52 Awake, awake, Clothe yourself in your strength, O Zion;

Clothe yourself in your beautiful garments,
O Jerusalem, the holy city;

For the **uncircumcised** and the **unclean** will **no longer** come into you.

² Shake yourself from the dust, rise up, O captive Jerusalem; loose yourself from the chains around your neck, O captive daughter of Zion.

³ For thus says **the LORD**, "You were **sold** for **nothing** and you will be <u>redeemed</u> without money."

⁴ For thus says the **Lord GoD**, "**My people** went down at the first into **Egypt** to **reside** there; then the **Assyrian oppressed them** *without cause*. ⁵ Now therefore, **what** do I have **here**," declares **the LORD**, "seeing that **My people** have been **taken away** *without cause*?"

Again the LORD declares, "Those who rule over them how!, and My name is continually blasphemed all day long.

⁶ Therefore **My people** shall **know My name**; therefore in **that day I am** the one who is speaking, '**Here I am**.'"

⁷ How **lovely** on the **mountains** are the **feet** of <u>him</u> who brings <u>good news</u>, Who announces <u>peace</u> and brings **good news of** <u>happiness</u>,

Who announces <u>salvation</u>, and says to Zion, "Your God reigns!"

⁸ Listen! Your <u>watchmen</u> lift up *their* voices, they *shout* joyfully together; for they will see with their **own eyes** when **the LORD restores Zion**.

⁹ Break forth, shout joyfully together, you waste places of Jerusalem; for the LORD has <u>comforted</u> His people, He has redeemed Jerusalem.

10 The LORD has bared His <u>holy arm</u> in the sight of all the nations, that all the ends of the earth may see the <u>salvation</u> of our God.

¹¹ Depart, depart, **go out** from there, touch nothing **unclean**;

Go **out of** the midst of her, **purify** yourselves, you who carry the **vessels** of **the LORD**.

¹² But you will *not* go out in haste, *nor* will you go as fugitives;

For the LORD will go <u>before</u> you, and the God of Israel will be your rear guard.

Message Summary Presenting the Glory of a Redeemed Zion

- a. A *City* (Jerusalem) *clothed* with strength (52:1a)
- b. A <u>Holy City clothed</u> with <u>beautiful</u> garments (52:1b)
- c. A *City* no longer **trodden** by **heathen** <u>nations</u> (52:1c)
- d. A *Zion* <u>redeemed</u> from *past* captivities (Egypt & Assyria) (52:2-4)

- e. A **Zion** to be <u>redeemed</u> from a treacherous *present* captivity (Babylon) (52:5-6)
- f. A **Zion** that is to **receive** the **"good news"** of **salvation** (52:7-10)
 - 1) *proclaimed* by the **presence** of a "lovely" <u>messenger</u> (57:7)
 - 2) *announced* by "watchmen" who will *personally* see the Lord restoring Zion (57:8)
 - 3) proclaimed joyfully from the "waste" places of Jerusalem (57:9)
 - 4) accomplished mightily in the sight of all nations (52:10)
- g. A **Zion** purified from the uncleanness of their captivity (52:11)
- h. A **Zion fully protected** by **God** upon their **return** (52:12)

Personal Application

Another **New Testament** Connection

Tonight we read about Isaiah's description of the Messenger who announces "good news" of peace, happiness, and salvation:

How **lovely** on the **mountains**are the **feet** of **him** who brings **good news**,
Who announces **peace** and brings **good news** of **happiness**,
Who announces **salvation**, and says to **Zion**,
"Your God reigns!" (Isaiah 52:11)

Rabbi Paul quotes this text in the New Testament in reference to those who are sent to bring the "good news" message of salvation through faith in Jesus the Messiah.

for "Whoever will call on the name of the Lord will be saved."

How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed?

How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard?

And how will they hear without a preacher?

How will they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, "How BEAUTIFUL ARE THE FEET OF THOSE"
WHO BRING GOOD NEWS OF GOOD THINGS!" (Romans 10:13-15)

In the **New Testament**, those who bring the "good news," the gospel of <u>salvation</u> through <u>faith</u> in <u>Messiah</u> are called *Evangelists* (Ephesians 4:11, Acts 20:8).

Although there are **those** who are specifically **called** to a **ministry of** *Evangelism*, **all believers** are **called** to **share** the **"good news"** of our **salvation in Messiah**.

And **He (Jesus)** said to **them (His disciples),** "**Go** into all the **world** and **preach** the **gospel** to **all creation**. (Mark 16:15)

;..but you (Messiah's disciples) will receive *power* when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be <u>My witnesses</u> both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

For I am **not ashamed** of the **gospel**, for it is the **power of God** for **salvation** to everyone who **believes**, to the **Jew first** and also to the **Greek**.

For in it the <u>righteousness</u> of God is revealed from <u>faith to faith</u>; as it is written, "BUT THE **RIGHTEOUS** man SHALL **LIVE BY FAITH**." (Romans 1:16-17)

But **you (Timothy)**, be **sober** in all things, endure **hardship**, do the **work of an <u>evangelist</u>**, fulfill **your ministry**. (II Timothy 4:5)

...but sanctify Messiah as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a <u>defense</u> to everyone who asks you to give an account for the <u>hope</u> that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence; (I Peter 3:15)

Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said,
"It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you (the Jews) first;
since you repudiate it and judge yourselves unworthy of eternal life,
behold, we are turning to the Gentiles.

For so the Lord has <u>commanded us</u>,
'I HAVE PLACED YOU AS A *LIGHT* FOR THE **GENTILES**,
THAT YOU MAY **BRING <u>SALVATION</u>** TO THE **END OF THE EARTH**."

(Acts 13:46-47)

Therefore, we are <u>ambassadors</u> for Messiah, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Messiah, be <u>reconciled</u> to God. (II Corinthians 5:20)

For if I <u>preach</u> the <u>gospel</u>, I have **nothing** to boast of, for I am under **compulsion**; for **woe is me** if I **do not** preach the **gospel**. (I Corinthians 9:16)
