- a. The *Call* for the <u>Appearance</u> of the *Awesome* God (64:1-5b)
 - **64** Oh, that **You** would **rend the heavens** and **come down**, that the **mountains** might **quake** at **Your presence**—
 - ² As fire kindles the *brushwood, as* fire causes water to *boil*—
 to make Your *name* known to Your adversaries,
 that the nations may tremble at Your presence!

³ When You did <u>awesome things</u> which we did *not* expect, You came *down*, the mountains quaked at Your *presence*.

⁴ For from days of old they have *not heard* or *perceived by ear, nor* has the *eye* seen a God <u>besides</u> <u>You</u>,

Who acts in behalf of the *one* who *waits* for Him.

⁵ You *meet* him who *rejoices* in <u>doing</u> righteousness, who *remembers* <u>You</u> in Your ways.

b. The *Confession* of a **Penitent <u>Israel</u>** (64:5c-7)

Behold, You were angry, for we sinned, we continued in them a long time; and shall we be saved?

⁶ For <u>all</u> of us have become like one who is <u>unclean</u>, and all our righteous deeds are like a *filthy* garment;

and <u>all</u> of us wither like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away.

⁷There is <u>no one</u> who *calls* on **Your name**, who *arouses* himself to *take hold* of **You**;

For **You** have **hidden Your face** from **us** and have **delivered us** into the **power** of **our iniquities**.

c. The *Cry* for Israel's <u>Restoration</u> (64:8-12)

⁸ But now, O LORD, You are our Father, we are the <u>clay</u>, and You our <u>potter</u>; and all of <u>us</u> are the work of Your hand.

⁹ Do <u>not</u> be *angry* beyond measure, O LORD, nor *remember* iniquity forever; behold, *look now*, all of us are Your people.

¹⁰ Your **holy cities** have become a **wilderness**, **Zion** has become a **wilderness**, **Jerusalem** a **desolation**.

¹¹ Our **holy** and **beautiful** *house*, where our fathers **praised You**, has been *burned by* fire; and all our *precious things* have become a *ruin*.

¹² Will **You restrain Yourself** at these things, **O LORD**? Will **You keep silent** and **afflict us** beyond **measure**?

<u>Personal Observations</u> **Isaiah** Chapter 64—An **Expanded Outline**

- A. The *Call* for an **Appearance** of the *Awesome* God (64:1-5c)
 - 1. **Who** is *Awesome* in **Power** (64:1-2)

- a. "rending the heavens" as He appears (64:1a)
- b. causing mountains to quake at His Presence (64:1b, 3b)
- c. sending forth <u>fire</u> able to consume things *dry* or *wet* (64:2)
 - 1) that **His name** to be *known* by **His adversaries** (64:2a)
 - 2). that **nations** might *tremble* at **His Presence** (64:2b)
- 2. **Who** is *Awesome* in **His** <u>Ways</u> (64:3-5c)
 - a. doing unexpected things (64:3a)
 - b. causing mountains to quake in His Presence (64:3b)
 - c. manifesting Himself in ways unheard of and unseen (64:4a-b)
 - d. acting in behalf of those who wait for Him (64:4c)
 - e. **meeting those** who *rejoice* in <u>righteousness</u>, and *remember* **God's ways** (64:5)
- B. The *Confession* of a **Penitent Israel** (64:5c-7)
 - 1. Who faced the <u>anger</u> of God for their <u>sins</u> (645c)
 - 2. Who (all) became like one who is unclean (64:6a)
 - 3. Whose "righteous" deeds were likened to a <u>filthy rag</u> (64:6b)
 - 4. *Who* have *withered* like **leaves** "blown away" by their iniquities (64:6c)
 - 5. Who have (all) neglected to call upon the Lord (64:7a)
 - 6. Who, as a result, have been abandoned by the Lord (64:7b-c)
 - a. *having* hidden His face from them (64:7b)
 - b. *having* delivered them to the power of their own iniquities (64:7c)
- C. The *Cry* for the **Restoration** of **Israel** (64:8-12)
 - 1. Who are now willing to be <u>obedient</u> to the will and work of God their Father (64:8)
 - 2. Who are now appealing to God to forsake His <u>anger</u>, and not remember their <u>iniquity</u> (64:9)
 - 3. Who are now greatly distressed at the devastation of their

nation (64:10-11)

- a. their **holy cities** having become a **wilderness** (64:10a)
- b. the **land** of **Zion** having become a wilderness (64:10b)
- c. **Jerusalem** now a **desolation** (64:10c)
- d. their **temple burned** by **fire** (64:11a)
- e. their **precious things** now **ruined** (64:11b)
- 4. Who now yearn for God's Intervention (64:12)

Personal Application

Isaiah declared that Israel was the "clay," and that God was their "Potter," and that they were the "work of His hand." (64:8)

→ As *believers*, we too are the "work of His hand."

For by **grace** you have been **saved** *through* **faith**; and that **not of yourselves**, *it is* the **gift of God**; **not** as a result of **works**, so that **no one** may **boast**.

For <u>we</u> are <u>His workmanship</u>, created in Messiah Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them. (Ephesians 2:8-10)

So then, **my beloved**, just as you have always **obeyed**, not as in **my presence** only, but now much more in **my absence**, **work out** your *salvation* with **fear** and **trembling**;

for it is <u>God</u> who is at work <u>in you</u>, both to *will* and to *work* for *His* good pleasure. (Philippians 2:12-13)

Therefore I **urge you**, brethren, by the **mercies of God**, to **present your bodies** a *living* and *holy* **sacrifice**, *acceptable* to **God**, *which is* your **spiritual service** of *worship*.

And **do not** be **conformed** to **this world**, but **be <u>transformed</u>** by the <u>renewing</u> of **your mind**, so that you may **prove** what the **will of God is**, that which is **good** and **acceptable** and **perfect**. (Romans 12:1-2)
