## F. The *Confirming* of God's Future *Promises* to <u>Israel</u> (54:1-17)

1. The *Promise* of an Abundant <u>Progeny</u> (54:1-3)

54 "Shout for joy, O barren one, you who have borne no child; break forth into joyful shouting and cry aloud, you who have not travailed; for the sons of the desolate one will be more numerous than the sons of the married woman," says the LORD.

> <sup>2</sup> "<u>Enlarge</u> the place of your tent; stretch out the curtains of your dwellings, spare not; lengthen your cords and strengthen your pegs.

<sup>3</sup> "For you will spread abroad to the right and to the left. and your <u>descendants</u> will possess nations and will resettle the desolate cities.

2. The *Promise* of a **Restored** <u>Relationship</u> with Her "Husband"—the Lord (54:4-8)

<sup>4</sup> "Fear not, for you will *not* be put to shame; and do *not* feel humiliated, for you will *not* be disgraced;

but you will **forget** the **shame** of your **youth**, and the **reproach** of your **widowhood** you will remember **no more**.

<sup>5</sup> "For your <u>husband</u> is your Maker, whose name is the LORD of hosts; and your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel, who is called the God of all the earth. <sup>6</sup> "For the LORD has *called you*, like a <u>wife</u> forsaken and grieved in spirit, even like a <u>wife</u> of *one's* youth when she is rejected," says your God.

<sup>7</sup> "For a **brief** moment I **forsook you**, but with **great compassion** I will **gather you**.

<sup>8</sup> "In an outburst of anger I hid My face from you for a *moment*, but with everlasting <u>lovingkindness</u> I will have compassion on you," says the LORD your Redeemer.

3. The *Promise* of an **Eternal Covenant** of <u>Lovingkindness</u> and <u>Peace</u> (54:9-10)

<sup>9</sup> "For this is like the **days of Noah** to **Me**, when *I swore* that the **waters of Noah** would <u>not</u> flood the earth again; so **I have** *sworn* that I will **not** be **angry** with you nor will I **rebuke you**.

<sup>10</sup> "For the mountains may be *removed* and the hills may *shake*, but My <u>lovingkindness</u> will <u>not</u> be removed from you, and My <u>covenant</u> of peace will <u>not</u> be shaken," says the LORD who has compassion on you.

4. The *Promise* of a "Beautified" <u>Jerusalem</u> (54:11-12)

<sup>11</sup> "O afflicted one, storm-tossed, and not comforted, behold, I will set your stones in antimony, and your foundations I will lay in sapphires.

<sup>12</sup> "Moreover, I will make your **battlements** of *rubies*, and your **gates** of *crystal*, and your entire **wall** of *precious stones*.

5. The *Promise* of a **Rule** of <u>**Righteousness**</u> with <u>**no Fear**</u> (54:13-14)

<sup>13</sup> "All your **sons** will be <u>taught</u> of the LORD; and the *well-being* of your **sons** will be great.

<sup>14</sup> "In <u>righteousness</u> you will be established; you will be *far* from oppression, for you will <u>not fear</u>; and from terror, for it will <u>not</u> come near you.

6. The *Promise* of God's Sovereign <u>Protection</u> (54:15-17)

<sup>15</sup> "If anyone fiercely assails you it will <u>not</u> be from Me. Whoever assails you will <u>fall</u> because of you.

<sup>16</sup> "Behold, I Myself have created the smith who blows the fire of coals

and brings out a *weapon* for its work; and I have created the *destroyer* to ruin.

#### <sup>17</sup> "No weapon that is <u>formed</u> against you will prosper; and every tongue that accuses you in judgment you will <u>condemn</u>.

This is the *heritage* of the servants of the LORD, and their *vindication* is from Me," declares the LORD.

#### Personal Application

- Isaiah exhorted a "barren" Jerusalem to shout for joy. For though the city had been left as "desolate," (many having been exiled to Babylon), God promised that her "sons" would become more <u>numerous</u> than even *before* the exile. In the future, the once barren Jerusalem will have to greatly "enlarge her tent" to accommodate the abundance of her <u>descendants</u> from both Israel, and the Gentile nations that she will possess (54:1-3).
- → As *believers*, this passage **speaks to** <u>us</u>, because we are to be **counted** as **among** those who are "**spiritual**" <u>descendants</u> from Israel.

And if you **belong** to **Messiah**, then **you** are **Abraham's** <u>descendants</u>, *heirs* according to **promise**. (Galatians 3:29)

Though we may **not inhabit** the *earthly* **Jerusalem**, we will be among the **throngs** of **those** who will **inhabit** the *"heavenly* **Jerusalem**" along with the <u>redeemed</u> of the **ages**.

But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the <u>heavenly Jerusalem</u>, and to *myriads* of angels,

to the **general assembly** and <u>church</u> of the **firstborn** who are *enrolled* in heaven, and to God, the Judge of all, and to the **spirits** of *the* **righteous** made *perfect*, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant,..(Hebrews 12:22-24a)

Israel is declared by *Isaiah*, and in other scriptures as the "wife" of Yahweh (54:5-6). Because of her exile in Babylon, Israel was described as a <u>wife</u> that was briefly "forsaken" and "rejected." However, after His momentary anger, God declared that with "*everlasting* <u>lovingkindness</u>" He would have compassion on her (54:6-10).

→As *believers we also* embrace the Lord as our Maker, and *our* "Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel (54:5)." Though we are not the wife of Yahweh, for that is Israel's designation, we (the church – the <u>body</u> of believers) are the <u>bride</u> of Messiah, and His <u>love</u> for us is *sacrificial, inseparable* and *unconditional*.

For the **husband** is the *head* of the <u>wife</u>, as **Messiah** also is the *head* of the <u>church</u>, **He Himself** *being* the <u>Savior</u> of the <u>body</u>...

Husbands, *love* your <u>wives</u>, just as Messiah also *loved* the <u>church</u> and gave Himself up for her,..

So husbands ought also to *love* their own <u>wives</u> as their own bodies. He who *loves* his own <u>wife</u> *loves* <u>himself</u>; for no one ever *hated* his own flesh, but *nourishes* and *cherishes* it, just as Messiah also *does* the <u>church</u>, because we are *members* of <u>His body</u>.

FOR THIS REASON A **MAN** SHALL LEAVE **HIS FATHER** AND **MOTHER** AND SHALL **BE JOINED** TO <u>HIS WIFE</u>, AND THE **TWO** SHALL BECOME **ONE FLESH**.

This *mystery* is great; but I am speaking with reference to <u>Messiah</u> and the <u>church</u> (His bride). (Ephesians 5:23, 25, 28-30)

For I am <u>convinced</u> that neither *death*, nor *life*, nor *angels*, nor *principalities*, nor things *present*, nor things *to come*, nor *powers*, nor *height*, nor *depth*, nor any other *created thing*, will be able to <u>separate us</u> from the <u>love of God</u>, which is **in Messiah Jesus** our **Lord**. (Romans 8:38-39)

- 3. *Isaiah* describes how that the *afflicted*, *storm-tossed*, *uncomforted* city of Jerusalem, will one day be **built** with **beautiful** <u>gems</u> and precious <u>stones</u> (54:11-12). He also declared that her sons will be <u>taught</u> of God, and that their well-being will be great. Jerusalem will be established in <u>righteousness</u>, and no longer <u>fear</u> *oppression* and *terror*. For she will be <u>protected</u> by a sovereign and powerful God (54:11-17).
- →As *believers*, we too will someday dwell in the multi-gemmed, beautiful, heavenly city of <u>new Jerusalem</u>. We too will live in a city established by <u>righteousness</u> and <u>peace</u>. It will be a place where we will no longer fear *oppression* and *terror*:

And I saw the **holy city**, <u>**new Jerusalem**</u>, **coming down** out of **heaven from God**, made ready as a <u>**bride**</u> adorned for **her husband**.

And I heard a loud voice from the throne, saying, "Behold, the tabernacle of God is among men, and He will dwell among them,... and He will *wipe away* every tear from their eyes; and there will no longer be *any* <u>death</u>; there will no longer be *any* <u>mourning</u>, or <u>crying</u>, or <u>pain</u>; the first things have *passed away*." (Revelation 21: 2-4) Closing Comments
