# VII. **Isaiah's** *Discourse* on the **Servant of God**, the **Messiah** (49:1-57:21)

### E. The *Chastening* of God's Servant (52:13-53:12)

- 1. **His Uplifting** and **Exaltation** (52:13-15)
  - a. an *exaltation* that will be both **prosperous** and **glorious** (52:13)
  - b. an *exaltation* preceded by an "astonishing" unprecedented <u>disfigurement</u> (52:14)
  - c. an exaltation followed by the cleansing of many nations (52:15a)
  - d. an *exaltation* that would both **enlighten** and **humble** the world's **rulers** (52:15b)

<sup>3</sup>Behold, **My servant** will *prosper*, **He** will be **high** and **lifted up** and **greatly exalted**.

<sup>14</sup> Just as many were astonished at you, My people, so His appearance was marred more than any man and His form more than the sons of men.

Thus He will <u>sprinkle</u> many <u>nations</u>, Kings will shut their mouths on account of Him; for what had <u>not</u> been told them they will <u>see</u>, and what they had <u>not</u> heard they will <u>understand</u>.

#### 2. His Unremarkable Appearance (53:1-2)

53 Who has *believed* our message? and to whom has the arm of the LORD been *revealed*?

<sup>2</sup> For **He grew up** before **Him** like a **tender shoot**, and like a **root** out of **parched ground**;

He has <u>no</u> stately form or majesty that we should <u>look</u> upon Him, nor appearance that we should be attracted to Him.

#### 3. His *Unbearable* Rejection by Men (53:3-4)

<sup>3</sup> He was <u>despised</u> and <u>forsaken</u> of men, a man of *sorrows* and acquainted with *grief*; and like one from whom men hide their face He was despised, and we did not esteem Him.

<sup>4</sup> Surely **our griefs He Himself bore**, and **our sorrows He carried**; yet we ourselves **esteemed Him stricken**, **smitten of God**, and **afflicted**.

#### 4. His *Universal* and Vicarious Punishment for our Sins (53:5-6)

<sup>5</sup> But **He** was **pierced through** for our **transgressions**, **He** was **crushed** for our **iniquities**;

the **chastening** for our **well-being** *fell* upon **Him**, and by **His scourging** we are **healed**.

<sup>6</sup> All of us like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; but the LORD has caused the iniquity of us all to fall on Him.

#### 5. **His Unassertive Demeanor** in **His Death** (53:7-8)

<sup>7</sup> He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He did not open His mouth;

like a <u>lamb</u> that is led to slaughter, and like a <u>sheep</u> that is <u>silent</u> before its <u>shearers</u>, so <u>He</u> did <u>not open His mouth</u>.

#### 6. His *Unconsidered* mission of **Substitution** (53:8)

<sup>8</sup> By oppression and judgment He was taken away; and as for His generation, who considered that He was cut off out of the land of the living for the transgression of my people, to whom the stroke was due?

#### 7. **His Unique <u>Burial</u>** (53:9)

<sup>9</sup> His grave was assigned with wicked men, yet He was with a rich man in His death, because He had done no violence, nor was there any deceit in His mouth.

#### 6. **His Unparalleled Sacrifice** for **our Salvation** (53:10-11)

<sup>10</sup> But the LORD was *pleased* to crush Him, putting Him to grief; if He would render Himself as a guilt offering,

He will see His <u>offspring</u>, He will prolong <u>His days</u>, and the <u>good pleasure</u> of the LORD will *prosper* in His hand.

<sup>11</sup> As a result of the anguish of His soul, He will see it and be satisfied; by His knowledge the Righteous One, My Servant, will justify the many, as He will bear their iniquities.

#### 7. His *Ultimate* Reward (53:12)

<sup>12</sup> Therefore, I will allot Him a <u>portion</u> with the great, and He will divide the <u>booty</u> with the strong;

Because **He poured out Himself** to death, and was **numbered** with the **transgressors**; Yet **He Himself bore** the **sin of many**, and **interceded** for the **transgressors**.

## The **Prophecies** of the **Suffering Servant** (53:1-12) are *fulfilled* in the **Life** and **Death** of **Jesus the Messiah**

- 1. *Isaiah* begins with a question to the people: "Who has believed our report?

  And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed (53:1)?"
- → In John's gospel we read that, "though He (Jesus) had performed so many signs before them (the people), yet they were <u>not</u> believing in Him." John declared that this was to <u>fulfill</u> the word of *Isaiah* the prophet when he said:

### "LORD, WHO HAS BELIEVED OUR REPORT? AND TO WHOM HAS THE ARM OF THE LORD BEEN REVEALED?" (John 12:37-38)

2. *Isaiah* wrote that the servant of God was "<u>despised</u> and <u>forsaken</u> of men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief...He was <u>despised</u> and we did *not* esteem Him (53:3)."

#### → In the **New Testament** we read:

"He (Jesus) came to *His own*, and those who were *His own* did <u>not receive Him</u>." (John 1:11)

"But first **He** (the **Son of Man**) must **suffer many things** and be **rejected** by **this generation.**" (Luke 17:25)

3. *Isaiah* wrote regarding the Servant of God, "Surely our griefs He Himself <u>bore</u>, and our sorrows He carried (53:4a)."

→ In the **New Testament** we read:

When evening came, they brought to **Him** (**Jesus**)
many who were **demon-possessed**;
and **He cast out** the **spirits** with a **word**,
and **healed all** who were **ill**.

<sup>7</sup> This was to **fulfill** what was spoken through **Isaiah** the **prophet**:

"HE HIMSELF <u>TOOK</u> OUR INFIRMITIES
AND <u>CARRIED AWAY</u> OUR <u>DISEASES</u>."(Matthew 8:16-17)

- 4. *Isaiah* wrote; "But He was <u>pierced</u> through for our transgressions, He was <u>crushed</u> for our iniquities; the <u>chastening</u> for our well-being *fell* upon Him, and by His scourging we are healed (53:5).
  - → In the **New Testament** we read:

...and **He Himself <u>bore our sins</u>** in **His body** on the **cross**, so that we might **die to sin** and live to **righteousness**; for **by His wounds you were healed.** (I Peter 2:24)

But one of the soldiers <u>pierced</u> His (Jesus) side with a spear, and immediately **blood and water** came out. (John 19:34)

- 5. *Isaiah* wrote: "All of us like <u>sheep</u> have gone astray...but the LORD has caused the iniquity of us all to fall on Him (the Servant of God) (53:6).
  - → In the **New Testament** we read:

But **He (Jesus)** answered and said, was **sent** only to the **lost sheep** of the **house of Israel**."(Matthew 15:24)

...so **Messiah** also, having been **offered once** to <u>bear the sins</u> of **many**, will appear a **second time** for **salvation**...(Hebrews 9:28a)

- 6. *Isaiah* wrote: "He was oppressed and He was afflicted, yet He did *not* open His mouth; like a lamb that is led to slaughter, and like a sheep that is silent before its shearers, so He did *not* open His mouth (53:7)."
  - → In the **New Testament** we read:

The next day **he (John)** saw **Jesus** coming to him and said, "Behold, the <u>Lamb</u> of God who takes away the <u>sin</u> of the world! (John 1:29)

And while **He** (**Jesus**) was being **accused** by the **chief priests** and **elders**, **He** did **not answer**. Then Pilate said to Him, "Do You not **hear** how many things they **testify against You?**" And **He** did **not answer** him with regard to even a **single charge**,

so the governor was **quite amazed**. (Matthew 27:12-14)

- 7. *Isaiah wrote*: "By oppression and judgment He was taken away; and as for His generation, who *considered* that He was <u>cut off</u> out of the land of the living for the <u>transgression</u> of my people, to whom the stroke was due (53:8)?
  - → In the <u>New Testament</u> we read about how an **Ethiopian official** had come to **Jerusalem** to **worship**, and was **reading Isaiah** the **prophet**. When **Philip** inquired as to whether he **understood** what he was reading, the **scriptures** declare that he was reading *this* **text** regarding the **servant of God** in **Isaiah 53:8** (Acts 8:26-33).

"IN HUMILIATION HIS JUDGMENT WAS TAKEN AWAY;
WHO WILL RELATE HIS GENERATION?
FOR HIS LIFE IS REMOVED FROM THE EARTH." (Acts 8:33)

- 8. *Isaiah* wrote: "His <u>grave</u> was assigned with <u>wicked men</u>, yet He was with a <u>rich man</u> in His <u>death</u>, because He had done no violence, nor was there any deceit in His mouth (53:9).
  - $\rightarrow$  In the **New Testament** we read:

At that time <u>two robbers</u> were <u>crucified</u> with <u>Him (Jesus)</u>, one on the right and one on the left...

And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice, and yielded up His spirit...

When it was evening, there came a <u>rich man</u> from **Arimathea**, named **Joseph**,... And **Joseph** took the **body** (of **Jesus**) and **wrapped it** in a clean linen cloth, and **laid it** in his **own** *new* **tomb**, which he had hewn out in the rock;.. (Matthew 27:38, 50, 57-60)

- 9. *Isaiah* wrote that the **Servant of God**, having been "crushed," and having rendered **Himself** a *guilt offering*; would *see* **His** <u>offspring</u> and that the **LORD** would <u>prolong</u> **His** days, and the **good pleasure** of the **LORD** will **prosper** in **His** hand (53:10).
  - → In the **New Testament** we read:

And **He** (**Jesus**) placed His right hand on me, saying, "Do not be afraid; **I am** the **first** and the **last**, and the **living One**; and **I was <u>dead</u>**, and behold, **I am <u>alive</u> forevermore**,..(Revelation 1:17-18)

For I delivered to you as of **first importance** what I also received, that **Messiah** <u>died</u> for <u>our sins</u> according to the **Scriptures**, and that **He** was <u>buried</u>, and that **He** was <u>raised</u> on the **third day** according to the **Scriptures**, (I Corinthians 15:3-4)

But as many as <u>received</u> Him (Jesus), to them He gave the right to become <u>children of God</u>,

even to those who **believe** in **His name**. (John 1:12)

- 10. *Isaiah* wrote: "As a result of the anguish of His soul, He (God) will see *it* and be <u>satisfied</u>; by *His* knowledge the Righteous One, <u>My Servant</u>, will <u>justify</u> the many, as He will <u>bear</u> their iniquities (53:11)."
  - → In the **New Testament** we read:

...and *He Himself* bore our sins in His body on the cross,..(I Peter 2:24a)

and *He Himself* is the <u>propitiation</u> (satisfaction) for our sins; and not for ours only, but also for *those of* the *whole* world. (I John 1:22)

So then as through *one transgression* (by **Adam**) there resulted <u>condemnation</u> to all men, even so through *one act of righteousness* (by **Jesus**) there resulted <u>justification</u> of life to all men. (Romans 5:8)

- 11. *Isaiah* wrote: "Therefore ("having <u>bore</u> the sin of many"), I will allot Him (God's Servant Messiah) a portion with the great, and He will divide the booty with the strong (53:12a);"
  - → In the **New Testament** we read:

Being found in appearance as a man, He (Jesus) humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

For this reason also, **God highly** <u>exalted Him</u>, and bestowed **on Him** the **name** which is **above every name**,

so that at the **name of Jesus EVERY KNEE WILL <u>BOW</u>**, of those who are **in** *heaven* and **on** *earth* and *under* the earth,

and that every tongue will confess that Jesus the Messiah is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. (Philippians 2:8-11)

The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are children of God,

and if **children**, <u>heirs</u> also, <u>heirs</u> of **God** and **fellow** <u>heirs</u> with **Messiah**, if indeed we **suffer** with *Him* so that we may also be <u>glorified</u> with *Him*. (Romans 8:16-17)
