Philippians A <u>Personal</u> Letter from Your Rabbi, the "Prisoner"

I. Paul's *Introduction* to the Philippians (1:1-11)

II. Paul's *Imprisonment* Perspective (1:12-26)

A. His *Explanation* on how his *Prison* Circumstances have <u>Advanced</u> the **Ministry** of the **Gospel** (1:12-18)

¹² Now I want you to know, brethren, that my circumstances have turned out for the <u>greater progress</u> of the <u>gospel</u>, ¹³ so that my *imprisonment* in the cause of Messiah has become well known throughout the whole praetorian guard and to everyone else,

¹⁴ and that most of the brethren, trusting in the Lord because of my imprisonment, have far more courage to <u>speak</u> the <u>word of God</u> without fear.

¹⁵ Some, to be sure, are preaching Messiah even from envy and strife, but some also from good will; ¹⁶ the latter do it out of love, knowing that I am appointed for the defense of the gospel;

¹⁷ the **former proclaim Messiah** out of **selfish ambition** rather than from **pure motives**, thinking to cause me **distress** in **my imprisonment**.

¹⁸ What then? Only that in **every way**, whether in **pretense** or in **truth**, **Messiah is proclaimed**; and in this **I rejoice**.

B. His *Expectation* of **Deliverance** (1:19)

Yes, and **I will** *rejoice*,

19 for **I know** that **this** will turn out for **my** <u>deliverance</u> through your *prayers* and the *provision* of the *Spirit* of Jesus the Messiah,

C. His *Essential Priority*—the <u>Exaltation</u> of the <u>Messiah</u> (1:20-21)

²⁰ according to my **earnest expectation** and **hope**, that I will **not** be put to **shame** in anything, but *that* with all **boldness**, **Messiah** will even **now**, as **always**, be **exalted** in **my body**, whether by **life** or by **death**.

²¹ For to me, to live is Messiah and to die is gain.

D. His *Earnest* inward <u>Struggle</u> on whether to "**Depart**" this world, or "Remain" for their sake (1:22-26)

²² But if *I am* to **live** *on* **in the flesh**, this *will mean* **fruitful labor** for me; and I do **not** know *which* **to choose**.

²³ But I am <u>hard-pressed</u> from *both directions*, having the desire to <u>depart</u> and be with Messiah, for *that* is very much better;
²⁴ yet to remain on in the flesh is more necessary for your sake.

Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all for your progress and joy in the faith,
 so that your proud confidence in me may abound in Messiah Jesus through my coming to you again.

Chapter Summary A Closer Look at Rabbi Paul's Perspective and Priorities

A. Paul's **Divine Perspective**

- 1. *Recognizing* that his **imprisonment** has actually **worked** to <u>advance</u> the <u>ministry</u> of the <u>gospel</u> (1:12-18)
 - a. **Because** of his **testimony** among the **elite Roman guard** (1:13)
 - b. *Because* his **imprisonment** has *emboldened* the **brethren** to <u>preach</u> without **fear** (1:14)
 - c. **Because** in <u>every way</u>, whether from **envy** and **strife**, or **good will**, whether from **selfish ambition**, or **pure motives**, whether in **pretense**, or in **truth**, <u>Messiah is proclaimed</u> (1:15-18)
- 2. Remaining ready, at any time to "depart" and be with his Messiah (1:21-23)

B. Paul's Messiah-centered Life

- 1. *Praying* that the **Philippians** be "**filled** with the **fruit of righteousness**," which comes **through Jesus the Messiah** (1:11a)
- 2. **Pronouncing** his **imprisonment** to be **for** the **cause of Messiah** (1:13a)
- 3. **Professing** his joy, that regardless of **motive**, **Messiah** is being **proclaimed** (1:18)
- 4. *Pronouncing* his anticipation of <u>deliverance</u> through prayer and the provision of the "Spirit of Jesus the Messiah"
- 5. *Proclaiming* His **earnest desire** to **exalt** the **Messiah** (in **his body**) whether by "life or by **death**" (1:20)
- 6. **Proclaiming** that for him, "to live is Messiah and to die is gain" (1:21)

- 7. *Preferring* to "depart" and "be with Messiah," which would be very much better (1:23)
- 8. *Predicting* that his **release** (from **prison**), and his **coming** to them, would result in a proud, abounding **confidence in him** <u>in Messiah Jesus</u> (1:26)

C. Paul's **Discipleship** Priority

1. His Passion to spread the Gospel Message

"Now I want you to know.., that **my circumstances** have turned out for the **greater progress** of the **gospel**." (1:12)

"...and that **most** of the **brethren**,.. have far more **courage** to **speak** the **word of God** without **fear**." (1:14)

"What then? Only that in *every* way,..

Messiah is proclaimed; and *in this* I rejoice." (1:18)

2. **His** *Priority* for the **Growth** and **Well-being** of the **Believers**

But I am hard-pressed from both *directions*, having the *desire* to depart and <u>be</u> with Messiah, for *that* is very much better; yet to <u>remain</u> on in the flesh is more necessary for <u>your sake</u>.

Convinced of this, I know that I will <u>remain</u> and <u>continue</u> with you all for *your* <u>progress</u> and <u>joy</u> in the <u>faith</u>,..(1:23-25)

Personal Challenge Following the Rabbi's Example→

- → By *looking* at our **difficult circumstances** and **trials** from a "<u>divine</u> <u>perspective,</u>" and *recognizing* that **God** often **works His purposes**, even in the **midst of adversity**. (1:12-14) (Romans 8:28)
- → By *recognizing* that the *indwelling* <u>Presence</u> of Jesus, and our personal <u>relationship</u> with Him, is <u>central</u> to <u>our spiritual life</u> and walk with God.

Because you are sons,

God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into our hearts,
crying, "Abba! Father!" (Galatians 4:6)

→ By *recognizing* that until **God** calls **us** to "**depart**," *we too* are to **commit fully** to the **growth** and **well-being** of **fellow believers**.

Like **Paul,** we also are to **fully embrace** the **eternal <u>priorities</u>** of **sharing the <u>gospel</u>**, and **making <u>disciples</u>** of **men.** (1:12-18, 23-25) (Matthew 28: 18-20)
