Pt. $1 \rightarrow 1$) The **Song** of the **Lord's Vineyard** (5:1-7)

5 Let me **sing** now for **my well-beloved** A **song** of **my beloved** concerning <u>His vineyard</u>

My well-beloved had a vineyard on a fertile hill.

² He dug it all around, removed its stones, And planted it with the *choicest vine*.

And **He built** a **tower** in the middle of it And also **hewed out** a **wine vat** in it;

Then **He expected** *it* to produce *good* grapes, But it **produced** *only* **worthless ones**.

³ "And now, **O** inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, Judge between *Me* and *My vineyard*.

⁴ "What **more** was there **to do** for **My vineyard** that **I have not done** in it? **Why,** when **I expected it** to produce **good grapes** did it produce **worthless ones**?

⁵ "So now **let Me tell you** what I am going to **do** to **My vineyard**:

I will **remove its hedge** and it will **be consumed**; I will **break down its wall** and it will become **trampled ground**.

⁶ "I will **lay it waste**; It will **not** be **pruned** or **hoed**

But *briars* and *thorns* will come up.

I will also **charge** the **clouds** to **rain** <u>no</u> **rain** on it."

⁷ For the <u>vineyard</u> of the **LORD of hosts** is the <u>house of Israel</u>
And the **men of <u>Judah</u> His delightful <u>plant</u>**.

Thus **He looked** for justice, but behold, bloodshed; For righteousness, but behold, a cry of distress.

The New Testament Connection: Messiah's Parable of the Vineyard

(Matthew 21: 33-43)

who PLANTED A <u>VINEYARD</u> AND PUT A <u>WALL</u> AROUND IT AND DUG A <u>WINE PRESS</u> IN IT, AND BUILT A <u>TOWER</u>, and <u>rented it</u> out to <u>vine-growers</u> and went on a <u>journey</u>.

³⁴ When the harvest time approached, he sent his slaves to the vine-growers to receive his produce.

³⁵ The *vine-growers* took *his* slaves and *beat* one, and *killed* another, and *stoned* a third.

³⁶ Again **he** sent **another group** of **slaves** larger than the first; and they did the **same thing** to them.

³⁷ But afterward **he sent** *his* <u>son</u> to them, saying, 'They will **respect my son**.'

³⁸ But when the *vine-growers* saw the <u>son</u>, they said among themselves, 'This is the **heir**; come, let us **kill him** and **seize** *his* **inheritance**.'

³⁹ They took him, and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him.

⁴⁰ Therefore when the **owner** of the **vineyard** comes, **what will** *he do* to those **vine-growers**?"

41 They said to Him,

"He will bring those wretches to a wretched end,
and will rent out the vineyard to other vine-growers
who will pay him the proceeds at the proper seasons..."

the **kingdom of God** will be <u>taken away</u> from **you** and **given** to a **people**, producing the **fruit of it.**

Personal Application Bearing Good Fruit for the Lord

A. Bearing good fruit for God involves being "connected" to the "true vine (the Messiah)" by faith, and walking in obedience to Him as His disciple.

"I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.

Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, He takes away;

and every branch that bears fruit,

He prunes it so that it may bear more fruit.

You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you.

<u>Abide in Me</u>, and <u>I in you</u>. As the branch cannot bear <u>fruit</u> of itself unless it <u>abides</u> in the <u>vine</u>, so neither can you unless you abide in Me.

I am the <u>vine</u>, you are the branches; he who <u>abides</u> in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing...

If you <u>abide</u> in Me, and My <u>words</u> abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is <u>glorified</u> by this, that you bear much <u>fruit</u>, and so prove to be <u>My disciples</u>. (John 15:1-5, 7-8)

B. **Bearing good fruit** involves <u>walking</u> according to the <u>word</u> of the Lord, and growing in the knowledge of God.

How *blessed* is the man who does <u>not walk</u> in the *counsel* of the wicked, <u>nor stand</u> in the *path* of sinners, nor <u>sit</u> in the *seat* of scoffers!

But **his delight** is in the <u>law</u> of the LORD, and in **His law** he *meditates* day and night.

He will be like a tree *firmly* planted by streams of water, which yields its <u>fruit</u> in its season and its <u>leaf</u> does *not wither*; and in whatever he does, he *prospers*. (Psalm 1:1-3)

For this reason also, since the day we heard of it (Your faith), we have not ceased to pray for you and to ask that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding,

so that you will <u>walk</u> in a manner worthy of the Lord, to please *Him* in all respects, <u>bearing fruit</u> in every good work and *increasing* in the knowledge of God; (Colossians 1:9-10)

C. **Bearing** fruit for God involves serving in a new relationship with Him through His Spirit.

Therefore, my brethren, you also were made to *die* to the Law *through* the body of Messiah, so that you might be joined to another, to Him who was raised from the dead, in order that we might bear fruit for God...

But now we have been *released* from the Law, having *died* to that by which we were bound, so that we serve in *newness* of the <u>Spirit</u> and *not* in *oldness* of the <u>letter</u>. (Romans 7:4, 6)

D. **Bearing good fruit** for **God** means having **our lives characterized** by **godliness**, **righteousness**, and the "**fruit**" of the **Spirit**.

But I say, <u>walk</u> by the <u>Spirit</u>, and you will *not* carry out the <u>desire</u> of the <u>flesh...</u>
...the <u>fruit</u> of the <u>Spirit</u> is *love, joy, peace, patience, kindness*,
goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control;
against such things there is no law. (Galatians 5:16, 22-23)

..for **you** were formerly *darkness*,

but **now** you are **Light** in the **Lord**; **walk** as **children of Light** (for the **fruit** of the **Light** consists in all **goodness** and **righteousness** and **truth**), trying to **learn** what is **pleasing** to **the Lord**. (Ephesians 5:8-10)

And this **I pray**, that your *love* may **abound** still more and more in **real** *knowledge* and **all** *discernment*, so that you may **approve** the things that are **excellent**, in order to be **sincere** and **blameless** until the **day of Messiah**;

having been **filled** with the <u>fruit</u> of righteousness which *comes through* **Jesus the Messiah**, to the **glory** and **praise of God**. (Philippians 1:9-11)

E. **Bearing** fruit means that you involved in multiplying disciples through the message and work of evangelism.

I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that often I have planned to **come to you**... so that **I may obtain** some <u>fruit</u> among **you also**, even as among the *rest* of the **Gentiles**. (Romans 1:13)
