A. The *Calling* of <u>God's Servant</u> (49:1-12)

B. The *Consolation* of <u>**Zion**</u> (49:13-26)

- 1. A Resounding Praise (49:13)
 - ¹³ Shout for joy, O heavens! And rejoice, O earth! Break forth into joyful shouting, O mountains!

For the LORD has comforted His people and will have compassion on His afflicted.

- 2. A *Rueful* Response (49:14)
 - 14 But Zion said, "The LORD has forsaken me, the Lord has forgotten me."
- 3. A *Reassuring* Love (49:15-16)

15 "Can a woman forget her nursing child and have no compassion on the son of her womb? Even these may forget, but I will not forget you!

- ¹⁶ Behold, I have **inscribed you** on the **palms** of **my hands**; your **walls** are continually **before me**.
- 4. A *Restoration of Zion Promised* (49:17-21)
 - a. Her children regathered, and destroyers departed (49:17-18)
 - b. *Her* desolate land to be overpopulated (49:19)
 - c. *Her* barren and exiled condition reversed (49:20-21)

¹⁷ "Your *builders* hurry; your *destroyers* and *devastators* will **depart** from **you**.

¹⁸ "Lift up your **eyes** and **look around**;

all of them **gather together**, they **come to you**.

As I live," declares the LORD, "You will surely put on all of them as *jewels* and bind them on as a *bride*.

19 "For your waste and desolate places and your destroyed land— Surely now you will be *too cramped* for the inhabitants, and <u>those</u> who swallowed you will be *far away*.

²⁰ "The **children** of whom you were **bereaved** will yet say in your ears, 'The place is **too cramped** for me; **make room** for me that I may **live here.**'

²¹ "Then you will say in your heart, 'Who has begotten these for me, since I have been bereaved of my children and am barren, an exile and a wanderer?

And **who** has **reared these**?
Behold, I was **left alone**; from **where** did **these come**?"

5. A *Reverence* from the <u>Nations</u> (49:22-23)

²² Thus says **the Lord GoD**,

"Behold, I will lift up **My hand** to the **nations** and set up **My standard** to the **peoples**;

and they will **bring your sons** in *their* **bosom**, and **your** *daughters* will be carried on *their* **shoulders**.

²³ "Kings will be your guardians, and their princesses your nurses.

They will **bow down** to you with their **faces** to the **earth** and **lick the dust** of your **feet**; and **you will know** that **I am the LORD**; those who hopefully **wait for Me** will **not** be **put to shame**.

6. A *Ravaging* of Israel's <u>Oppressors</u> (49:24-26)

²⁴ "Can the <u>prey</u> be *taken* from the <u>mighty man</u>, or the <u>captives</u> of a **tyrant** be *rescued*?"

²⁵ Surely, thus says the LORD,

"Even the captives of the mighty man will be taken away, and the prey of the tyrant will be rescued; for I will contend with the one who contends with you, and I will save your sons.

²⁶ "I will **feed your oppressors** with their **own flesh**, and they will become **drunk** with their **own blood** as with sweet wine:

and **all flesh** will **know** that **I, the Lord**, am **your <u>Savior</u>** and **your <u>Redeemer</u>**, the <u>Mighty One</u> of Jacob."

Personal Application

Like Israel, do **you** sometimes feel *Forsaken* and *Forgotten*?

But **Zion** said, "**The Lord** has **forsaken me**, the Lord has **forgotten me**." (49:14)

Like Israel, we are His Children, His Sons, and He Assures Us of His Great Love

For my father and my mother have forsaken me, But the LORD will take me up. (Psalm 27:10)

He (Messiah) came to His own (the Jews), and those who were His own did not receive Him.

But **as many** as <u>received</u> Him, to **them** He gave the **right** to become **children of God**, even to those who **believe** in **His name**, (John 1:11-12)

For you are all sons of God through faith in Messiah Jesus. (Galatians 3:26)

See how **great a <u>love</u>** the **Father** has bestowed **on us**, that **we** would be called **children of God**; and *such* **we are.**

For this reason the world does **not** know us, because it did **not** know Him. (I John 3:1)

But **God**, being **rich in mercy**, because of **His great love** with which **He loved us**,

even when we were *dead* in our transgressions, made us alive together *with* Messiah (by grace you have been saved), (Ephesians 2:4-5)

and you have forgotten the exhortation which is addressed to you as sons,

"MY SON, DO NOT REGARD LIGHTLY THE DISCIPLINE OF THE LORD,
NOR FAINT WHEN YOU ARE REPROVED BY HIM;
FOR THOSE WHOM THE LORD LOVES HE DISCIPLINES,
AND HE SCOURGES EVERY SON WHOM HE RECEIVES."

It is for *discipline* that you endure; God deals with you as with <u>sons</u>; for what **son** is there whom *his* father does *not discipline..*?

All *discipline* for the moment seems *not* to **be joyful**, but **sorrowful**; yet to those who have been *trained* by it, afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of <u>righteousness</u>.

(Hebrews 12:5-7, 11)

Who will separate us from the <u>love</u> of Messiah? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?...

But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us.

For I am **convinced** that neither **death**, nor **life**, nor **angels**, nor **principalities**, nor things **present**, nor things **to come**, nor **powers**,

nor **height**, nor **depth**, nor any other **created thing**, will be able to **separate us** from the **love of God**, which is **in Messiah Jesus our Lord**. (Romans 8:35-39)

For this reason I (Paul) bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its *name*,

that **He** would grant you, according to the **riches** of **His glory**, to be **strengthened with** *power through* **His** <u>Spirit</u> in the **inner man**,

so that **Messiah** may **dwell** in your hearts through **faith**; and that you, being **rooted** and **grounded in love**,

may be able to **comprehend** with all the **saints** what is the **breadth** and **length** and **height** and **depth**,

and to **know** the **love of Messiah** which **surpasses knowledge**, that you may be **filled up** to all the **fullness of God**. (Ephesians 3:14-19)
