2 The word which Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning *Judah* and *Jerusalem*.

² Now it will come about that in the <u>last days</u>
The <u>mountain</u> of the <u>house</u> of the <u>LORD</u>
Will be established as the <u>chief</u> of the <u>mountains</u>,

And will be **raised above** the hills; And **all** the **nations** will **stream** to it.

³ And many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, To the <u>house</u> of the God of Jacob;

That **He** may **teach us** concerning **His ways**And that **we** may **walk** in **His paths**."

For the **law** will **go forth** from **Zion**And the **word** of the **Lord** from **Jerusalem**.

⁴ And **He** will <u>iudge</u> between the **nations**, And will **render decisions** for **many peoples**;

And they will *hammer* their **swords** into **plowshares** and their **spears** into **pruning hooks**.

Nation will <u>not</u> lift up sword against nation, And never again will they *learn war*.

Message Summary Characteristics of the Coming Kingdom

A. In the "last days" the "<u>mountain</u> of the <u>house</u> of the **LORD**, will be **established** as the *chief* of the **mountains** (2:2)." The word "**mountain**" in **prophetic scripture** denotes a **governing authority**.

Isaiah's prophetic vision declares that the governing authority in the "last days" will be based in Jerusalem, particularly from the temple—the "house" of the Lord. This "mountain" or kingdom will be established as the "chief of the mountains." It will "be raised above" all other governments (mountains), exercising authority over all other nations and kingdoms (2:2). Thus <u>Israel</u> and <u>Jerusalem</u> will be preeminent among all the nations at the end of the age.

"At *that time* I will bring you in, Even at the time when I **gather you together**;

Indeed, I will give you <u>renown</u> and <u>praise</u>
Among all the **peoples** of the **earth**,
When I <u>restore</u> your fortunes before your eyes,"
Says **the LORD**. (Zephaniah 3:20)

"The sons of those who afflicted you (Jerusalem) will come *bowing* to you, and all those who despised you will *bow themselves* at the soles of your feet;
And they will call you the <u>city</u> of the LORD,
The <u>Zion</u> of the Holy One of Israel. (Isaiah 60:14)

B. The place of the future governing authority (Jerusalem) will be the <u>desire</u> of *all* nations and peoples. All the nations will "*stream* to it," and people will say to one another, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob (2:3a)."

So many **peoples** and mighty **nations** will come to **seek** the **LORD of hosts in <u>Jerusalem</u>** and to entreat the **favor** of the **LORD**.

"Thus says the **LORD of hosts**,
"In *those days* ten men from all the **nations** will grasp
the garment of <u>a Jew</u>, saying, "Let us **go <u>with</u> you**,
for we have heard that **God is with you**."" (Zechariah 8:22-23)

C. The **coming kingdom** will be **characterized** by the **teaching** of the **word of the LORD**. This will be **yearned for** by the **nations**, who will "**stream**" to **Jerusalem** to **hear the law**, and the **word of God** (2:3b-c). Specifically, they will **come** to **Jerusalem** •>

- → That the God of Jacob may (personally) <u>teach us</u> concerning **His ways**, and that "we may <u>walk</u> in **His paths** (2:3b)."
- → "For the <u>law</u> will go forth from <u>Zion</u>, and the <u>word</u> of the LORD from <u>Jerusalem</u> (2:3c)."

Many nations will come and say,

"Come and let us *go up* to the mountain of the LORD

And to the house of the God of Jacob,

That <u>He</u> may <u>teach us</u> about His ways

And that we may <u>walk</u> in His paths."

For from <u>Zion</u> will go forth <u>the law</u>,

Even the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. (Micah 4:2)

D. During the **time** of this **future kingdom**, **God** will "**judge** between the **nations** (2:4a)." **He** will "**render decisions** for **many peoples** (2:4b)."

Let the **field exult**, and all that is in it.

Then all the **trees** of the forest will **sing for joy**Before the **LORD**, for **He is coming**,

For **He** is coming to **judge the earth**.

He will <u>judge</u> the **world** in *righteousness*And the **peoples** in **His** *faithfulness*. (Psalm 96:12-13)

- E. During the **time** of this **coming future kingdom**:
 - → "they will **hammer** their *swords* into <u>plowshares</u> and their *spears* into pruning hooks (2:4b)"
 - → "Nation will <u>not</u> lift up <u>sword</u> against nation (2:4c),"
 - → "and **never again** will they <u>learn war</u> (2:4c)."

The coming kingdom will be characterized by a true and lasting peace.

Personal Application I know the Kingdom is coming, but what do I do now, the world is in conflict? We live confidently, in anticipation of the Kingdom—

1. By *Recognizing* that **Israel** and **Jerusalem** will one day be **redeemed** and **restored**, and will be **preeminent** among the **nations**

Now it will come about that in the *last days*The *mountain* of the *house* of the Lord
Will be established as the <u>chief</u> of the mountains, (2:2)

2. By *Remaining* diligent in the study of <u>God's word</u>, "that He may teach us concerning His ways and we may walk in His paths (4:3)."

Your <u>word</u> is a **lamp** to **my feet** and a **light** to **my path**. (Psalm 119:105)

All <u>Scripture</u> is *inspired by God* and profitable for <u>teaching</u>, for reproof, for correction, for <u>training</u> in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work. (II Timothy 3:16-17)

3. By *Realizing* that *He* that will "judge between the nations," and "render decisions for many peoples;" stands ready to guide us in wisdom, in the decisions we make each day.

Good and upright is the LORD;
Therefore He <u>instructs</u> sinners in the way.
He leads the humble in justice,
And He <u>teaches</u> the humble His way...

Who is the man who fears the LORD?

<u>He</u> will <u>instruct</u> him in the *way* he should <u>choose</u>.

(Proverbs 25:8-9, 12)

But if any of you lacks <u>wisdom</u>, let him ask of God, who <u>gives</u> to all generously and without reproach, and it will be <u>given</u> to him. (James 1:5)

4. By *Resolving* that, as much as it is **up to us**, we are to **pursue** and **promote <u>peace</u>**, "for the **kingdom of God** is...**righteousness** and **peace** and **joy** in the **Holy Spirit** (Romans 14:17)

If possible, so far as it **depends on you**, be at **peace** with **all men**. (Rom. 12:18)

"Blessed are the <u>peacemakers</u>, for they shall be called **sons of God**." (Matthew 5:9)

5. By *Reminding* ourselves of our kingdom <u>hope</u>, even when all seems hopeless (Romans 4:17-20)
