C. The *Conditioning* of <u>God's Servant</u> (50:1-11)

1. The *Chastening* of <u>Zion</u> explained (50:1-3)

50 Thus says **the LORD**, **"Where** is the **certificate of** *divorce* by which I have *sent* your **mother away**?

Or to whom of My creditors did I sell you?

Behold, you were <u>sold</u> for your <u>iniquities</u>, and for your <u>transgressions</u> your mother was sent away.

² "Why was there **no man** when *I came*? When *I called*, *why* was there **none** to answer?

Is **My hand so** *short* that it cannot **ransom**? Or **have I** *no power* to **deliver**?

Behold, I dry up the *sea* with My rebuke, I make the *rivers* a wilderness; their fish **stink** for lack of water and die of thirst.

³ "I clothe the *heavens* with blackness and make sackcloth their covering."

2. The *Conditioning* of <u>God's Servant</u> expressed (50:4-6)

- a. His *Discipleship* before God (50:4)
- b. His *Devotion* in the face of suffering (50:5-6)
- c. His Determination to remain faithful (50:7-9)

⁴The Lord GoD has given Me the tongue of <u>disciples</u>, that I may know how to sustain the *weary* one with a <u>word</u>. He awakens Me morning by morning, He awakens My ear to listen as a <u>disciple</u>.

⁵ The Lord GOD has opened *My ear;* and I was <u>not</u> disobedient nor did I turn back.

⁶ I gave **My back** to those who <u>strike *Me*</u>, and **My cheeks** to those who **pluck out** the **beard**; I did *not* cover **My face** from <u>humiliation</u> and <u>spitting</u>.

⁷ For the Lord GoD <u>helps</u> Me, therefore, I am *not* disgraced;

Therefore, I have **set My face** like <u>flint</u>, and I know that I will *not* be ashamed.

⁸ He who vindicates Me is near; who will contend with Me?

Let us **stand up** to **each other**; who has **a case** against **Me**? Let him **draw near** to **Me**.

⁹ Behold, the Lord GoD helps Me; who is he who condemns Me?

Behold, they will all **wear out** like a garment; the moth will **eat them**.

3. The *Charge* to the <u>People</u> exclaimed (50:10-11)

¹⁰ Who is among you that *fears the LORD*, That *obeys* the voice of His servant, That *walks* in darkness and has no light?

Let him trust in the name of the LORD and rely on his God.

¹¹ Behold, all you who **kindle** a *fire,* Who encircle yourselves with *firebrands,*

Walk in the **light** of **your** *fire* and among the *brands* you have **set ablaze**.

This you will have from My hand: you will lie down in torment.

<u>Messianic Prophecy Application</u>– (50:1-11) The Servant of God <u>is</u> Jesus the Messiah (Pt. 2)

1. Just as we read tonight concerning God's *Servant* (50:4a), *Jesus* the Messiah was given "a disciple's tongue," and had a ministry that <u>sustained</u> and <u>comforted</u> the *weary* with His <u>words</u>.

"Come to Me, all who are <u>weary</u> and <u>heavy-laden</u>, and I will give you <u>rest</u>.

Take **My yoke** upon you and **learn from Me**, for I am **gentle** and **humble** in heart, and YOU WILL FIND <u>**REST**</u> FOR YOUR SOULS. (Matthew 11:28-29)

When **Jesus** saw the crowds,...**He** went up on the **mountain**;... **He** opened **His mouth** and began to <u>teach</u> them, saying,

"Blessed are the <u>poor</u> in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
Blessed are those who <u>mourn</u>, for they shall be comforted...
Blessed are those who have been <u>persecuted</u> for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven..." (Matthew 5:1-3, 10)

2. Just as we read tonight concerning God's *Servant* (50:4b), *Jesus* "listened as a <u>disciple</u>," and was <u>taught</u> by God.

So Jesus answered them (the Jews) and said, "My <u>teaching</u> is *not* Mine, but <u>His</u> who sent Me.

If anyone is willing to *do* His will, he will know of the <u>teaching</u>, whether it is of <u>God</u> or *whether* I speak from *Myself*. (John 7:16-17)

3. Just as we read tonight concerning God's *Servant* (50:5), *Jesus* heard and <u>obeyed</u> the voice of God His Father.

Therefore **Jesus answered** and was saying to them (the **Jews**), "Truly, truly, **I say** to you, the **Son** can <u>do</u> **nothing** of **Himself**, unless *it is* something **He sees** the **Father doing**; for whatever the **Father does**, these things the **Son** <u>also does</u> in **like manner**. (John 15:19)

:..but so that the world may know that I love the Father, I <u>do</u> exactly as the Father <u>commanded Me</u>. Get up, let us go from here. (John 14:31)

4. Just as we read regarding God's *Servant* (50:6), *Jesus* the **Messiah** suffered **physical abuse** and **humiliation**.

Then the **high priest** tore his robes and said, "He has **blasphemed**! What further need do we have of **witnesses**? Behold, you have now heard the **blasphemy**:..

Then **they** (the **Sanhedrin**) <u>spat</u> in **His face** and <u>beat Him</u> with their fists; and others <u>slapped Him</u>, (Matthew 26:65, 67) Wishing to satisfy the **crowd** (the Jews), **Pilate** released **Barabbas** for them, and after having **Jesus** <u>scourged</u>, he handed **Him** over to be **crucified**. (Mark 15:15) 5. Just as we read tonight concerning God's *Servant* (50:7-9), *Jesus* was helped by God, and steadfastly <u>trusted</u> that God would <u>vindicate</u> Him.

In the days of **His flesh** (**Messiah**), **He offered up** both <u>prayers</u> and <u>supplications</u> with loud *crying* and *tears* to **the One** able to **save Him** from **death**, and **He** was **heard** because of **His** <u>piety</u>. (Hebrews 5:7)

By common confession, great is the mystery of godliness:

He who was *revealed* in the flesh, was <u>vindicated</u> in the Spirit, seen by angels, proclaimed among the nations, believed on in the world, taken up in glory. (I Timothy 3:16)

Personal Application

As Messiah's disciples, *we too* have a vital ministry to "sustain the weary" with our <u>words</u>.

Anxiety in a man's heart weighs it down, But a <u>good word</u> makes it <u>glad</u>. (Proverbs 12:25)

Pleasant <u>words</u> are a *honeycomb*, <u>Sweet</u> to the **soul** and <u>healing</u> to the **bones**. (Proverbs 16:24)

<u>Death</u> and <u>life</u> are in the **power** of the <u>tongue</u>, And those who **love it** will **eat its fruit**. (Proverbs 18:21)

Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus the Messiah, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who *comforts us* in all our affliction so that <u>we</u> will be able to <u>comfort those</u> who are in any affliction with the *comfort* with which we ourselves are *comforted* by God. (II Corinthians 1:3-4)

Let **no unwholesome** <u>word</u> proceed from your mouth, but only such *a word* as is **good** for <u>edification</u> according to the **need** of the moment, so that it will <u>give grace</u> to those who **hear.** (Ephesians 4:29)

But <u>encourage one another</u> day after day, as long as it is *still* called "Today," so that **none** of you will be **hardened** by the **deceitfulness** of **sin**. (Hebrews 3:13)

The **mouth** of the **righteous** is a **fountain of <u>life</u>**...(Proverbs10:11a)
