1. A *Challenge* to pursue that which truly <u>Satisfies</u> (55:1-2)

"Ho! Every one who thirsts, come to the waters; and you who have no money come, buy and eat.

Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost.

² "Why do you spend money for what is *not* bread, and your wages for what does *not* satisfy?

Listen carefully to **Me**, and **eat** what is **good**, and **delight** yourself **in abundance**.

- 2. A *Covenant* <u>Declared</u> (55:3-5)
 - a. An **everlasting** *covenant* (55:3a)
 - b. A *covenant* according to the **mercies** shown to **David** (55:3b-4)
 - c. A *covenant* that will **call** an **unknown nation(s)** to "**run**" to **Israel** (55:5)

³ "Incline your ear and *come* to **Me.**Listen, that you may <u>live;</u>
and I will make an everlasting <u>covenant</u> with you, according to the faithful *mercies* shown to **David**.

4 "Behold, I have made him a witness to the peoples,

a *leader* and *commander* for the peoples.

⁵ "Behold, *you* will **call a** <u>nation</u> you do **not know**, and a <u>nation</u> which knows you not will <u>run</u> to you,

Because of the LORD your God, even the Holy One of Israel; for He has glorified you."

3. A *Call* to **Repentance** (55:6-7)

⁶ Seek the LORD while He may be found; call upon Him while He is near.

⁷Let the wicked <u>forsake</u> his <u>way</u> and the unrighteous man his thoughts;

and let him <u>return</u> to the LORD, and **He** will have *compassion* on him, and to **our God**, for **He** will abundantly *pardon*.

4. A *Confirmation* of God's Superior Ways (55:8-9)

⁸ "For My thoughts are *not* your thoughts, *Nor* are your ways My ways." declares the LORD.

⁹ "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My thoughts than your thoughts.

5. A Candid Portrayal of God's Life-giving Word (55:10-11)

¹⁰ "For as the **rain** and the **snow** come down from **heaven**, and do not return there without **watering** the earth

and making it **bear** and **sprout**, and furnishing **seed** to the **sower** and **bread** to the **eater**;

¹¹ So will <u>My word</u> be which goes forth from **My mouth**; it will **not return** to **Me empty**,

without accomplishing what I desire, and without succeeding in the matter for which I sent it.

6. A *Creation* of Characterized by <u>Joy</u> and <u>Renewal</u> (55:12-13)

12 "For you will go out with <u>iov</u> and be led forth with <u>peace</u>; the mountains and the hills will break forth into shouts of <u>iov</u> before you, and all the trees of the field will clap their hands.

¹³ "Instead of the **thorn bush** the **cypress** will come up, and instead of the **nettle** the **myrtle** will come up

and it will be a **memorial** to **the LORD**, for an **everlasting sign** which will **not** be **cut off.**"

Personal Application—Isaiah 55 3 Key *Observations*...that Correlate with the Life and Ministry of Jesus the Messiah

1. In tonight's text we are **invited** by the **Lord** to "**come**" and "<u>buy</u> wine and milk without money and without cost." For why do we spend money and wages on that which does not truly <u>satisfy</u>? Instead, we are instructed to <u>listen</u> carefully to **Him**, "<u>eat</u> what is **good**," and **delight** "in abundance (55:1-2)." According this text and other scriptures, there is a <u>hunger</u> and <u>thirst</u> within the souls of men that only God can <u>satisfy</u>:

As the deer **pants** for the **water brooks**, so **my soul pants** for **You, O God**. **My soul <u>thirsts</u>** for **God**, for the **living God**;

When shall I **come** and **appear** before **God**? (Psalm 42:1-2)

O God, You are my God; I shall seek You earnestly; My soul <u>thirsts</u> for You, my flesh yearns for You, In a dry and weary land where there is <u>no water</u>. (Psalm 63:1)

"Behold, days are **coming**," declares the **Lord GoD**,

"When I will send a <u>famine</u> on **the land**, **not** a **famine** for *bread* or a *thirst* for water,

but rather for <u>hearing</u> the <u>words</u> of the LORD. (Amos 8:11)

When **Messiah Yeshua** came, **He** provided **salvation** as a "**gift**" **free of** <u>cost</u> to those who would <u>believe</u> in **Him** (Romans 6:23). **Jesus** also declared that **He** would <u>satisfy</u> the **spiritual** *hunger* and *thirst* within the **souls** of who **believed**—

Jesus answered and said to her (Samaritan woman),
"Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again; but whoever drinks
of the water that I will give him shall never thirst;
but the water that I will give him will become in him a well of water
springing up to eternal life."(John 4:13-14)

³³ For the <u>bread of God</u> is that which comes down out of heaven, and gives <u>life</u> to the world." Then they said to Him (Jesus),

"Lord, always give us this bread."

Jesus said to them, "I am the <u>bread of life</u>; he who comes to Me will *not* <u>hunger</u>, and he who believes in Me will *never* thirst. (John 6:33-35)

The **Spirit** and the **bride** say, "**Come.**" And let the one **who hears** say, "**Come.**" And let the one who is <u>thirsty</u> come; let the one who wishes take the <u>water</u> of life without <u>cost</u>. (Revelation 22:17)

2. In tonight's text we are exhorted to "come" and listen that we may *live*, for God has made an everlasting <u>covenant</u> according to the faithful mercies shown to David (55:3-4). These mercies center on God promising to David that his <u>seed</u> would be established forever, and his <u>throne</u> built up to all generations (Psalm 89:3-4).

When **Jesus came He** was the *fulfillment* of this **covenantal promise** as the **Son of David** who would **rule forever** over an **everlasting kingdom**—

And behold, **you (Mary)** will **conceive** in your womb and bear **a son**, and you shall **name Him Jesus**.

He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David; and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and His kingdom will have no end." (Luke 1:31-33)

3. Tonight we read that just as the **rain** and **snow** come *down* from **heaven** to **water** the **earth**, and provide "<u>seed</u> to the **sower** and <u>bread</u> to the **eater**," likewise, **God** has **sent forth His "<u>word</u>"** to accomplish **His purposes** (55:10-11).

In the **New Testament** we read that **God** has **sent forth His eternal <u>Word</u>**, the **Messiah**, to accomplish **His <u>salvation</u> purposes**, and give "<u>life</u>" to the **world**—

In the **beginning** was the **Word**, and the **Word** was **with God**, and the **Word** was **God**. He was in the **beginning** with **God**...

In **Him** was <u>life</u>, and the <u>life</u> was the **Light of men**...

And the <u>Word became flesh</u>, and dwelt among us, and we saw **His glory**, glory as of the only begotten from the **Father**, full of *grace* and *truth*. (John 1:1-2, 4, 14)

What was from the **beginning**, what we have **heard**, what we have **seen** with our eyes, what we have **looked at** and **touched** with **our hands**, concerning the **Word of Life**—

and the <u>life</u> was manifested, and we have seen and testify and proclaim to you the <u>eternal life</u>, which was with the Father and was manifested to us—(I John 1:1-2)

God, after He <u>spoke</u> long ago to the <u>fathers in the prophets</u> in many <u>portions</u> and in many <u>ways</u>, in these <u>last days</u> has <u>spoken</u> to us <u>in His Son</u>, whom He appointed <u>heir</u> of all things,

through whom also He <u>made</u> the world. And...When He had made <u>purification</u> of <u>sins</u>, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,.. (Hebrews 1:1-3)
