Maintaining **Strength** through **Stressful Times**

Paul's *Motivation* for Ministry in times of <u>Stress</u> and <u>Hardship</u>

A. Paul's Life of <u>Affliction</u> and <u>Stress</u>

Are they **Hebrews**? So am I. Are they **Israelites**? So am I. Are they descendants of **Abraham**? So am I.

Are they **servants of Messiah**? (I speak as if insane) I more so; In far more **labors**, in far more **imprisonments**, **beaten** times without number, often in danger of **death**. Five times I received of the Jews **thirty-nine** *lashes*. Three times I was beaten with **rods**, once I was **stoned**, three times I was **shipwrecked**, a day and a night I have spent in the **deep**.

I have been on frequent journeys, in dangers from rivers, dangers from robbers, dangers from my countrymen, dangers from the Gentiles, dangers in the city, dangers in the wilderness, dangers on the sea, dangers among false brethren; I have been in labor and hardship, through many sleepless nights, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure.

Apart from such external things, there is the daily pressure upon me of concern for all the churches. Who is weak without my being weak?

Who is led into sin without my intense concern?

(II Corinthians 11:22-29)

B. Paul's Life and Motivation for Ministry

1. Paul was Motivated because of an Eternal Calling

a. A *Calling* from **Birth**

But when **God**, who had **set me apart** *even* from my <u>mother's womb</u> and <u>called me</u> through **His** *grace*, was pleased to **reveal His Son in me** that I might **preach Him** among the **Gentiles**, I did **not** immediately consult with **flesh** and **blood**,... but I went away to Arabia, and returned once more to Damascus. (Galatians 1:15-17)

b. A Calling according to God's Grace

For I (Paul) am the *least* of the apostles, and *not fit* to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.

But by the <u>grace</u> of God I am what I am, and His <u>grace</u> toward me did *not* prove vain; but I labored even *more* than all of them, yet not I, but the <u>grace</u> of God with me. (I Corinthians 15:9-10)

c. A *Calling* that would be **characterized** by **Suffering**

But the Lord said to him (Ananias),

"Go, for he (Paul) is a chosen instrument of Mine,
to bear My name before the Gentiles and kings
and the sons of Israel; for I will show him how much
he must suffer for My name's sake."

(Acts 9:15-16)

For to <u>you</u> it has been granted for Messiah's sake, not only to *believe* in Him, but also to <u>suffer</u> for His sake,.. (Philippians 1:29)

2. Paul was *Motivated* knowing that his was Essential Ministry

a. A *Ministry* with the **Message** of <u>Salvation</u> and <u>Righteousness</u>

For I am **not** ashamed of the **gospel**, for it is the **power of God** for **salvation** to **everyone** who **believes**, to the **Jew first** and also to **the Greek**.

For in it the <u>righteousness</u> of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "BUT THE RIGHTEOUS man SHALL LIVE BY FAITH." (Romans 1:16-17)

b. A Ministry that Reconciles Men with God

Now all these things are from God,
who reconciled us to Himself through Messiah
and gave us the ministry of reconciliation, namely,
that God was in Messiah reconciling the world to Himself,
not counting their trespasses against them,
and He has committed to us the word of reconciliation.

Therefore, **we** are **ambassadors** for **Messiah**, as though **God** were making an appeal **through us**; **we beg you** on behalf of **Messiah**, be <u>reconciled</u> to **God**. (II Corinthians 5:18-20)

c. A *Ministry* of **Revelation**

For I would have you know, brethren, that the **gospel** which was preached by me is **not** according to **man**.

For I **neither** received it from **man**, **nor** was I **taught it**, but I received it through a <u>revelation</u> of Jesus the Messiah. (Galatians 1:11-12)

Let a man regard us in this manner, as **servants of Messiah** and **stewards** of the **mysteries of God**.

(I Corinthians 4:1)

3. **Paul** was *Motivated* by an **Earnest Love**

a. A Love for the Lord who died for Him

For the <u>love</u> of Messiah <u>controls us</u>,.. so that they who <u>live</u> might *no longer* live for themselves, but <u>for Him</u> who died and rose again on <u>their</u> behalf.

(II Corinthians 5:14-15)

I have been <u>crucified</u> with Messiah; and it is *no longer* I who live, but Messiah lives *in me;* and the *life* which I now live in the flesh
I live by <u>faith</u> in the Son of God,
who <u>loved me</u> and gave Himself up for me. (Galatians 2:20)

b. A Love that was exemplified in the Person of the Messiah

Therefore be <u>imitators</u> of God, as beloved children; and <u>walk in love</u>, just as Messiah also <u>loved you</u> and gave Himself up for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God as a fragrant aroma. (Ephesians 5:1-2)

c. A Love that characterized his ministry to others

Be devoted to one another in brotherly love;...

Owe nothing to anyone except to <u>love one another</u>; for he who <u>loves</u> his neighbor has fulfilled *the* law. (Romans 12:10a, 13:8)

4. Paul was *Motivated* and *Strengthened* through God's Empowering Presence

I (Paul) was with you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling, and my message and my preaching were not in persuasive words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith would not rest on the wisdom of men, but on the power of God.

(I Corinthians 2:3-5)

For this reason I bow my knees before **the Father**,...

that **He** would **grant you**, according to the **riches** of **His glory**, to be **strengthened** with **power** through **His Spirit** in the **inner man**,.. (Ephesians 3: 14-16)

5. Paul was *Motivated* by an Eventual Accountability

For we must <u>all</u> appear before the <u>judgment seat</u> of Messiah, so that each one may be <u>recompensed</u> for his deeds in the *body*, according to what he has done, whether *good* or *bad*.

Therefore, *knowing* the *fear* of the Lord, <u>we persuade men</u>, but we are made **manifest to God**; and I hope that we are made **manifest** also in **your consciences**.

(II Corinthians 5:10-11)

6. **Paul** was *Motivated* by an **Enduring Hope**

a. The Hope of eternal Salvation

For it is for this we *labor* and *strive*, because we have **fixed our <u>hope</u>** on the **living God**, who is the **Savior** of **all men**, especially of **believers**. (I Timothy 4:10)

b. The *Hope* of **eternal** <u>Life</u>

Paul, a bond-servant of God and an apostle of Jesus the Messiah, for the *faith* of those chosen of God and the knowledge of the *truth* which is according to godliness, in the <u>hope</u> of <u>eternal life</u>, which God, who *cannot* lie, promised long ages ago,..(Titus 1:1-2)

c. The *Hope* of **eternal** Glory

Therefore we do not <u>lose heart</u>, but though our *outer* man is *decaying*, yet our *inner* man is being *renewed* day by day.

For momentary, light affliction is producing for us an <u>eternal</u> weight of glory far beyond all comparison, while we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen; for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are <u>eternal</u>. (II Corinthians 4:16-18)

d. The *Hope* of the <u>coming</u> of the <u>eternal Savior</u>

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men, instructing us to...live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age, looking for the <u>blessed hope</u> and the <u>appearing</u> of the glory of our great God and Savior, Messiah Jesus,..(Titus 2:11-13)
