<sup>12</sup> So then, my beloved, just as you have always <u>obeyed</u>, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, <u>work out</u> your salvation with *fear* and *trembling*;

<sup>13</sup> for it is **God** who is **at work** <u>in you</u>, both to **will** and to **work** for *His* **good pleasure**.

<sup>14</sup> Do all things without grumbling or disputing;
 <sup>15</sup> so that you will <u>prove</u> yourselves to be blameless and innocent,
 children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you appear as <u>lights</u> in the world,

<sup>16</sup> holding fast the word of life, so that in the day of Messiah I will have reason to glory because I did not *run* in vain nor *toil* in vain.

upon the **sacrifice** and **service** of **your faith**,

I **rejoice** and share **my joy** with you all.

<sup>18</sup> You too, I urge you, rejoice in the same way and share your joy with me.

D. He *Announces* the **sending** of <u>Timothy</u> and <u>Epaphroditus</u> to **them** (2:19-30)

<sup>19</sup> But **I hope** in the **Lord Jesus** to **send** <u>Timothy</u> to you shortly, so that **I also** may be *encouraged* when I learn of **your condition**.

<sup>20</sup> For I have **no one else** of **kindred spirit**who will **genuinely** be **concerned** for **your welfare**.

<sup>21</sup> For they **all seek** after their **own interests**, **not** those of **Messiah Jesus**.

<sup>22</sup> But you know of his *proven* worth, that he **served** with me in the **furtherance** of the **gospel** like a **child** *serving* **his father**.

<sup>23</sup> Therefore I hope to send him immediately, as soon as I see how things go with me;
<sup>24</sup> and I trust in the Lord that I myself also will be coming shortly.

<sup>25</sup> But I thought it necessary to send to you <u>Epaphroditus</u>, my brother and fellow worker and fellow soldier, who is also your messenger and <u>minister</u> to my need;

<sup>26</sup> because he was **longing** for **you all** and **was distressed** because **you** had heard that he was **sick**.

<sup>27</sup> For indeed he was sick to the point of death, but God had *mercy* on him, and not on him only but also on me, so that I would *not* have sorrow upon sorrow.

<sup>28</sup> Therefore I have sent him all the more eagerly so that when you see him again you may rejoice and I may be less concerned about you.

<sup>29</sup> Receive him then in the Lord with *all joy*, and hold **men** like **him** in <u>high regard</u>; <sup>30</sup> because he came **close to death** for the **work of Messiah**, **risking his life** to **complete** what was **deficient** in **your service to me.** 

#### Message Summary

- C. **Paul** *Affirms* the **Priority** of having a <u>Godly Testimony</u> to the **World** (2:12-18)
  - 1. *Exhorting* them to <u>work</u> to "complete" the salvation <u>work</u> that God is doing *within* them by <u>His power</u> (2:12-13)
  - 2. Exhorting them to maintain a godly testimony to the world (2:14-16)
    - a. A *testimony* that would **befit** the **children of God** (2:14-15a)
      - 1) doing all things without murmuring and arguments (2:14)
        - 2) being blameless and innocent (2:15a)
          - 3) above reproach in the midst of perversity (2:15b)

- b. A *testimony* that <u>shines</u> and **holds forth** the <u>word of life</u> (2:15c-16a)
- c. A *testimony* that would give **Paul** <u>reason</u> to **glory** (2:16b)
- 3. *Exhorting* them to <u>rejoice</u>, even if <u>he</u> is "offered up" for their faith and service (2:17-18)

#### D. Paul Announces the Sending of <u>Timothy</u> and <u>Epaphroditus</u> (2:19-30)

- 1. *Explaining* his <u>purposes</u> for sending <u>Timothy</u> (2:19-24)
  - a. *His* desire for personal encouragement (2:19)
  - b. *His* spiritual kinship with Timothy (2:20-21)
  - c. *His* confidence because of the "proven worth" of Timothy (2:22)
  - h. *His* hope to follow **Timothy** with his own **personal visit** (2:23-24)
- 2. *Expressing* his reasons for returning Epaphroditus to them (2:25-30)
  - a. Epaphroditus' impressive service (2:25)
  - b. **Epaphroditus' severe sickness** and subsequent <u>distress</u> (2:26-27)
  - c. Paul's concern for the Philippians (2:28)
  - d. **Paul's urging** that **Epaphroditus** be <u>received</u> with *joy* and <u>honor</u> (2:29-30)

# Personal Application Timothy and Epaphroditus→ Rabbi Paul's Faithful Servants

{Observations/Principles}

- 1. Rabbi Paul declared that he would be sending Timothy to visit the Philippians. He would send Timothy because he was a "kindred spirit," and like Paul, he also would genuinely care for the well-being of the Philippians. (2:19-20) Principle → In choosing people to lead and serve the people of God, it is a priority to send out those who have a genuine concern for the "sheep."
- 2. According to **Rabbi Paul**, he **chose <u>Timothy</u>** because he knew that **he** would **not** be **seeking** after **his** *own* **interests**, but only **those** of <u>Messiah Jesus</u>. (2:21)
  - <u>Principle</u> → Those who are committed to serving the Lord must <u>not</u> do so for *selfish* interests, but should serve the <u>interests</u> and <u>purposes</u> of the Messiah.

- 3. Paul declared that Timothy had "proven worth," and had a <u>testimony</u> of dedicated <u>service</u> in the ministry of the gospel. (2:22)
  - <u>Principle</u> → When a ministry calls and man or woman to accomplish an important work of service or leadership function, it should be someone who has a *proven* "track record" of <u>faithful service</u> in the cause of the gospel.
- 4. Tonight we read that **Paul** deemed it *necessary* to **send back Epaphroditus**, who was **sent to Paul** earlier as a **messenger** and **minister** to **his needs**. (2:25)

Paul described Epaphroditus as "my brother and fellow worker and fellow soldier." He had high regard for Epaphroditus, who became a dear <u>brother</u> and <u>dedicated servant</u>, who greatly supported Paul in his imprisonment. (2:25)

<u>Principle</u> → The most important *resource* in the work of the ministry are the <u>people</u> who <u>serve</u> faithfully and sacrificially. A ministry is rarely a "one man show." It is comprised of individual dedicated believers that work as a <u>team</u> in a co-laborship with God to accomplish His purposes (2:13). In a different letter, Paul wrote that it was "work of service" of *each* believer that caused the *growth* of the ministry (Ephesians 4:11-12, 15-16).

5. While **serving** the needs of **Paul**, **Epaphroditus** became **sick**, almost to the point of **death**. **Paul** was very concerned about his brother, and was **grateful to God** for His **mercy** when **Epaphroditus** eventually **recovered**. Had **Epaphroditus** died, **Paul** shared that he would have experienced, "**sorrow upon sorrow**." (2:27)

<u>Principle</u> → Frankly, I'm not sure there is a principle here, other than simply realizing that **we all <u>need</u>** to have **brothers** and **sisters** who <u>support</u> and <u>encourage</u> us, and with whom we can *trust* personally.

"A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity." (Prov. 17:17)

6. Finally, we read tonight how that **Paul** exhorted the **Philippians** to <u>receive</u> **Epaphroditus** with all *joy*, and to "hold men like him in <u>high regard</u> (2:29)." **Paul's reason** for this **high praise** was because **Epaphroditus** came "close to **death**" for the **work of Messiah**, and **risked his life** to accomplish the **mission** that they (the **Philippians**) had **sent him** to do on **their behalf**. (2:30)

<u>Principle</u> → We should <u>honor</u> faithful servants, and hold them in <u>high regard</u> for their sacrifice and service for the ministry of the gospel. The true servant of **God** will remain *humble* even while being lauded, for he or she **knows** that it is

"God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure (2:13)."
