C. The **Calling** of **Isaiah** (6:1-13)

1. His *Celestial* Vision (6:1-4)

6 In the year of King Uzziah's death <u>I saw</u> the Lord sitting on a throne, lofty and exalted, with the train of His robe *filling* the temple.

² Seraphim stood above Him, each having six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew.

³ And one called out to another and said,

"Holy, Holy, Holy, is the LORD of hosts, The whole earth is full of His glory."

⁴ And the **foundations** of the **thresholds trembled** at the **voice** of him who **called out**, while the **temple** was **filling** with **smoke**.

2. His *Cleansing* from Sin (6:5-7)

⁵Then I said, "<u>Woe</u> is me, for I am ruined!

Because I am a man of unclean lips,

And I live among a people of unclean lips;

For my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts."

⁶ Then one of the **seraphim** flew to me with a **burning coal** in **his hand**, which he had taken from the <u>altar</u> with **tongs**.

⁷He **touched** my mouth with it and said, "Behold, this has **touched** your lips; and your **iniquity** is **taken away** and your **sin** is **forgiven**."

3. His *Commission* from God (6:8-13)

⁸ Then I heard the **voice** of <u>the Lord</u>, saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for *Us*?"

Then I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

⁹ He said, "Go, and <u>tell</u> this people: 'Keep on listening, but do *not perceive*; Keep on looking, but do *not understand*.'

10 "Render the **hearts** of this people *insensitive*, Their **ears** *dull*, And their **eyes** *dim*,

Otherwise they might **see** with their **eyes**, **Hear** with their **ears**, **Understand** with their **hearts**,

And **return** and **be healed**."

¹¹ Then I said, "Lord, how long?" And He answered,

"Until cities are devastated and without inhabitant,

Houses are without people

And the land is utterly desolate,

¹² "The LORD has removed men far away, And the forsaken places are many in the midst of the land.

> 13 "Yet there will be <u>a tenth</u> portion in it, And it will again be *subject* to *burning*, Like a **terebinth** or an **oak** Whose *stump* remains when it is **felled**. The **holy seed** is its *stump*."

Personal Application As Believers, we too have a Ministry Calling,

As Believers, we too have a Ministry Calling similar to Isaiah's Prophetic Calling

A. Our *Calling* can **also** involve "**glimpses**" of the <u>Glory of God</u>

"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God." (Matthew 5:8)

And the Word (of God) became *flesh*, and dwelt among us, and we <u>saw</u> His <u>glory</u>, <u>glory</u> as of the only begotten from the Father, full of *grace* and *truth*. (John 1:14)

He who sees Me (Jesus) sees the One who sent Me. (John 12:45)

And **He (Jesus)** is the *radiance* of **His glory** and the **exact** *representation* of **His nature**, and **upholds all things** by the **word of His power**.

When **He** had made **purification of sins**, **He sat down** at the *right hand* of the **Majesty on high**,..(Hebrews 1:3)

For we do **not** preach **ourselves** but **Messiah Jesus as Lord**, and **ourselves** as your **bond-servants** for **Jesus' sake**.

For God, who said, "Light shall shine out of darkness," is the One who has shone in our hearts to give the Light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Messiah. (II Corinthians 4:5-6)

B. Our *Calling* also requires a <u>Cleansing from Sin</u>

Be gracious to me, O God, according to Your lovingkindness; According to the greatness of Your compassion <u>blot out</u> my transgressions...

> <u>Purify me</u> with hyssop, and I shall be *clean*; <u>Wash me</u>, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Make me to hear joy and gladness, Let the bones which You have broken rejoice.

Hide Your face from my sins
And blot out all my iniquities.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, And renew a steadfast spirit within me...

Restore to me the joy of Your salvation And sustain me with a willing spirit.

<u>Then</u> I will <u>teach</u> transgressors Your ways, And sinners will be converted to You. (Psalm 51:1, 7-13)

Or do you not know that the unrighteous will <u>not</u> inherit the kingdom of God?...

Such were **some of you**; but **you** were **washed**, but **you** were **sanctified**, but **you** were **justified** in the **name** of the **Lord Jesus the Messiah** and in the **Spirit** of **our God**. (I Corinthians 6:9a, 11)

Therefore, if anyone <u>cleanses</u> <u>himself</u> from these <u>things</u> (<u>ungodliness</u>), he will be a vessel for <u>honor</u>, <u>sanctified</u>, <u>useful</u> to the <u>Master</u>, <u>prepared</u> for <u>every good work</u>. (II Timothy 2:21)

C. Our *Calling* also involves **Proclaiming God's Message**

1. A *Message* that <u>proclaims</u> the Gospel of <u>Messiah</u>

Now I make **known** to you, brethren, the **gospel** which I **preached** to you, which also **you received**, in which also **you stand**, by which also **you are saved**, if you **hold fast** the **word** which I **preached to you**, unless you **believed in vain**.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also *received*, that Messiah <u>died</u> for our *sins* according to the Scriptures, and that He was *buried*, and that He was <u>raised</u> on the third day according to the <u>Scriptures</u>,.. (I Corinthians 15:1-4)

2. A *Message* that has as its <u>mission</u>—making <u>Disciples</u> of the Messiah

And **Jesus** came up and spoke to them, saying, "All **authority** has been **given to Me** in **heaven** and on **earth.**

Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

(Matthew 28:18-20)

3. A *Message* that will also be *rejected* by **those** who have **hardened hearts**, and are **unable** to **hear** and **perceive it**

And even if our **gospel** is **veiled**, it is **veiled** to those who are **perishing**,

in whose case the **god of** *this world* has **blinded the minds** of the **unbelieving** so that they might *not see* the **light** of the **gospel** of the **glory of Messiah**, who is the **image of God**. (Il Corinthians 4:3-4)
