1. Isaiah's Ministry to Ahaz (7:1-25)

a. The *Threat* to the <u>House of David</u> (7:1-2)

7 Now it came about in the days of <u>Ahaz</u>, the son of Jotham, the son of Uzziah, king of Judah,
that *Rezin* the king of Aram and *Pekah* the son of Remaliah, king of Israel, went up to Jerusalem to wage war against it, but could *not* conquer it.

² When it was reported to the <u>house of David</u>, saying, "The Arameans have camped in Ephraim," his *heart* and the *hearts* of his people shook as the trees of the forest shake with the wind.

b. The *Message* to <u>Ahaz</u> (7:3-9)

³ Then the LORD said to Isaiah, "Go out now to <u>meet</u> Ahaz, you and your son Shear-jashub, at the end of the conduit of the upper pool, on the highway to the fuller's field, ⁴ and say to him,

'Take <u>care</u> and **be <u>calm</u>**, have **no fear** and do **not** be **fainthearted** because of these **two stubs** of smoldering **firebrands**, on account of the **fierce anger** of **Rezin** and **Aram** and the son of **Remaliah.**

⁵Because *Aram*, *with Ephraim* and the son of **Remaliah**, has <u>planned evil</u> against **you**, saying,

⁶ "Let us go up *against* Judah and *terrorize it,* and make for ourselves a *breach* in its walls and set up the son of Tabeel as <u>king</u> in the midst of it," ⁷ thus says the Lord GOD: "It shall <u>not</u> stand *nor* shall it come to pass

⁸ For the *head* of Aram is Damascus and the *head* of Damascus is *Rezin* (now within another 65 years Ephraim will be <u>shattered</u>, so that it is no longer a people),

⁹ and the *head* of **Ephraim** is **Samaria** and the *head* of **Samaria** is the son of **Remaliah**.

If you will not believe, you surely shall not last."""

c. The *Sign* of Immanuel (7:10-16)

¹⁰ Then the LORD spoke again to Ahaz, saying,

¹¹ "Ask a <u>sign</u> for yourself from the LORD your God; make *it* deep as <u>Sheol</u> or high as <u>heaven</u>."

¹² But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, nor will I test the LORD!"

¹³ Then he said, "Listen now, O house of David!
Is it too slight a thing for you to try the patience of men, that you will try the patience of my God as well?

¹⁴ Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign:

Behold, a <u>virgin</u> will be **with child** and bear **a son**, and she will call **His name** <u>Immanuel</u>.

¹⁵ He will eat *curds* and *honey* at the time He knows *enough* to **refuse** *evil* and **choose** *good*.

¹⁶ For before the boy will know enough to refuse evil and choose good, the <u>land</u> whose <u>two kings</u> you dread will be forsaken.

d. The *Invasion* of <u>Assyria</u> (7:17-25)

¹⁷ The **LORD** will bring on **you**, on **your people**, and on your **father's house** such days as have **never come** since the day that **Ephraim** *separated* from **Judah**, the **king of** <u>Assyria</u>."

¹⁸ In *that day* the LORD will whistle for the *fly* that is in the remotest part of the rivers of <u>Egypt</u> and for the *bee* that is in the land of <u>Assyria</u>.

¹⁹ They will **all come** and **settle** on the steep **ravines**, on the ledges of the **cliffs**, on all the thorn **bushes** and on all the **watering places**. ²⁰ In *that day* the Lord will *shave* with a razor, hired from regions beyond the Euphrates (*that is*, with the king of <u>Assyria</u>), the head and the hair of the legs; and it will also *remove* the beard.

²¹ Now in *that day* a man may keep alive a heifer and a pair of sheep;
 ²² and because of the abundance of the *milk* produced he will eat *curds*, for everyone that is left within the land will eat *curds* and *honey*.

²³ And it will come about in *that day*, that every place where there used to be a **thousand vines**, *valued* at a **thousand shekels** of silver, will become **briars** and **thorns**.

²⁴ People will come there with bows and arrows because all the land will be briars and thorns.

²⁵ As for all the hills which used to be *cultivated* with the hoe, you will not go there for fear of briars and thorns; but they will become a place for pasturing oxen and for sheep to trample.

The *Messianic* Prophecy of Immanuel (7:13-15) <u>Innerbiblical Confirmation</u>

 Having given hope to the house of David through the prophecy of the birth of Immanuel (7:13-15), Isaiah declares that a "great light" will dawn on those living in darkness (9:2). This "light" is later revealed as a "child," a son who would be "given to us." To this child, introduced to us earlier as "Immanuel (7:14)," Isaiah ascribes <u>four</u> more *glorious* titles, and declares that He will <u>rule</u> on the throne of David "forevermore:"

> For a <u>child</u> will be **born to us**, a <u>son</u> will be **given to us**; And the **government** will rest on **His shoulders**; And **His name** will be called *Wonderful Counselor*, *Mighty God*, *Eternal Father, Prince of Peace*.

There will be **no end** to the increase of *His* government or of *peace,* On the <u>throne of David</u> and over his kingdom, To establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness From then on and *forevermore*. The **zeal** of the **LORD of hosts** will accomplish this. (Isaiah 9:6-7)

2. The prophet **Micah** also **confirms** the *messianic* **reading** of Isaiah 7:13-15 in his well-known **prophecy** concerning **Messiah's** <u>birth</u> in **Bethlehem**:

"But as for you, **Bethlehem Ephrathah**, *Too* little to be among the clans of **Judah**,

From you <u>One</u> will go forth for Me to be <u>ruler</u> in Israel. His goings forth are from long ago, from the days of eternity."

Therefore He (God) will give them (Israel) up until the time

→when **she** who is **in labor** has **borne a child**...(Micah 5:2-3a)

→This last phrase has long been recognized as referring to the <u>virgin</u> <u>birth</u> in Isaiah 7:13-15.

3. In our **final confirmation**, the gospel of **Matthew** declares plainly that the **birth of Jesus** to **Miriam (Mary)**, a **Jewish** <u>virgin</u>, was indeed the *fulfillment* of the **Immanuel prophecy** given by **Isaiah** (7:14).

Now the **birth** of **Jesus the Messiah** was as follows: when **His mother Mary** had been **betrothed** to **Joseph**, *before* they came together she was found to be **with** <u>child</u> by the **Holy Spirit**...

Now all this took place to <u>fulfill</u> what was spoken by **the Lord** through the **prophet**:

"BEHOLD, THE <u>VIRGIN</u> SHALL BE WITH CHILD AND SHALL BEAR A SON, AND THEY SHALL CALL HIS NAME <u>IMMANUEL</u>," which translated means, "GOD WITH US." (Matthew 1:18, 22-23)
