"Loving One Another"

I. Defining Biblical Love

→ Hebrew—<u>ahav</u> - to "love"—to have a strong emotional <u>attachment</u> to, and <u>desire</u>, either to possess or to be in the presence of something or someone. (Vine)

<u>chesed</u>— loving-kindness, "*steadfast* love; grace; mercy; faithfulness; goodness; *devotion*—"When man is the subject of <u>chesed</u>, the word usually describes a person's *kindness* or *loyalty* to another." (Vine)

→ Greek—<u>agape</u>—" a pure, willful, sacrificial love that intentionally desires another's highest good" (Alyssa Roat) Agape <u>love</u> involves *faithfulness*, *commitment*, and an act of the *will* (doing)

<u>**phileo**</u>—defined as an *affectionate* **love**, a fondness, the **love** of friends—**brotherly love**

eros—a desire to possess and enjoy an object of desire (sexual love)

II. The *Principal* of <u>Love</u>

A. Love \rightarrow the *essence* of the <u>Mosaic Law</u>

You shall *not hate* your fellow countryman in your **heart;...** You shall *not* take **vengeance**, nor bear any **grudge** against the sons of your **people**, but you shall <u>love</u> your neighbor as yourself; I am the LORD. (Leviticus 19:17-18)

Owe nothing to anyone except to <u>love one another</u>; for he who <u>loves</u> his neighbor has fulfilled *the* <u>law.</u>

For this, "YOU SHALL **NOT** COMMIT **ADULTERY**, YOU SHALL **NOT MURDER**, YOU SHALL **NOT STEAL**, YOU SHALL **NOT COVET**," and if there is any other **commandment**, it is **summed up** in this saying, "YOU SHALL **LOVE** YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF."

Love does *no wrong* to a **neighbor;** therefore <u>love</u> is the <u>fulfillment</u> of *the* <u>law</u>. (Romans 13:8-10)

B. Love→ the *essence* of <u>New Covenant Law</u>

"A *new* commandment I give to you, that you <u>love one another</u>, even as I have loved you, that you also <u>love one another</u>.

By this **all men** will *know* that you are <u>My</u> *disciples,* if you have <u>love</u> for one another." (John 13:34-35)

Now as to the <u>love</u> of the brethren, you have no need for *anyone* to write to you, for you yourselves are *taught by God* to <u>love</u> one another; (I Thessalonians 4:9)

III. The *Priority* of <u>Love</u>

But the <u>goal</u> of our instruction is <u>love</u> from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith. (I Timothy 1:5)

> But now **faith, hope**, <u>love</u>, abide these three; But the *greatest* of these is <u>love</u>. (I Corinthians 13:13)

IV. The *Practice* of <u>Love</u>

Love is **patient**, *love* is **kind** *and* is **not jealous**; *love* does **not brag** *and* is **not arrogant**, does not act **unbecomingly**; it does not **seek its own**, is **not provoked**,

does not take into **account a wrong** *suffered*, does **not rejoice** in **unrighteousness**, but **rejoices** with the **truth**; **bears** all things, **believes** all things, **hopes** all things, **endures** all things. *Love* **never fails**;.. (I Corinthians 13:4-8a)

A. *Love* is **patient** \rightarrow "makrothumeo"- **longsuffering**, forbearance

...put on a **heart** of ...*kindness, humility, gentleness* and **patience**; (Colossians 3:12)

Therefore I (Paul), the **prisoner** of **the Lord**, implore you to **walk** in a manner worthy of the **calling** with which you have been **called**,... with **patience**, showing **tolerance** for **one another in** <u>love</u>, (Ephesians 4:1-2)

B. *Love* is kind \rightarrow "chresteuomai" – useful, beneficial, good, gracious

Be <u>kind</u> to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Messiah also has forgiven you. (Ephesians 4:32)

C. *Love* is <u>not jealous</u>→ "zeloo" – not moved with <u>envy</u>, or feelings of displeasure over the *advantage* or *prosperity* of others

Be devoted to one another in brotherly <u>love;</u> give <u>preference</u> to one another in honor; (Romans 12:10)

A sound heart is life to the body, But <u>envy</u> is rottenness to the bones. (Proverbs 14:30)

D. Love does not <u>brag</u>→ "perpereuomei" – <u>boast</u> or <u>vaunt</u> one's self Love is not <u>arrogant</u>→ "phusioo" – "inflated" with <u>pride</u>

For I say, through the **grace** given to me, to everyone who is among you, <u>not</u> to think *of himself* <u>more highly</u> than he **ought to think**, but to think **soberly**, as **God** has dealt to *each one* a measure of *faith*. (Romans 12:3)

Do you see a man <u>wise</u> in *his own eyes?* There is **more hope** for a **fool** than for **him**. (Proverbs 26:12)

E. *Love* does not act <u>unbecomingly</u> \rightarrow "aschemoneo" – unseemly

Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children; and walk in love,...

But *immorality* or any *impurity* or *greed* must <u>not</u> even be named among you, as is <u>proper</u> among saints; and *there must be no filthiness* and *silly talk*, or *coarse jesting*, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks. (Ephesians 5:1-2a, 3-4)

F. *Love* does not <u>seek its own</u>→ "ou zetei ta eautes" – is not <u>selfish</u> or <u>self-centered</u>

...make my joy complete ... maintaining the same love, ...

Do nothing from <u>selfishness</u> or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than *yourselves*; do <u>not</u> *merely* look out for your own <u>personal interests</u>, but also for the interests of <u>others</u>. (Philippians 2:3-4)

G. *Love* is **not provoked** → "paroxuno" – **roused** to **anger**, stirred up

Do not *hasten* in **your spirit** to be <u>angry</u>, For <u>anger</u> rests in the **bosom of** *fools*. (Ecclesiastes 7:9)

A stone is *heavy* and the sand *weighty*, But the <u>provocation</u> of a fool is <u>heavier</u> than both of them. (Proverbs 27:3)

H. *Love* does not take into <u>account</u> a wrong *suffered*→ "ou logizetai to kakon"- does <u>not</u> keep a "record" one's wrongdoing

You shall <u>not</u> take **vengeance**, nor <u>bear any grudge</u> against the sons of your people, but you shall <u>love</u> your neighbor as yourself; I am the LORD. (Leviticus 19:18)

He who <u>covers</u> a transgression seeks <u>love</u>, but he who *repeats* a matter *separates* intimate friends. (Prov. 17:9)

I. Love does not rejoice in <u>unrighteousness</u>, but rejoices with

the <u>truth</u> \rightarrow "ou chairei epi te adikia synchairei de te aletheia" – does <u>not</u> rejoice in <u>iniquity</u> (or have **pleasure** in those have **fallen into sin**), but rejoices in that which is **virtuous, pious, and good**

> Let <u>love</u> be without hypocrisy. abhor what is evil; *cling* to what <u>is good</u>. (Romans 12:9)

J. Love bears all things → "stego" – to hold out against, endure

...I (Paul), the **prisoner** of **the Lord**, implore you to **walk** in a manner worthy of the *calling* with which you have been *called*,... with <u>patience</u>, showing <u>tolerance</u> for **one another in** <u>love</u>, (Eph. 4:1-2)

K. *Love* <u>believes</u> all things \rightarrow "pisteuo" – to be persuaded of, to trust

A friend loves at <u>all</u> times, and a **brother** is born for **adversity.** (Proverbs 17:17)

L. Love <u>hopes</u> all things \rightarrow "elpizo" - "favorable and confident <u>expectation</u>," the happy anticipation of <u>good</u>

Let us *hold fast* the confession of our <u>hope</u> without wavering, for He who promised is *faithful*; and let us consider how to *stimulate* one another to <u>love</u> and *good deeds*, (Hebrews 10:23-24)

M. *Love* <u>endures</u> all things → "hupomeno" – "to abide under, <u>bear up</u> courageously" (under suffering)

For you showed *sympathy* to the **prisoners** and **accepted** *joyfully* the *seizure* of **your property**, knowing that you have for yourselves a *better* **possession** and a *lasting one*.

Therefore, do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward.

For you have need of <u>endurance</u>, so that when you have **done** the *will of God*, you may *receive* what was *promised*. (Hebrews 10:34-36)

N. *Love* never <u>fails</u>; \rightarrow "ekpipto" – never "falls away," or ceases to be

Give thanks to the **God of heaven**, For **His** <u>lovingkindness</u> is *everlasting*. (Psalm 136:26)

The one who **does not love** does **not know God**, for **<u>God</u> is love**. (I John 4:8)
