The **Gospel** of the **Servant of God**

I. The *Service* of the **Servant** (1:1-10:52)

A. His *Preparation* for Ministry (1:1-20)

B. His *Powerful* Ministry (1:21-3:12)

- 1. *Power* over Unclean or Demonic Spirits (1:21-28)
- ²¹ They went into **Capernaum**; and *immediately* on the **Sabbath He (Jesus)** entered the **synagogue** and *began* to <u>teach</u>.
- ²² They (the people) were **amazed** at **His teaching**; for **He** was **teaching** them as *one* having **authority**, and **not** as the **scribes**.

²³ Just then there was a man in their synagogue with an <u>unclean spirit</u>; and he cried out, ²⁴ saying, "What business do we have with each other, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us?

I know who You are—the Holy One of God!"

- ²⁵ And Jesus <u>rebuked him</u>, saying, "Be quiet, and <u>come out</u> of him!"
 - ²⁶ Throwing him into **convulsions**, the <u>unclean spirit</u> *cried out* with a **loud voice** and <u>came out</u> of him.
- ²⁷ They were all amazed, so that they debated among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority!
 <u>He</u> commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey Him."
 - ²⁸ *Immediately* the **news** about **Him spread everywhere** into **all** the surrounding district of **Galilee.**
 - 2. *Power* over <u>Disease</u> (1:29-34)
- ²⁹ And *immediately* after they came out of the **synagogue**, they came into the house of **Simon** and **Andrew**, with **James** and **John**.
 - Now Simon's mother-in-law was lying sick with a <u>fever</u>; and *immediately* they *spoke to Jesus about her.
- ³¹ And **He came** to her and *raised* her up, taking her by the hand, and the fever <u>left her</u>, and she *waited* on them.

³² When **evening** came, after the **sun had set**, they *began* **bringing to Him all** who **were ill** and those who were **demon-possessed**.

³³ And the **whole city** had gathered at the **door**.

³⁴ And He <u>healed</u> many who were ill with various <u>diseases</u>, and <u>cast out</u> many demons; and He was not permitting the demons to speak, because they *knew* who He was.

3. *Prayer* in the Early Morning (1:35-39)

³⁵ In the **early morning,** while it was **still dark, Jesus got up**, left *the house*, and went away to a **secluded place**, and was **praying there**.

³⁶ Simon and his companions searched for Him;

³⁷ they found **Him**, and *said to **Him**, "Everyone is looking for **You**."

³⁸ He said to them, "Let us go somewhere else to the towns nearby, so that I may <u>preach</u> there also; for that is what I came for."

³⁹ And **He went** into their **synagogues** throughout all **Galilee**, **preaching** and **casting out** the **demons**.

4. *Power* over Leprosy (1:40-45)

⁴⁰ And a **leper** came to **Jesus**, **beseeching Him** and *falling* on **his knees before Him**, and saying, "**If You are willing**, **You** can **make me clean**."

⁴¹ Moved with *compassion*, Jesus stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, "*I am* willing; <u>be cleansed</u>."

42 Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cleansed.

43 And He sternly warned him and immediately sent him away,

⁴⁴ and **He** said to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone; but go, show yourself to the <u>priest</u> and <u>offer</u> for your cleansing what **Moses commanded**, as a testimony to them."

45 But he went out and began to <u>proclaim it</u> freely and to spread the news around, to such an extent that Jesus could no longer <u>publicly</u> enter a city, but stayed out in unpopulated areas; and they were coming to Him from everywhere.

Mark 1:1-45→Prophetic Observations

The Preparation and Ministry of Jesus in Mark 1:1-45 Fulfills the Prophetic Predictions of the Servant of God (Messiah) in the book of Isaiah

A. In the book of **Malachi** and **Isaiah** it declares that **the LORD** would be sending a **messenger** to "*clear* the **way**" before **Him**. A "**voice**" would be calling to **make** *smooth* a **highway** for our **God** (Malachi 3:1, Isaiah 40:3).

Fulfillment→In Mark's gospel we read that these prophetic texts were fulfilled by the appearance and ministry of John the prophet:

As it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

"BEHOLD, I SEND MY MESSENGER AHEAD OF YOU, WHO WILL PREPARE YOUR WAY;

THE <u>VOICE</u> OF **ONE CRYING** IN THE **WILDERNESS**, 'MAKE READY THE **WAY OF THE LORD**, MAKE **HIS PATHS** STRAIGHT."

John the Baptist appeared in the *wilderness* preaching a baptism of *repentance* (Mark 1:2-4a)

B. In the book of **Isaiah** we read these **prophecies** concerning **Messiah**, the **Servant of God**:

"Behold, <u>My Servant</u>, whom I uphold; My chosen one in whom <u>My soul delights</u>. I have put <u>My Spirit</u> upon Him; He will bring forth justice to the nations. (Isaiah 42:1)

Then a **shoot** will **spring** from the **stem of Jesse**, And a **branch** from **his roots** will **bear fruit**.

The <u>Spirit</u> of the LORD will <u>rest</u> on Him,

The <u>spirit</u> of <u>wisdom</u> and <u>understanding</u>,

The <u>spirit</u> of <u>counsel</u> and <u>strength</u>,

The <u>spirit</u> of <u>knowledge</u> and the <u>fear</u> of <u>the LORD</u>. (Isaiah 11:1-2)

Fulfillment→ In Mark's gospel we read how Jesus was "anointed" by the Spirit of God when He began His public ministry.

In those days **Jesus** came from **Nazareth** in **Galilee** and was **baptized** by **John** in the **Jordan**.

Immediately coming up out of the water, He saw the heavens opening, and the <u>Spirit</u> like a dove descending upon Him;

and a **voice** came out of the **heavens**: "You are My beloved Son, in You I am well-pleased." (Mark 1:9-11)

C. In the book of **Isaiah** we read that the **Servant of God** would bring a message of **good news** (the **gospel**):

The **Spirit of the Lord GoD** is upon **me**,

Because **the Lord** has **anointed me**To bring **good news** to the **afflicted**;

He has sent me to bind up the *brokenhearted*,
To proclaim **liberty** to *captives* and **freedom** to *prisoners*;
To proclaim the **favorable year** of **the Lord**..(Isaiah 61:1-2a)

Fulfillment→ In the **gospel of Mark** we read:

Now after **John** (the prophet) had been taken into **custody**, **Jesus** came into **Galilee**, **preaching** the **gospel of God**, and saying,

"The time is **fulfilled**, and the **kingdom of God** is at hand; **repent** and **believe** in the **gospel**." (Mark 1:14-15)

D. In the book of **Isaiah** we read that the **word** of **God's Servant** (**Messiah**) would have **authority** and **power**:

He (the LORD) has made My mouth like a sharp sword, In the shadow of His hand He has concealed Me; (Isaiah 49:2)

Fulfillment→In the **gospel of Mark** we read:

They (**Messiah** and **His disciples**) *went into **Capernaum**; and *immediately* on the **Sabbath He** entered the **synagogue** and *began* to <u>teach</u>.

They were **amazed** at **His teaching**; for **He** was **teaching them** as **one** having **authority**, and **not** as the **scribes**...

They (the people) were **all amazed**, so that they **debated** among themselves, saying, "**What** is this? A **new teaching** with <u>authority</u>! **He** <u>commands</u> even the <u>unclean spirits</u>, and they <u>obey Him</u>." (Mark 1:21-22, 27)

E. In the book of **Isaiah** we read concerning the **suffering Servant** of **God** that:

Surely our griefs He Himself bore, and our sorrows He carried;..(Isaiah 53:4a)

Fulfillment→ In the **gospels** of **Mark** and **Matthew** we read:

And **He (Messiah)** <u>healed</u> many who were ill with <u>various diseases</u>, and <u>cast out</u> many **demons**;.. (Mark 1:34)

¹⁶ When evening came, they brought **to Him** many who were **demon-possessed**; and **He** <u>cast out</u> the **spirits** with a <u>word</u>, and <u>healed</u> all who were ill.

This was to **fulfill** what was spoken through **Isaiah the prophet**: "HE HIMSELF TOOK **OUR INFIRMITIES** AND **CARRIED AWAY** OUR **DISEASES.**" (Matthew 8:16-17)
