¹⁷ "For behold, **I create new heavens** and **a new earth;** and the **former things** will *not* be **remembered** or **come to mind**.

¹⁸ "But be glad and rejoice forever in what I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem for rejoicing and her people for gladness.

¹⁹ "I will also <u>rejoice</u> in Jerusalem and <u>be glad</u> in My people; and there will no longer be heard in her the voice of *weeping* and the sound of *crying*.

²⁰ "No longer will there be in it an infant who lives but a few days, or an old man who does <u>not</u> live out his days;

For the **youth** will **die** at the age of **one hundred** and the **one** who does <u>not</u> reach the age of **one hundred** will be *thought* <u>accursed</u>.

²¹ "They will **build houses** and **inhabit** *them*; they will also **plant vineyards** and **eat** their **fruit**.

²² "They will not build and another inhabit, they will not plant and another eat; For as the lifetime of a <u>tree</u>, so will be the days of My people, and My chosen ones will *wear out* the work of their hands.

²³ "They will not labor in vain, or bear children for calamity:

for *they* are the **offspring** of those *blessed* by **the LORD**, and their **descendants** *with them*.

²⁴ It will also come to pass that <u>before</u> they call, I will <u>answer</u>; and while they are still speaking, I will <u>hear</u>.

> ²⁵ The wolf and the lamb will graze together, and the lion will eat straw like the ox; and dust will be the serpent's food.

They will do **no evil** or **harm** in all **My holy mountain**," says **the LORD**.

Message Summary The <u>Characteristics</u> of the *Kingdom*

 Tonight Isaiah declares that God will *create* a "<u>new heavens</u> and a <u>new earth</u>" (65:17a). According to Ryrie, the coming *kingdom* will come <u>before</u> the new heavens and new earth. According to scripture, the *kingdom* has a time element lasting <u>1,000</u> years. After this, will come the <u>eternal state</u> where there will be a new heavens and a new earth. (Revelation 20:4-7, 21:1)

A number of scholars believe that the **establishment** of the *kingdom* will bring about a "<u>renovation</u>" of the *present* heaven and **earth**, and not the **final**, *eternal* **new** heavens and **earth**. However, this "**renovation**" will bring about **miraculous changes** to the *present* **creation**, as **God fulfills His prophetic promises** made to the nation of **Israel**, and the **righteous** among the **Gentiles**—

 In the *kingdom*, Jerusalem will be "created" for <u>rejoicing</u> and her people will be characterized by <u>gladness</u>. The Lord will <u>rejoice</u> in Jerusalem, and be <u>glad</u> in His people (65:18-19a).

There will be **no longer heard** in **Jerusalem**, the **voice** of **weeping** and the **sound** of **crying** (65:19b).

3. In the *kingdom*, there will be <u>no</u> infant mortality, or an old man

who will <u>not</u> "live out his days (65:20a)." Life in the *kingdom* will <u>not</u> be *prematurely* cut short.

During this time <u>life spans</u> will be **extended**, and those **dying** at <u>**100**</u> **years old** will be considered as **dying** *young* (65:20c). The one who does <u>**not**</u> reach the age of **100** will be thought to be "**accursed**," meaning an <u>**unbeliever**</u> (65:20d). Note that, in the *kingdom* sin and **death** will be greatly <u>reduced</u>, but **not eliminated**. (Fruchtenbaum)

4. In the *kingdom*, there will be <u>peace</u> and <u>prosperity</u>. It will be a time of <u>building</u> and <u>planting</u>, and those who **build** and **plant** will be guaranteed the *enjoyment* of the **labor** of **their hands**. Many of the **effects** of the **curse** of the **fall of man** will be <u>removed</u> (65:21).

In the *kingdom*, the people will **keep** and **enjoy** what they **worked for**. No **enemy** will **deprive them** of their **<u>crops</u>** and <u>houses</u>. They will experience <u>longevity</u> of life (as the lifetime of a tree), and fully **enjoy** the **work** of their **hands** (65:22).

5. In the *kingdom*, there will be an **absence** of "calamity" and turmoil. Women will <u>not</u> bear children, and see them carried off (die) prematurely by disease, or accident, or famine, or by the sword of an invader (Pulpit Commentary).

> "For they are the *offspring* of those <u>blessed</u> by the Lord, and their *descendants* with them (65:23b)."

- 6. In the *kingdom*, <u>all</u> prayers will be heard, and instantaneously <u>answered</u> by God, even before they are *fully* spoken (65:24).
- 7. In the *kingdom*, the animal kingdom will be at <u>peace</u> with one another and man. <u>No longer</u> will there be carnivorous animals feeding upon each other, or killing each other. This was the state of the animal kingdom *before* the fall of man. "They shall do <u>no</u> <u>evil</u> or <u>harm</u> in all My holy mountain," says the Lord (65:25).
