 - ⁸ The Lord sends a message against Jacob, and it falls on Israel.

⁹ And all the people know it, that is, Ephraim and the inhabitants of Samaria, asserting in <u>pride</u> and in <u>arrogance</u> of heart:

10 "The *bricks* have fallen down,
But we will <u>rebuild</u> with *smooth stones*;
The *sycamores* have been cut down,
But we will <u>replace</u> them with cedars."

¹¹ Therefore **the Lord** raises **against them adversaries** from **Rezin** and **spurs** their **enemies on**,

¹² The Arameans on the east and the Philistines on the west; and they devour Israel with gaping jaws.
In spite of all this, His anger does not turn away and His hand is still stretched out.

- 2) **Proclaiming Judgments** against <u>Ungodliness</u> and <u>Evil</u> in <u>all</u> Levels of their Society (9:13-17)
 - ¹³ Yet the **people do** *not* <u>turn back</u> to **Him** who **struck them**, <u>nor</u> do they **seek** the **LORD of hosts**.
 - ¹⁴ So the LORD cuts off <u>head</u> and <u>tail</u> from Israel, both <u>palm branch</u> and <u>bulrush</u> in a single day.
 - ¹⁵ The <u>head</u> is the *elder* and *honorable man*, and the *prophet* who teaches falsehood is the <u>tail</u>.
 - ¹⁶ For **those** who **guide** this **people** are **leading them astray**; and **those** who are **guided** by **them** are brought to **confusion**.
 - ¹⁷ Therefore the Lord does <u>not</u> take pleasure in their young men, nor does He have pity on their orphans or their widows; for every one of them is <u>godless</u> and an <u>evildoer</u>, and <u>every mouth</u> is <u>speaking foolishness</u>.
 - In spite of all this, **His anger** does <u>not</u> turn away and **His hand** is still **stretched out**.
 - 3) *Portraying* a land Consumed by the Lord's <u>Anger</u>, and their *own* <u>Wickedness</u> (9:18-21)
 - ¹⁸ For wickedness burns like a fire; it consumes briars and thorns; it even sets the thickets of the forest aflame and they roll upward in a column of smoke.
 - ¹⁹ By the *fury* of the LORD of hosts the land is *burned up*, and the people are like *fuel* for the fire; no man *spares* his brother.
 - They slice off what is on the right hand but still are hungry, and they eat what is on the left hand but they are not satisfied; each of them eats the flesh of his own arm.
 - ²¹ Manasseh devours Ephraim, and Ephraim Manasseh, and together they are against Judah.
 - In spite of all this, **His anger** does <u>not</u> turn away and **His hand** is still **stretched out**.
- 4) *Predicting* "Woe" upon those who enact evil Statutes and unjust Decisions (10:1-4)

10 Woe to those who enact evil statutes and to those who constantly record unjust decisions,

² So as to <u>deprive</u> the <u>needy of <u>iustice</u> and <u>rob</u> the <u>poor</u> of <u>My people</u> of <u>their</u> rights, so that <u>widows</u> may be <u>their spoil</u> and that they may <u>plunder</u> the <u>orphans</u>.</u>

³ Now what will you do in the **day of punishment**, and in the **devastation** which will come from **afar?**

To whom will you flee for help?
And where will you leave your wealth?

⁴ Nothing *remains* but to **crouch** among the **captives** or **fall** among the **slain**.

In *spite of* all this, **His anger** does <u>not</u> turn away And **His** *hand* is still **stretched out**.

Personal Application Isaiah's Warnings to Israel, and to our Nation as well

1. Isaiah *warns us* that, having experienced the **judgment of God** because of **sin**, we should **repent** rather than **respond** with **pride** and "**arrogance of heart:**"

"The **bricks** have **fallen down**,

But **we** will **rebuild** with **smooth stones**;

The **sycamores** have been **cut down**,

But **we** will **replace them** with **cedars**."(9:9-10)

2. Isaiah warned that judgment was coming to Israel because evil had permeated all levels of society. Isaiah's warning applies to all levels of our society as well. To the leaders who lead people astray, to the young men, to the orphans and even to the widows comes this warning—

"..the LORD cuts off head and tail from Israel, both palm branch and bulrush in a single day...

..for **every one** of them is **godless** and an **evildoer**, and **every mouth** is **speaking foolishness**." (9:14,17b)

3. Isaiah warned Israel that;

"...wickedness burns like a fire;
it consumes briars and thorns;
it even sets the thickets of the forest aflame..."

no man spares his brother...

each of them <u>eats</u> the flesh of his <u>own arm</u>.

Manasseh devours Ephraim, and Ephraim Manasseh, and together they are against Judah. (9:18a, 19c, 20b-21a)

I believe that **like Israel, God** will allow **our own <u>wickedness</u>** to **consume us** like fire. If we **don't** *repent* and turn from **evil**, and become once again <u>one</u> nation *under* <u>God</u>— indivisible, "hunger" will come, resulting in deep divisions, and *we too* will "devour" one another through anarchy and civil war.

4. Isaiah *warned* those in **Israel** who would "enact *evil* <u>statutes</u>," and inscribe into law "unjust <u>decisions</u> (10:1)." These <u>statutes</u> were enacted so as:

"...to *deprive* the <u>needy</u> of justice and *rob* the <u>poor</u> of My people of *their* rights, so that <u>widows</u> may be their spoil and that they may plunder the orphans." (10:2)

These "unjust decisions" were contrary to Mosaic Law, which decreed special protections for certain classes of people that were *vulnerable* to those in power who might take advantage of their needy condition. (Exodus 22:22, Deuteronomy 10:18, 27:19)

These warnings apply to us as a nation as well. We too are not to take unfair advantage of the needy and vulnerable among us. Instead we are to "love our neighbor as ourselves," and help provide for the needs of others. As human beings we were all originally made after the image of God (Gen. 1:26), and are greatly valued by our Creator. Our laws are to reflect the value of all human life, and to promote justice for all people. This includes both rich and poor, strong and weak, esteemed and humble, old and young, and yes, born and unborn. Since 1973, 65 million innocent children have been "legally" killed within their mothers' wombs.

"Woe to those who enact evil statutes and to those who constantly record unjust decisions,.." (10:1)

5. Isaiah warned Israel that in spite of all these impending judgments against them:

"His anger does <u>not</u> turn away and His hand is still stretched out (against them). (9:12)

I believe that **our nation** is at a point where we are "reaping **corruption**," and **experiencing** a **partial** <u>judgment</u> for **our sins**.

For the <u>wrath</u> of God is revealed from heaven against all *ungodliness* and *unrighteousness* of men who **suppress** the **truth** in *unrighteousness*, (Romans 1:18)

As we celebrate of **Independence Day** this year, let us <u>heed</u> these *warnings* in **Isaiah**. May we **seek the Lord** and **His righteousness**, and *never* get to the point where it is *too late*, where "**God's** *anger* does <u>not</u> turn away.

and His hand is still stretched out (against us)." (9:12, 17, 21, 10:4)
