**{Part 1}** 

- 1. Giving *Final* Exhortations regarding their **Personal** Conduct (4:1-9)
  - **4** Therefore, my **beloved brethren** whom I long *to see*, my *joy* and *crown*, in this way <u>stand firm</u> in the Lord, my beloved.
- <sup>2</sup> I urge **Euodia** and I urge **Syntyche** to live in <u>harmony</u> in the Lord.
  - <sup>3</sup> Indeed, *true companion*, I ask you also to help these women who have shared my struggle in *the cause of* the gospel,
  - together with **Clement** also and the rest of my **fellow workers**, whose **names** are in the **book of life**.
    - <sup>4</sup> Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!
  - <sup>5</sup> Let your **gentle spirit** be known to **all men**. The **Lord is near**.

<sup>6</sup>Be anxious for <u>nothing</u>,

but in everything by <u>prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u> with **thanksgiving** let your **requests** be made **known to God**.

- <sup>7</sup> And the <u>peace of God</u>, which *surpasses* all **comprehension**, will *guard* your **hearts** and your **minds** *in* **Messiah Jesus**.
- <sup>8</sup> Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute,

if there is any **excellence** and if anything **worthy of praise**, **dwell** on **these things**.

<sup>9</sup>The **things** you have **learned** and **received** and **heard** and **seen in me**, **practice** these **things**, and the **God of peace** will be **with you**.

## Message Summary Paul's Final Exhortations to the Philippians

- 1. He exhorts them to "stand firm" in the Lord (4:1).
- 2. **He exhorts** them once again to <u>unity</u>," specifically citing the need for two special servants, **Euodia** and **Syntyche**, to "live in <u>harmony</u>" in the Lord (4:2-4).
- 3. **He exhorts** them to **rejoice**, and then "**doubles down**" on that exhortation (4:4).
- 4. **He** *encourages* them to have a **testimony** of "**gentleness**" towards all **men** (4:5).
- 5. **He** *exhorts* them to **commit** all their *anxiety* **to God** in <u>prayer</u>, that they may **receive** His "**incomprehensible**" **inner peace** (4:6-7).
- 6. **He exhorts** them to "<u>dwell on</u>" and <u>embrace</u> the **things** that pertain to **godliness** and **goodness** (4:8).

Whatever is **True**,
Whatever is **Honorable**,
Whatever is **Right**,
Whatever is **Pure**,
Whatever is **Lovely**,
Whatever is of **Good Repute**,
Whatever is of any **Excellence**,
Whatever is **Praiseworthy**,

7. He *exhorts* the Philippians to <u>follow</u> *his* personal <u>example</u>, and promises them the presence of the "God of peace" (4:9).

# Personal Application Experiencing Peace in Anxious Times {Trusting God in Prayer}

Be <u>anxious</u> for nothing, but in <u>everything</u> by <u>prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u> with <u>thanksgiving</u> let your <u>requests</u> be made <u>known to God</u>.

And the <u>peace of God</u>, which <u>surpasses all comprehension</u>, will <u>guard</u> your <u>hearts</u> and your <u>minds</u> in Messiah Jesus. (4:6-7)

You will keep *him* in perfect <u>peace.</u>
Whose mind is stayed on You,

Because he trusts in You. (Isaiah 26:3)

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In peace I will both lie down and sleep,

For You alone, O LORD, make me to dwell in safety. (Psalm 4:8)

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Therefore, let everyone who is **godly pray to You** in a time when **You** may be **found**;
Surely in a **flood** of great waters they will **not reach him**.

You are my *hiding place*; You *preserve me* from trouble; You *surround me* with songs of deliverance. (Psalm 32:6-7)

The righteous <u>cry</u>, and the <u>LORD hears</u>
And <u>delivers them</u> out of <u>all their troubles</u>.

The **LORD** is *near* to the **brokenhearted**And **saves** those who are **crushed in spirit**.

Many are the afflictions of the righteous,
But the LORD <u>delivers him</u> out of them all. (Psalm 34:17-19)

Rest in the LORD and wait patiently for Him;
Do not fret because of him who prospers in his way,
Because of the man who carries out wicked schemes.

Cease from anger and forsake wrath; Do not *fret*; *it leads* only to evildoing. (Psalm 37:7-8)

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Be **gracious** to me, **O Lord**,
For to **You <u>I cry</u>** all day long.

Make glad the soul of Your servant, For to You, O Lord, I lift up my soul.

For **You, Lord**, are **good**, and **ready to forgive**,
And abundant in **lovingkindness** to **all** who **call upon You**. (Psalm 86:3-5)

Therefore **humble yourselves** under the **mighty hand of God,** that **He** may **exalt you** at the proper time, **casting all** your **anxiety on Him**, because **He cares for you.** (I Peter 5:6-7)

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But the **Helper**, the **Holy Spirit**, whom the **Father** will **send in My name**, **He** will **teach you** all things, and bring to your **remembrance** all that **I said to you**.

Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you;not as the world gives do I give to you.Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful...

These things I have spoken to you, so that *in Me* you may have <u>peace</u>.

In the world you have *tribulation*, but take courage; I have overcome the world." (John 14:26-27, 16:33)
