# 2. Giving *Final* Words of <u>Appreciation</u> and <u>Greetings</u> (4:10-23)

<sup>10</sup> But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly, that now at last you have *revived* your concern for me; indeed, you were concerned *before*, but you lacked opportunity.

<sup>11</sup> **Not** that I speak from **want**, for I have <u>learned</u> to be <u>content</u> in whatever <u>circumstances</u> I am.

<sup>12</sup> I know how to get along with *humble* means, and I also know how to live in *prosperity;* in any and every circumstance I have learned the <u>secret</u> of being *filled* and *going hungry*, both of having *abundance* and *suffering need*.

<sup>13</sup>I can **do <u>all</u> things through <u>Him</u>** who **strengthens me.** 

<sup>14</sup> Nevertheless, you have **done well** to **share** *with me* in **my affliction**.

<sup>15</sup> You yourselves also know, **Philippians**, that at the **first preaching** of the **gospel**, after I left Macedonia,

## no church shared with me in the matter of *giving* and *receiving* but <u>you alone</u>; 16 for even in **Thessalonica** you sent *a gift* more than once for my needs.

<sup>17</sup> Not that I seek the **gift itself**, but I seek for the **profit** which **increases to your account**.

<sup>18</sup> But I have received everything in full and have an abundance; I am amply supplied,

having received from **Epaphroditus** what <u>you</u> have sent, a fragrant aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well-pleasing to God.

<sup>19</sup> And **my God** will <u>supply</u> all your needs according to **His <u>riches</u>** in **glory** *in* **Messiah Jesus.** 

<sup>20</sup> Now to **our God and Father** *be* the **glory forever and ever**. Amen.

<sup>21</sup> <u>Greet</u> every saint in **Messiah Jesus**. The **brethren** who are **with me greet you**.

<sup>22</sup> All the saints greet you, especially those of Caesar's household.

<sup>23</sup> The grace of the Lord Jesus the Messiah be with your spirit.

# Personal Application Learning the "Secret" of Contentment

"I can do all things through Him who strengthens me (4:13)."

But **godliness** actually is a means of **great gain** when accompanied by **contentment**.

For we have brought **nothing** into the world, so we cannot take anything out of it either.

If we have **food** and **covering**, with these we shall be **content**. (I Timothy 6:6-8) Make sure that your **character** is free from the **love** of money, being content with what you have; for He Himself has said, "I WILL NEVER DESERT YOU, NOR WILL I EVER FORSAKE YOU," Keep deception and lies far from me, Give me **neither poverty** nor **riches**; **Feed me** with the **food** that is **my portion**, That I not be full and deny You and say, "Who is the LORD?" Or that I not be in want and steal, And **profane** the **name of my God**. (Proverbs 30:8-9) \_\_\_\_\_ I know that there is **nothing better** for **them (man)** than to *rejoice* and to *do good* in one's lifetime; moreover, that every man who eats and drinks sees good in all his labor—it is the gift of God. (Ecclesiastes 3:11-12) Then **He** (Jesus) said to them, "Beware, and be on your guard against every form of greed; for not even when one has an abundance does his <u>life</u> consist of his possessions." (Luke 12:15)
