things are **from God**, who **reconciled us** to **Himself** *through* **Messiah** namely, that **God** was <u>in Messiah</u> **reconciling** the world to **Himself**, not counting their **trespasses** against them, and **He** has committed to us the **word of reconciliation**. (II Corinthians 5:19)

For <u>in Him</u> (Jesus) all the fullness of <u>Deity</u> dwells in bodily form, (Colossians 2:9)

In the **beginning** was the *Word*, and the *Word* was **with God**, and the *Word* <u>was God</u>...

And the *Word* became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw **His glory, glory** as of the only begotten from the **Father**, full of grace and truth. (John 1:1, 13)
