 - 1. *Prompting* them to Recall their Divine <u>Origins</u> (51:1-2)
 - ¹"Listen to me, you who pursue *righteousness*, who *seek the LORD*:

 Look to the rock from which *you* were hewn

 and to the quarry from which *you* were dug.
 - ² "Look to <u>Abraham</u> your father and to <u>Sarah</u> who gave *birth* to you in pain; when *he was but* <u>one</u> I called him, then I blessed him and multiplied him."
 - 2. *Predicting* Zion's Future Comfort and Joyful Restoration (51:3)
 - ³ Indeed, the Lord will comfort Zion; He will comfort all her waste places. and her wilderness He will make like Eden, and her desert like the garden of the Lord; Joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and sound of a melody.
 - 3. *Proclaiming* the **Future Coming** of His **Laws of Justice**, His **Righteousness**, and His **Salvation** (51:4-8)
 - 4 "Pay attention to Me, O My people, and give ear to Me, O My nation; for a <u>law</u> will *go forth* from Me, and I will set My justice for a *light* of the peoples.
 - ⁵ "My <u>righteousness</u> is near, My <u>salvation</u> has gone forth, and My arms will *judge* the peoples; the coastlands will wait for Me, and for My <u>arm</u> they will wait expectantly.

⁶ "Lift up your eyes to the sky, then look to the earth beneath; for the sky will vanish like smoke, and the earth will wear out like a garment and its inhabitants will die in like manner;

But My <u>salvation</u> will be *forever*, and My <u>righteousness</u> will **not wane**.

⁷ "Listen to Me, you who know *righteousness*, a people in whose heart is *My law*; do not <u>fear</u> the *reproach* of man, nor be <u>dismayed</u> at their *revilings*.

⁸ "For the **moth** will eat them like a **garment**, and the **grub** will eat them like wool. But **My** <u>righteousness</u> will be *forever*, and **My** <u>salvation</u> to *all generations*."

4. *Praying* for the Lord to *Manifest* His Strong "Arm" (51:9-10)

⁹ Awake, awake, put on <u>strength</u>, O <u>arm</u> of the LORD; awake as in the *days of old*, the generations of long ago.

Was it not You who cut Rahab in pieces, who pierced the dragon?

Was it not **You** who **dried up** the **sea**, the **waters** of the **great deep**; Who made the **depths** of the **sea** a **pathway** for the **redeemed** to **cross over?**

5. *Portraying* their **Triumphant** and **Joyful Return** to **Zion** (51:11)

¹¹ So the <u>ransomed</u> of the LORD will return and come with joyful shouting to Zion, and everlasting joy will be on their heads.

They will obtain **gladness and** *joy*, and *sorrow* and *sighing* will **flee away**.

Personal Application

A. Tonight *we read* that the **Lord** exhorted the **righteous remnant** of **Israel (Zion)** to "look to" their humble <u>origins</u> (**Abraham** and **Sarah**), and **consider** how **He** had <u>blessed</u> and <u>multiplied them</u> (51:1-2).

As **believers**, *we too* should "look back" and **reflect** on the *multitude* of **spiritual** <u>blessings</u> that we have that have their <u>origins</u> also from <u>Abraham</u>, for *though* him came the <u>Messiah</u>, the **promised** "seed" that would bless all nations (Gen. 12:3)

For you are all <u>sons</u> of God through faith in Messiah Jesus...

And if you belong to Messiah, then <u>you</u> are

<u>Abraham's descendants</u>, *heirs* according to <u>promise</u>. (Galatians 3:25, 29)

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus the Messiah, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Messiah, (Ephesians 1:3)

B. The Lord predicted that in the future Zion would be comforted,

even in places that are now **destroyed** and **desolate**. **Zion's wilderness** would be like "**Eden**," and that she would be **characterized** by **joyfulness** and the sound of **music** (51:3).

As **believers**, *we too* are promised **future** <u>comfort</u>, <u>joy</u>, and be in a place <u>characterized</u> by <u>thanksgiving</u>, and the <u>singing</u> of <u>songs</u>.

When **Jesus** saw the **crowds**, **He** went up on the **mountain**;... **He opened His mouth** and *began* to **teach** them, saying,

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
"Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. (Matthew 5:1-4)

Therefore you too have **grief now**; but **I (Jesus)** will **see you again**, and your **heart** will **rejoice**, and no one will take your **joy** away from you. (John 16:22)

And they *sang the song of Moses, the bond-servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying,

"Great and marvelous are Your works, O Lord God, the Almighty;
Righteous and true are Your ways,
King of the nations! (Revelation 15:3)

C. The **Lord proclaimed** to **Zion** that "a <u>law</u> would **go forth**" from **Him**, and that *His* <u>justice</u> would be a "light" of the peoples. He also declared that **He** would establish *His* <u>Righteousness</u>, and send forth *His* Salvation (51:4-5, 6b, 8b).

As believers, we have received the "good news" of God's <u>salvation</u> and <u>righteousness</u> through our faith in Jesus the Messiah. We have also been given the <u>law</u> and "light" of the New Covenant, and we seek to walk according to it (Romans 1:16-17, 8:2) (Hebrews 9:15).

However, like **we read** tonight, we **anticipate** that the **righteous remnant of Israel** will receive **God's <u>righteousness</u>** and <u>salvation</u> when the **Lord <u>returns</u>** to establish **His kingdom** of **righteousness**.

"Behold, the days are coming," declares the Lord,
"When I will raise up for David a righteous Branch; and He will reign as king
and act wisely and do justice and righteousness in the land.
In His days Judah will be saved, and Israel will live securely;..
And this is His name by which He will be called,
'The Lord Our Righteousness.' (Jeremiah 23:5-6a)

...for the **kingdom of God** is **not** eating and drinking, but **righteousness** and **peace** and **joy** in the **Holy Spirit**. (Romans 14:17)

D. Tonight a <u>prayer</u> was heard beseeching the "<u>arm</u> of the Lord" to "<u>awaken</u>," and <u>put on strength</u>. The <u>plea</u> was for the Lord to manifest the same redemptive <u>power</u> done in Israel's past, in order to bring about a <u>future redemption</u> for Zion (51:9-10).

Many of us believe that term the "<u>Arm</u> of the Lord" refers to **Jesus the Messiah**; both in **His** *first* **coming** (53:1), and in **His powerful** <u>second coming</u> (52:9-10)

The LORD has bared His holy arm in the sight of all the nations, so that all the ends of the earth may see the salvation of our God. (Isaiah 52:10)

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"But immediately after the <u>tribulation</u> of **those days**THE **SUN** WILL BE **DARKENED**, AND THE **MOON** WILL **NOT GIVE ITS LIGHT**,
AND THE **STARS** WILL **FALL** from the sky,
and the **powers** of the **heavens** will be **shaken**.

And then the **sign** of the **Son of Man** will appear in **the sky**, and then **all the tribes** of the **earth** will **mourn**, and they will **see** the **Son of Man coming** ON THE **CLOUDS OF THE SKY** with **power** and **great glory**. (Matthew 24:29-30)

E. Tonight we read that the ransomed of the Lord will return (to the land), and "everlasting joy will be on their heads." We also saw that "sorrow and sighing" will flee away (51:11).

As **believers**, *we too* can relate to these **promises** given to **Zion**. **We too** will experience in the future "**great joy**," and that our **sorrow** and **pain** will be **removed eternally** from us.

Now to Him who is able to protect you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory, blameless with great joy, to the only God our Savior,... be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority,..(Jude 24)

and **He (the Lord)** will **wipe away** every *tear* from their eyes; and there will **no longer** be *any death*; there will **no longer** be *any mourning*, or *crying*, or *pain*; the first things have <u>passed away</u>."(Revelation 21:4)
